This is the first game of the season and follows two scrimmages. One of the scrimmages will be against Rotan there and the other will be against Cisco here on August 26.



Immunization requirements are series of three diphtheris-whooping cough tetanus shots with one shot or a booster after age four; and the measles vaccine (or a history of measles illness) and the rubellla vaccine. A measles vaccine may be needed if the child recieved the measles vaccine before their first birthday.


Mr. and Mrs. Don Mc-Call celebrated their golden wedding anniversary Sunday with a reception at the Garden Center in Cross Plains, Texas.


