



An important deadline occurs this month for property owners in Texas.

Kenneth Graeber, executive director of the State Property Tax Board, today reminded Texans that local property taxes assessed for 1981 by cities, counties, school districts, and special districts must be paid by the end of January.

"Taxes not paid before Feb. 1 are delinquent and penalty and interest begin to accure," Graeber said.

trator noted that delinquent 1981 taxes will incur a 6% penalty and 1% interest charge on Feb. 1.

Combined penalty and interest charges will total 9% in March, 11% in April, 13% in May, and 15% in June.

Total penalty and interest on delinquent taxes reaches 18% in July, 19% in August, 20% in Sept., 21% in Oct., 22% in Nov., and 23% in December.

If not paid until January 1983, delinquent 1981 property taxes would be subject to a combined 24% The state tax adminis- penalty and interest charge. And, Graeber noted, the interest would continue

to increase by 1% per month.

In addition, if a taxing jurisdiction or appraisal district has contracted with a delinquent tax attorney, its governing body may add an additional penalty to any tax delinquent on July 1.

The additional penalty may not exceed 15% of the taxes, penalty and interest due.

Graeber pointed out that some home rule cities may have different delinquency dates for 1981 taxes. "The Property Tax Code does not affect a

city's delinquency date for its 1981 taxes if the city charter or ordinance provides an earlier delinquency date," he said.

He also noted that if a taxing jurisdiction mailed its 1981 tax bills after January 10, the delinquency date is postponed to the first day of the next month that will provide a period of at least 21 days after the date of mailing for payment of taxes before delinquent.

Taxpayers with questions are encouraged to contact local government tax offices.

Baird Teams Win Honors In **Problem Solving**

The most basic skill that can be taught in today's schools is problem solving. Skills in solving future problems is especially important and is the key to teaching such basics as reading, writing and arithmetic. Since 1977-78 the Future Problem Solving Program has been a national program, an interscholastic competition and curriculum project in creative problem solving and future studies. In Texas several hundred teams compete on three practical problems, with outstanding teams being selected to compete in the Texas Future Problem Bowl in the State Capitol on April 23 and 24. Two teams from Baird High School received high ratings on their entry to Practice Problem number II.
