Structure Deficient, Engineers Recommend New School For Eula

Strucutral engineers, contracted by the Board of Trustees of Eula School District reported that the existing building is on unstable soil and the building is deficient.

Texas Education Agency and the structural engineer believe a new building is necessary instead of renovating the existing school.

Roadwork

The Accreditation Department and TEA's Facilities Department recommend in letters to the school board advised that renovating the building would be unwise and new construction was the best choice for the district.

Hendrick Terminates Hospital Lease, Negotiations For New Agreement Not Good

A handful of hospital employees and interested people set in on a meeting Monday between County Commissioners and members of the Rural Hospital Management, Inc., where it was decided that the lease RHMI held on the Callahan County Hospital would be terminated.

Subsidies from the county was discussed as an alternative to closing the hospital. Judge Mack Kniffen said county voters would have to decide whether to spend approxamately \$10,000 a month to operate the hospital.

Judge Kniffen ask the members of RHMI if they leased the hospital in order to close it. Their response was, "no." "Did you do your homework before leasing the hospital, and were you aware of the amount of medicare patients assisted by the hospital?" Kniffen ask. The response was, "We were not aware of the amount of medicare patients here."

Action has been taken by the commis-

sioners to renegotiate the terms of the lease with RHMI, with subsidies from the county for the hospitals operations.

Major medicare deficiences include; Radiology room, portable x-ray unit, radiology equipment, tile in room and hallways, beds and furniture, and automatic sprinkler system. In addition to these, corridors are being used as a return air plenums, only one set of emergency equipment whereas two complete sets are required, and the utilization of a free standing mobile type building for closed medical records is not acceptable.

A Letter of Intent to Terminate Lease Agreement was received at Judge Kniffins office Tuesday. The ninety day notice will cessation of operation of the hospital by RHMI on September 15, 1982.

Kudge Kniffen says he hates to see the hospital closed, but it doesn't look good at this time.





Strake Speaks Out Against Judicial Process On Drug

Speaking to a group of local supporters at Clyde, former Texas Secretary of State George Strake, candidate for Lt. Governor pointed out the difference between his ideas on how to fight crime and the record of his opponent, incumbent, Lt. Governor Bill Hobby.

"The difference between us is a clear example of a basic philosophical difference," said Strake.

"I believe that the primary purpose of our criminal laws, law enforcement, trial and punishment is to protect citizens from those who now laugh at the judicial process.

"Those now engaging in criminal activity do so with the sure knowledge that the present legal framework too often guards the wrongdoer instead of protecting law-abiding people.


"As Lt. Governor, I will appoint Sen-

ate Committees which will work to strengthenour laws to curb the crime rate," the 47-year-old Strake added.

Strake contrasted his approach to the crime menace with Bill Hobby's record of support for an organization which aids criminals more than victims of criminals.

"Bill Hobby takes pride in the fact he held a fundraiser for the ACLU (American Civil Liberties Union), in his home a year and a half ago. He helped them raise \$60,000----\$60,000 that will be used to defend those who prey on society. This does not represent the view of most Texans.

"I believe that those who commit crimes are entitled to a fair trial, but as the Supreme Court of the United States has itself noted, 'a fair trial is not the same as a perfect trial." Strake said.
