The following communication from Editor Times:-

While not an advocate of assessing property at its full cash value for this or any other year, still it is very evident that we must raise our valuations some this year. My opinion is that nearly every county in the State will raise values above what they were last year. Parker, Fannin, Williamson, Travis, Bexar, Clay, Archer, in fact, so far as I know, all counties are doing this. Denton will double valuations and reduce the county tax

levy from 60 cents to 30 cents. I am now going over the assessments and raising all lands 20 per cent and some on the Red river 30 per cent. All other property I think necessary to equalize taxes, I am raising in the same proportion.

I shall ask the commissioners court to ratify this raise. They can then reduce the county rate ard the people will pay but little if any more taxes than we do now and if all raise we may pay less. 
