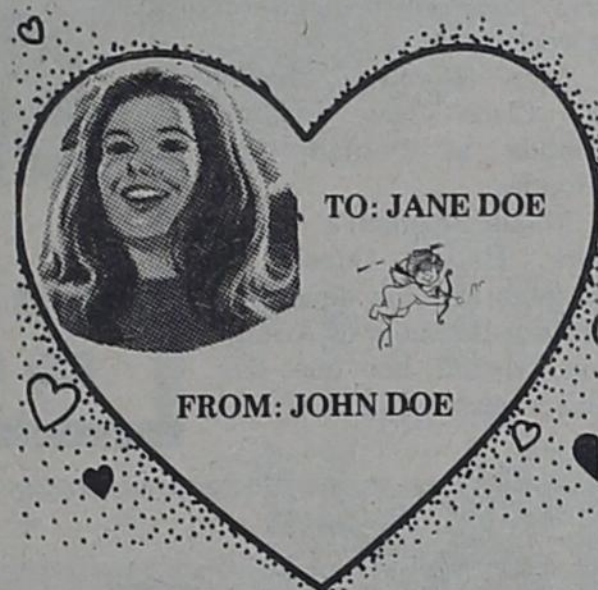

The Baird City council met in regular session Monday, Jan. 25, 1982 at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Brame presiding. All members were present except two.

AGENDA

1. Act on County proposal for landfill operations. Motion was made to follow through with the proposal and passed.
2. Bid opening on mobile home at landfill. Bids opened by Mayor Brame were as follows: Jack Bowen-\$275; L.D. Walker-\$850. Motion was made and passed to accept the bid of L.D. Walker.
3. Consider purchases of portable building for landfill. A bid of \$580. for a 8x12 building was accepted.
4. Consider action on theft of water.

Motion was made and passed to pay the bill, estimate to be paid in full if the meter hasn't been tampered with.

5. Discuss power plant building lease.
6. Set holidays for 1982. Motion was made to accept the following holidays:

 - Sept. 6-Labor Day
 - Nov. 11-Veterans Day

- There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

Shady Oaks Elects Board Members

The Shady Oaks Recreation Association held their regular monthly meeting.

Highlighting the meeting was the election of three new board members. Members whose terms expired were Franke Crow, Charles Walker and Tex Cloud. Nominated for the spots were Vic Cogburn, Franke Crow and Ed Dunn. One nomination came from the floor for Jigs Shackelford, and Ed Dunn as the new members. The account balances as of December 31, 1981 was: \$3,590.22 in checking; \$6,720.60 in savings; \$4,500 in Certificates of deposit; \$144.21 in the liquor pool and \$25.00 in petty cash.

Two Races Develop In County No Filings In City, School

Charles Walker, Dem. Chairman for Callahan County, reported that as of today, 13 persons has filed in the upcoming election.

Filing for Justice of the Peace Precinct #1, Baird, is Bobby Curtis. On of two races has incumbent Lee Savell and Jess Henley running for Justice of the Peace Precinct #5 in Clyde. Running for Justice of the Peace Precinct #6, Cross Plains, is L.P. Mitchell. The only other contested race has incumbent Ida Mae Waddle and I.G. Mobley both running for Justice of the Peace Precinct #8 in Putnam.

Two current County Commissioners have filed for re-election. They are Lowell Johnson, place #2, and E.F. Odom, place #4.

Cubelle Harris has filed for District Clerk of Callahan County. Incumbent Cora Mae Payne has stated she will not seek re-election in favor of retirement.

The following persons have filed for re-election and are yet uncontested. They are: Darlene Walker, County Clerk Dora Hounshell, County Treasurer; Robert McCool, County Attorney and Mack Kniffen, County Judge.

Deadline for filing in this election is 6:00 p.m. Monday, Feb. 1, 1982. The election will be held Saturday, May 1, 1982.

BAIRD CITY OFFICIALS

When the city election takes place in April, there will be two seats open in the city council, plus the mayor's post.

Board members whose terms are expiring are Debra Helton and Lee Roy Brooker. Mayor H.L. "Buddy" Brame's term is also up.

As of Tuesday morning no one has filed for any of the positions. Deadline for filing is March 3, 1982.

Accidents Keep DPS Officers Hopping During The Week

Two accidents last week kept the Department of Public Safety busy.

The first accident, which occurred at 9:20 Wednesday morning, involved a West Texas Utilities truck driven by Patrick Buscher and a 1981 Ford Fairmont driven by Bobby Bryant.

The accident occurred at the I-20 and Union Hill Road intersection.

Bryant received facial cuts while Buscher was believed to have suffered a cracked vertebrae. Also injured was Doug Shaw, a passenger in the West Texas Utilities truck. He was believed to have suffered chest injuries.

The second accident, which occurred

on I-20 near Putnam, involved two 18-wheel trucks.

According to Department of Public Safety officer, Bill Russell, the wind caught an ICX truck and caused it to jack-knife, blocking both lanes of the highway. It was then hit by a truck owned by Haskins Truck Lines. No major injuries were reported.

The highway was closed for about three hours while crews worked to remove the trucks. The Baird Fire Department was called out to wash down the approximate 400 to 500 gallons of diesel fuel which was spilled on the highway.



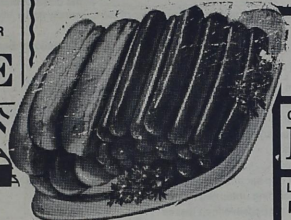
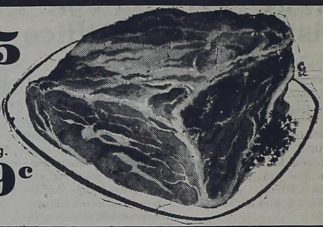

Deadline For Paying Taxes Is January 31

An important deadline occurs this month for property owners in Texas.

Kenneth Graeber, executive director of the State Property Tax Board, today reminded Texans that local property taxes assessed for 1981 by cities, counties, school districts, and special districts must be paid by the end of January.

"Taxes not paid before Feb. 1 are delinquent and penalty and interest begin to accrue," Graeber said.

The state tax administrator noted that delinquent 1981 taxes will incur

a 6% penalty and 1% interest charge on Feb. 1.

Combined penalty and interest charges will total 9% in March, 11% in April, 13% in May, and 15% in June.

Total penalty and interest on delinquent taxes reaches 18% in July, 19% in August, 20% in Sept., 21% in Oct., 22% in Nov., and 23% in December.

If not paid until January 1982, delinquent 1981 property taxes would be subject to a combined 24% penalty and interest charge. And, Graeber noted, the interest would continue

to increase by 1% per month.

In addition, if a taxing jurisdiction or appraisal district has contracted with a delinquent tax attorney, its governing body may add an additional penalty to any tax delinquent on July 1.

The additional penalty may not exceed 15% of the taxes, penalty and interest due.

Graeber pointed out that some home rule cities may have different delinquency dates for 1981 taxes. "The Property Tax Code does not affect a

city's delinquency date for its 1981 taxes if the city charter or ordinance provides an earlier delinquency date," he said.

He also noted that if a taxing jurisdiction mailed its 1981 tax bills after January 10, the delinquency date is postponed to the first day of the next month that will provide a period of at least 21 days after the date of mailing for payment of taxes before delinquent.

Taxpayers with questions are encouraged to contact local government tax offices.

Taxpayers To Receive Homestead Exemptions

Albert Lovell, Chief appraiser for the Central appraisal office of Callahan County announced today that the Homestead exemptions were placed in the mail for all who applied for Homestead in 1981. These forms will need to be signed by the person who applies for the Homestead exemption in 1982 and returned to the office. For those who are over 65 this will be of benefit for their school tax which will allow an extra

\$10,000. value from the tax. The law requires in 1982 that all property will have to be appraised at Market Value.

It will be necessary for each person who is over 65 to fill in their date of birth. Those who are over 65 years of age and live in the City of Baird will benefit from this also.

Mr. Lovell stated that he hoped that each person would complete their forms and return as soon as possible.

Also, there has been

some delay in receiving the forms for Agriculture exemption, but they will

be mailed at a later date. A limited supply of forms are available at the apprai-

sal office in the Court House and if a person is in the Court House & would come by, they can apply for the exemption now.

It is hoped that each tax payer who is entitled to any form of exemption would apply prior to April 30, 1982 the last day of rendition period.
