Bovina ISD's Board of Trustees met in regular session Monday, September 9, at the school administration building.

All members were present except Isabel Carrasco. Staff present were Charles Carter, Darla Sealey, Mitzi Johnson, and Michael Downes. There were no visitors present.

A public hearing was held at 7:22 p.m. on the 2002-03 tax rate. Board action items included a motion approved to set the 2002-03 tax rate at \$1.14.

The Board issued a resolution was approved to resolution in support of legislative action to guarantee adequacy and equity in school finance. Section I of the 2002, BISD authorized resolution reads as follows:


Now we are in a war against terrorism without a clear-cut enemy. Bin Laden is only one small fish in a teeming sea of dedicated Islamic fundamentalists, extoling faith, mindless obedience, primitivism, sacrifice to state and God, theocracy. They are against everything we stand for: reason, individualism, pursuit of happiness, secularism, capitalsim. Their plan is basically to force their religious dogma on nonbelievers---us---by spreading their doctrine, not via appeals and rational arguments, but by violence, guns and suicide bombers. I don't know what our leaders have in mind when it comes to destroying this unpredictable enemy, but I hope the Islamic fundamentalist nations of Iraq, Iran, Saudi Arabia and Pakistan are at the top of the hit list. Bipartisan bickering and blathering over the miniscule details of homeland security are certainly not going to win a war against anything. America has the courageous military and the weapons to take on this enemy and defeat them. We've just gotta find them first and then have the will to practice self-interest and safeguard American lives. . and not be squeamish about stepping on anyone's toes in the name of right and reason. Okay media, news magazines, networks, talking heads ... keep running those stories and memorials about nine-one-one. Some of the more cynical folks among us may get tired of hearing about it. But I don't want anyone to ever forget. It must never be "out of sight, out of mind." I want Americans to stay mad as Hell about this, until every last terrorist is wiped off the earth. . . in memory of those three thousand vibrant intellegent young folks who died last year in New York City. They'll never have the opportunity to become a part of the "over the hill" generation.

Tonight (Friday, September 13), the Mustangs host Trinity Fellowship at Mustang Field at 7:30 p.m.






WARNING: This column will probably be boring to most people since only three of you showed up at Monday night's council meeting to talk about city water supplies. water and sewer rates.

If you live in the City of Friona, your monthly sewer charge doubled Monday night. From \$8.50 to \$17.

The good news is the Friona city council adopted the flat rate sewer charge instead of the proposed sewer charge plus a surcharge for every 1,000 gallons of water used.

Are you getting this so far or do you care? Don't worry, it'll all soak in (pardon the pun) when you get your next water bill.

See, one proposal was to charge you \$12 a month for sewer, plus fifty cents or so for every thousand gallons of city put notices in the water you used.

much of the water you use goes into the sewer system which goes through sewer pipes to the waste treatment plant.

The pipes and the plant are old and wearing out. The city borrowed \$3 million to fix them and the incresase in sewer rates is necessary to pay back the \$3 million.

It is not that the city council didn't have anything else to do and decided to

raise some rates. The Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission (TNRCC) requires certain standards for

They've told Friona to fix it or be fined. Friona needs new waste water lagoons, new pumping equipment and sooner or later new pipelines to carry it. Some of the pipes in use today have been in the ground for 50 years. And nothing gets the TNRCC's goat like leaky pipes. Runs 'em nuts.

(By the way, the TNRCC is no longer called the TNRCC. They are now called the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality. Anyone around here that has a feedyard, cement plant, dairy or packing plant knows the TCEQ very well.)

So back to the sewer. The newspaper about the rate The reasoning was that increases and the need for improved water and sewer services. They announced a public hearing for last Monday night for anyone who wanted to talk about it.

Three people showed up. Mr. and Mrs. Billy Joe Mercer and Joe Reeve. Billy Joe had gone to the trouble of taking some of his previous water bills and projecting how much he would be paying under the proposed new system.

most of the water he and Mrs. Mercer use is for watering their yard, which does not go into the sewer system. One yard watering, he said, could be as much as 4,000 gallons.

He said they were proud of their yard, unlike some other citizens who are content to have old vehicles and weeds in their yards. People with pretty yards and ugly yards all use the sewer,

Mr. Mercer said it was not fair to base the residential sewer rates on water usage. That would be unfair to people who water their yards and keep them pretty. Joe Reeve told the council

that his concern was that when the increase is put in, it will never be reduced once the sewer improvements are completed. He seemed to be of the opinion that when a government raises fees and taxes they never lower them.

He also said that raising sewer rates tied to water usage would cause people to "buy less water", keep their yards as pretty and bring in less revenue for the city in the long run.

City manager Paula Wilson told Mr. Reeve that the rates would not go down for at least 20 years because that is how long the \$3 million bond obligation is. He told the council that She also said they couldn't

guarantee that rates would not go up again next year, although right now it is not likely.

The council discussed the increase options. Let me say here, that the citizens who serve terms on the city council are volunteers. They don't get paid to serve and manage city business.

They didn't get together Monday night to gang up on Friona citizens and raise rates just for the fun of it. If you had been there, you would know that.

Ms. Wilson told the council that doubling the sewer rate from \$8.50 to \$17 a month would raise the same amount of revenue as the proposal tied to water usage.

The council agreed that the flat rate is the fairest way to generate the revenue. They voted unanimously to pass the increase. Now all residents pay the same for sewer usage. That's fair isn't it? I'm not sure.

Johnson died September 6 at his residence in Bovina after using a lethal chemical while working on a stoppedup bathroom sink.



Survivors include his wife Frances of the home; a daughter, Penny Burklow of Klondike, Texas and a son, Doug Johnson of Clovis.


Five sisters also survive: Leatha Garrett of Valley Mills; Joetta Mills of North Glasscock and Dicky Clayton.



consecutive years. The records of a constable office that is declared dormant will be transferred to the county clerk. If the office is declared dormant, the previous officeholder does not continue to hold the office. The office may not be filled by election or appointment unless the commissioners court votes to reinstate the office or a majority of votes cast in an election held on the issue favor reinstatement. The reinstatement election may be held if the commissioners court on its own motion orders such an election, or the reinstatement election must be held if the commissioners court receives a petition signed by 10% of the registered voters of the constable precinct. The proposition will appear on the ballot as follows:

declare the office of constable dormant if that office has been vacant for at least seve

"The constitutional amendment authorizing the commissioners court of a county to declare the office of constable in a precinct to be dormant if the office has not been filled by election or appointment for a lengthy period and providing a procedure for the reinstatement of the office."
