

Mr. Brackett says... did you know that... there's no record of the City Council approving payment of the City's bills in open meetings... at least since the beginning of 2011. Approval of bills combined with review of the current budget and financials is the mechanism of oversight which is their responsibility. Such a review/approval process insures compliance with the budget and prevents over-spending by staff. Open and Transparent government stops suspicions and questions.
