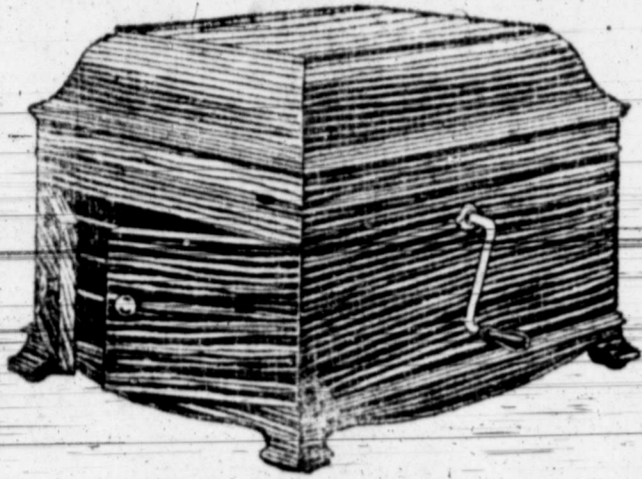

## SHERIFF AND DEPUTY WERE EXONERATED

Sheriff Has Been Restored To Office With Four Indictments Quashed.

When Attorney's Beeman Strong, Moss Adams and Geo. S. King entered the contest of the trials in the special term of district court, called for the purpose yesterday, the criminal charges against Sheriff Prince and Deputy Sheriff Swab Myers vanished like a fog before a noonday sun, and likewise the civil action has been withdrawn.

The first motion of counsel of defense was a challenge of the authority of the court, alleging that it was without authority by reason of the lack of proper advertising. Judge Guinn overruled this plea and forced the cases to trial, when counsel challenged the jurisdiction of the court, pleading that if an offense had been committed against the state of Texas it would be up to the state authorities to file the complaint in Travis county. On this plea the court dismissed the four cases in which extortion was charged and continued the balance to the next regular term of district court. Following this action the civil suit for impeachment was withdrawn, and Sheriff Prince was restored to his office this morning at 10:00 o'clock.
