School Days Draw Near Enrollment Slated

With the first day of school approaching the town it won't be long before the lonely sight of the Baird Schools comes back to life again.

The school has been busier than in the past due to the enrolling of the school age population.

There are only three days left for the students to be enrolled in the Baird Public Schools.

The High School collected and enrollment of 143 students and the Grade School has 303 students enrolled. The school anticipates a total enrollment of 500 students.

Callahan County Set For Wildcats

Trans-Texas Energy Inc. of Dallas will drill No. 4-A North Hatchett as a proposed 4,400 foot wildcat in Callahan County.

Location is five miles southeast of Baird on an 800 acre lease.

It spots 467 feet from the north and 3,800 feet from the east lines of section 30 D&DAL Survey.

Dunnam Oil Company of Abilene completed two gas wells, both producing from the Duffer, in the regular field 8 miles north of Cross Plains.

No. 1 B.F. Hutchins is located 560 feet from the south and 660 feet from the east lines of John Barton Survey 6.

Absolute, open flow was 5,250,000 cubic feet of gas daily. It had a gas-liquid hydrocarbon ratio of 110,909-1 of 44 gravity.

Production is from perforations at 3,802-14 ft. treated with 2,500 gallons of acid and fractured with 200 sacks of sand.

Operator set the 4.5 inch casing at 3,828 feet, and the hole is bottomed at 3,857 feet.

Other well is No. 2 Benjamin P. Pillans, spotting 990 feet from the north and 330 feet from the west lines of Lot 6, Lavaca CSL Survey 6.

It had an absolute, open flow of 1,500,000 cubic feet of gas daily. Gas-liquid, hydrocarbon ratio was 120,000-1 of 44 gravity.

The well is producing from perforations at 3,788-96 feet, treated with 2,500 gallons of acid and fractured with 200 sacks of sand.

Operator set the 4.5 inch casing at 3,860 feet, total depth.

Hayburst Brothers of Abilene completed No.2 Walraven in the regular field three miles south of Eula.

Site is 550 feet from the

south and 2,490 feet from the east lines of Wection 28, BBB&C Survey.

Daily potential was 9 barrels of 40 gravity oil. This was pumping from perforations at 1,419-23 feet. The pay was treated with 250 gallons of acid and fractured with 10 sacks of sand.

Operator set the 4.5 inch casing at 1,481 feet, and the hole is bottomed at 1,484 feet.

Kindergarten students in the Baird Public Schools must have a record of imm-

must have a record of immunizations and a copy of their birthcertificates before they enroll this month.

Immunization requirements are series of three diphtheris-whooping cough tetanus shots with one shot or a booster after age four; and the measles vaccine (or a history of measles illness) and the rubella vaccine. A measles vaccine may be needed if the child recieved the measles vaccine before their first birthday.

The birthcertificate must be from the Bureau of Vital Statistics. Hospital certificates will NOT be accepted.

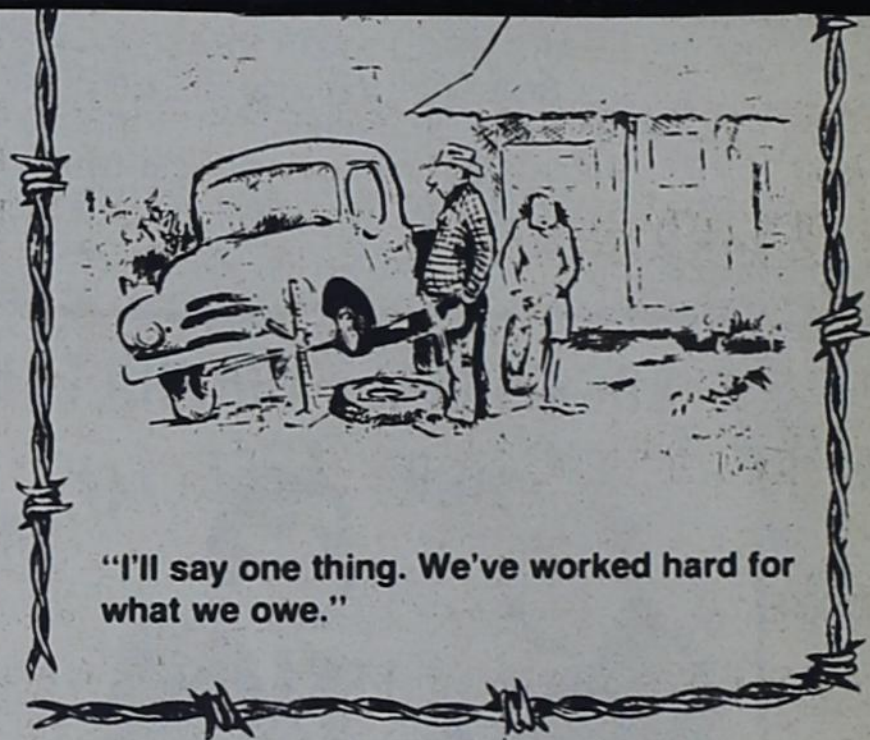
Sergeant Bentley, a computer programming specialist with a unit of the Air Force Systems Command, previously served at Bestrom AFB, Texas.

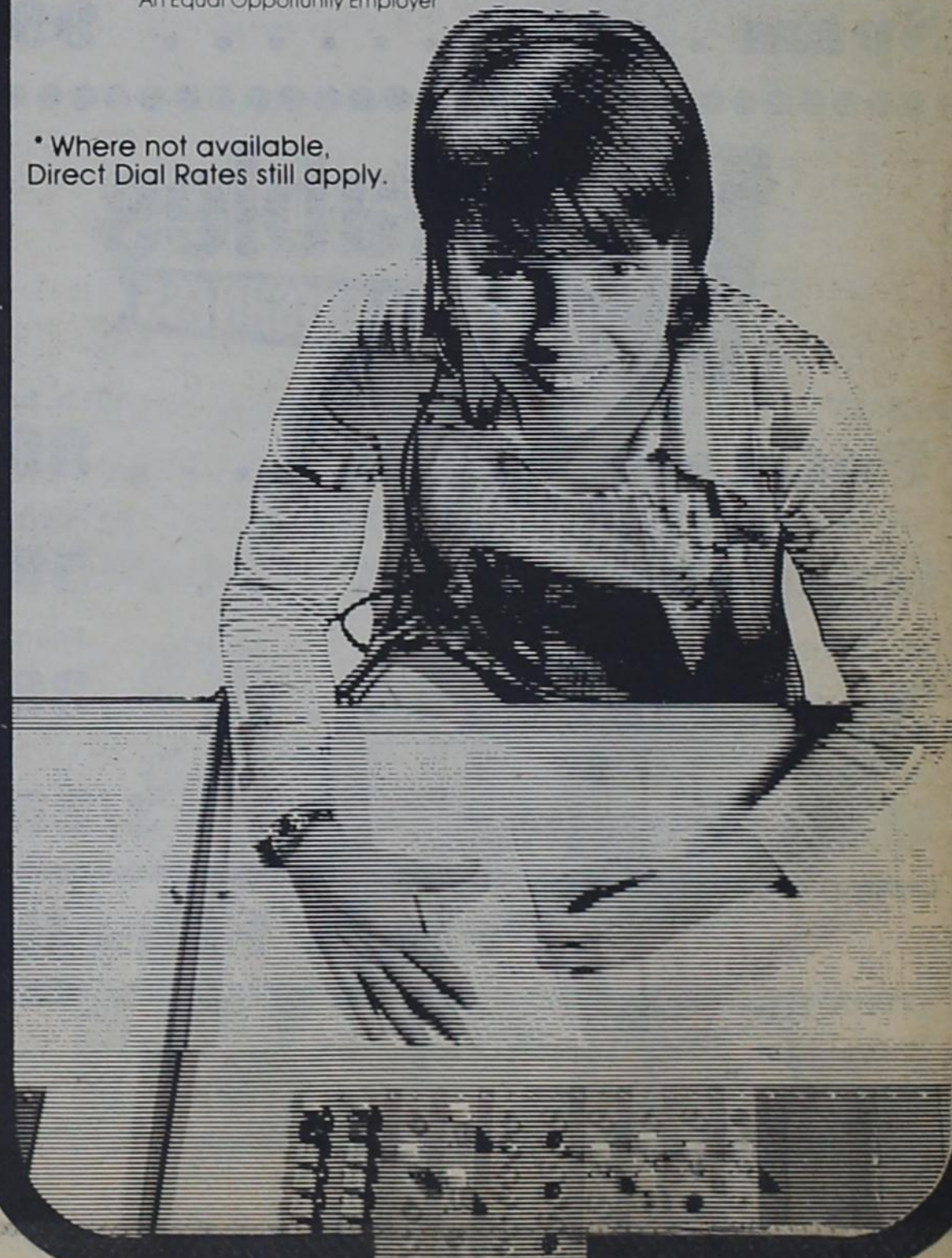

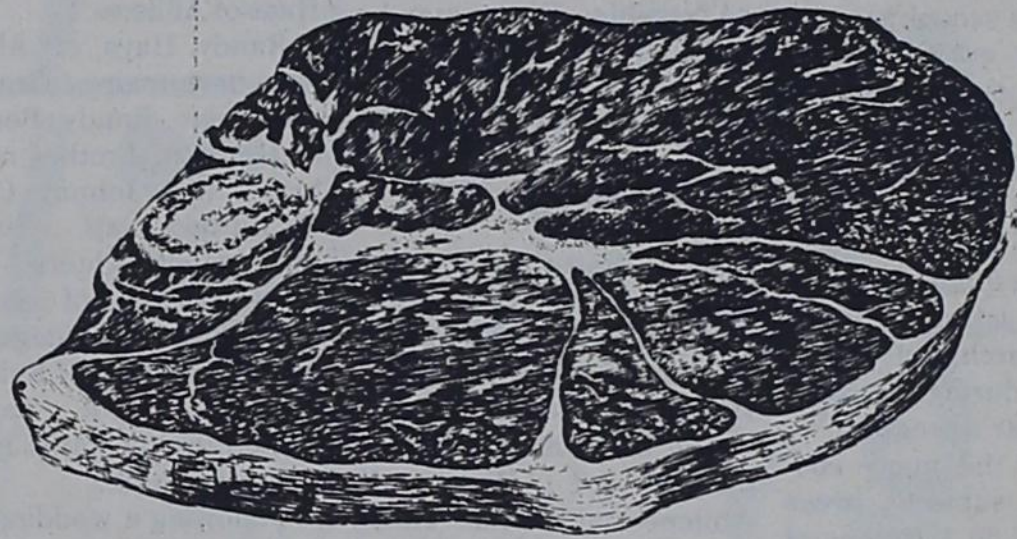

New Cosmetology Bennett - Casey Class Begins at CJC Exchange Vows

A new cosmetology class will begin in early September at the Cisco Junior College Beauty School, Instructor Alta Dixon has announced. The school is currently accepting applications for places in the class.

The class beginning next month will be a one-year program for licensed beauty operators, and in it students will be given the necessary preparation for taking the state exam upon completion, Ms. Dixon said.

The Cisco school accepts either men or women as students, and a high school diploma is not necessary for enrollment in the beauty program. The cost is \$150 tuition plus about \$75 worth of equipment and books, the latter of which may be purchased in installments during the course of the year's program.

Some of the many cosmetology subject areas are covered in the general course area: shampoo, hair and scalp treatment, cold waving, chemical waving, chemical hair relaxing, hair coloring, wigs and hairpieces, manicuring, facials, hair styling, and hair cutting.

Students go to Austin to take the state exam after passing the course at CJC satisfactorily; and after successful results with the state exam, they become licensed by the state of Texas as beauty operators.

The CJC Beauty School is very well furnished with the modern cosmetology equipment, and is housed in the Cisco college's newest building, the Technical-Vocational Building

Number Two.

"Being a beauty operator is an exciting and challenging vocation with the excellent earnings possibilities," Ms. Dixon said, "and we invite anyone interested in finding out more about our program to come and visit us at any time."

Ms. Dixon stated, in conclusion, that persons interested in beginning the cosmetology program with the September class should contact either her or the Vocational-Technical Dean Gerald Bint as soon as possible. Either may be reached at 817-442-2567.

Don McCalls Celebrate Golden

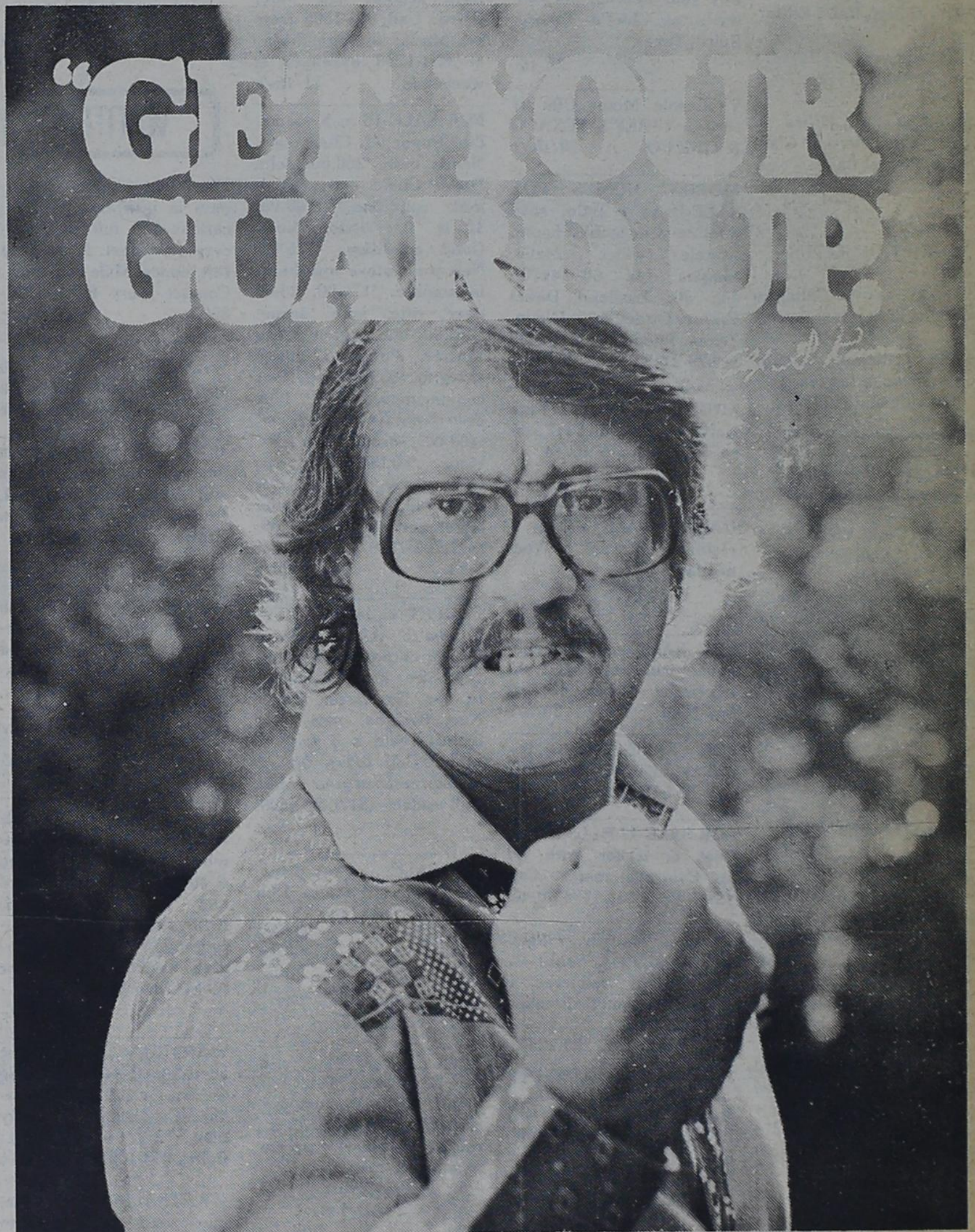
Mr. and Mrs. Don McCall celebrated their golden wedding anniversary Sunday with a reception at the Garden Center in Cross Plains, Texas.
