In the United States circuit court in Dallas the American Express company, through their attorneys, has filed a motion, which was in open court sustained, asking the suspension of the order of the court granted October 6, 1906. requiring express compannies operating in Texas to receive for transportation in all districts in the State all C. O. D. packages of liquor presented to them for shipment.

Petitioners set forth in their motion as grounds therefor that the law enacted by the present legislature became effective today requiring all express companies to pay an annual tax of \$10,000 on each office maintained by it in prohibition districts to which it should carry intoxicating liquors; and that as it had in Texas 133 offices in such prohibited territory into which, under the mandatory injunction of the court above referred to, it would be compelled to carry C. 




