Eastland 4-Her Is Delegate To Washington, D.C.

Catherine Thomas, Eastland County 4-H member, will be a delegate on the National 4-H Citizenship Washington Focus Short Course July 26-August 3. Twenty-five Texas 4-Hers will have the opportunity to study the federal government, gain an appreciation of our American Heritage, and gain leadership training to implement citizenship programs and activities in their home towns.

Tours will include: Capitol, Library of Congress, Smithsonian Institution, United States Archives, Washington Monument, Mt. Vernon, Monticello, Jefferson Memorial, Lincoln Memorial, Arlington National

Cemetery and the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, Washington National Cathedral, Viet Nam Veterans Memorial. Other special activities will include attending theater at the J.F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts; and an illuminated night view tour of Washington, D.C.

One of the highlights of Cathy's trip will be a personal meeting with U. S. Congressman Charles Stenholm at 1:30 p.m. on July 31st in his Washington office.

Along with tours, the delegation will have the opportunity to meet with 500 4-Hers from other states and through workshops, and special committees to practice citizen-

ship and democracy.

The Citizenship Washington Focus Short Course is available to 4-Hers who are entering their junior or senior years in high school. The Texas Agricultural Extension Service sponsors this opportunity in which citizenship programs are designed to supplement the citizenship education and leadership development training young people receive through the home, school, church and other organizations.

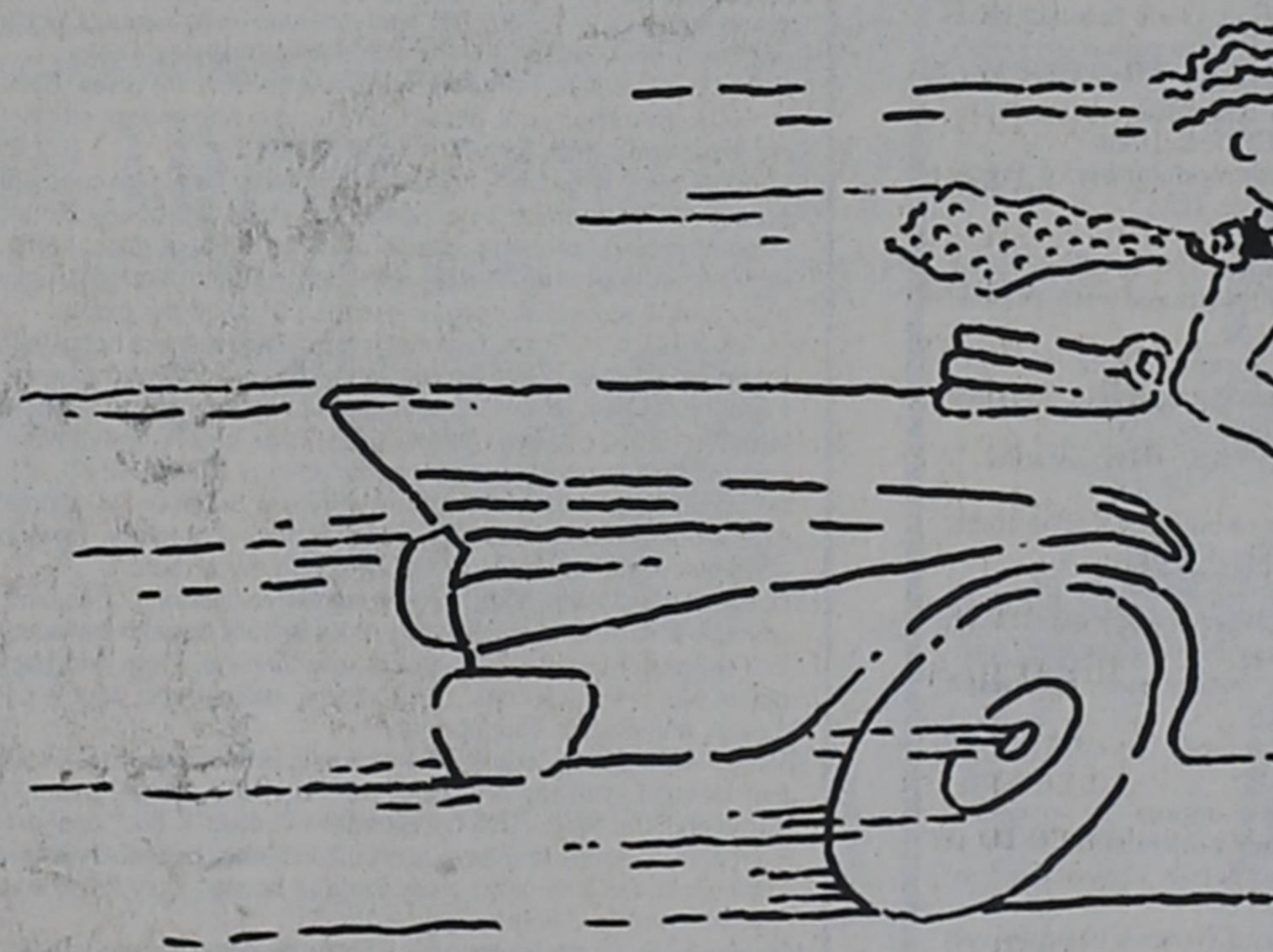

RRC Reviews Projected Purchases Of Oil And Gas For August

Railroad Commission Chairman Lena Guerrero and Commissioner James E. (Jim) Nugent reviewed oil companies' August nominations to buy a total of 1,839,031 barrels of Texas oil per day. The August nomination total, a decrease of 12,960 barrels daily when compared to July purchaser nominations, estimates Texas oil purchases in the coming month. August 1990 nominations totaled 1,840,237 barrels daily. Chairman Guerrero also reported that August nominations for the purchase of Texas gas totaled 20,363,779 Mcf/d (thousand cubic feet per day). July nominations totaled 20,669,476 Mcf/d. August 1990 nominations amounted to 20,923,614 Mcf/d.

The next statewide oil and gas production allowable hearing will begin at 1:30 p.m., Monday, August 19, 1991, at the Railroad Commission headquarters, in the William B. Travis Building, 1701 N. Congress, in Austin.

Bullock Taps Glasgow To Lead State Agency Reorganization Effort

Lt. Governor Bob Bullock has asked Sen. Bob

Amoco Production Company, 145,500 barrels, unchanged; Exxon Company, U.S.A., 133,000 barrels, down 1,300; and Texaco Trading & Transp., Inc., 114,050 barrels, down 1,300.

Chairman Guerrero reported that crude oil and petroleum products imported into the U.S. averaged 8,027,000 barrels per day for the month of May 1991. This is a decrease of 622,000 barrels per day from the same period a year ago.

"There's no area of state government responsibility more critical to the people than efficient organization," Bullock said. "Bob Glasgow has the experience and expertise to tackle such a mammoth task."

Bullock said Glasgow will sponsor bills, based on Comptroller John Sharp's performance audit recommendations, that include the consolidation of the licensing and regulatory functions of the state into a single agency saving an estimated \$7.7 million a year and a merger of the highway, aviation and turnpike agencies into a single state department of transportation.

Helping Glasgow with the bills will be Sens. Bill Ratliff (R-Mount Pleasant), Peggy Rosson (D-El Paso), Temple Dickson (D-Sweetwater), Judith Zafirini (D-Laredo), Teel Bivins (R-Amarillo), Mike Moncrief (D-Fort Worth), Gonzalo Barrientos (D-

He said he is proud to be back in Eastland and "I pledge to you we will do our very best."

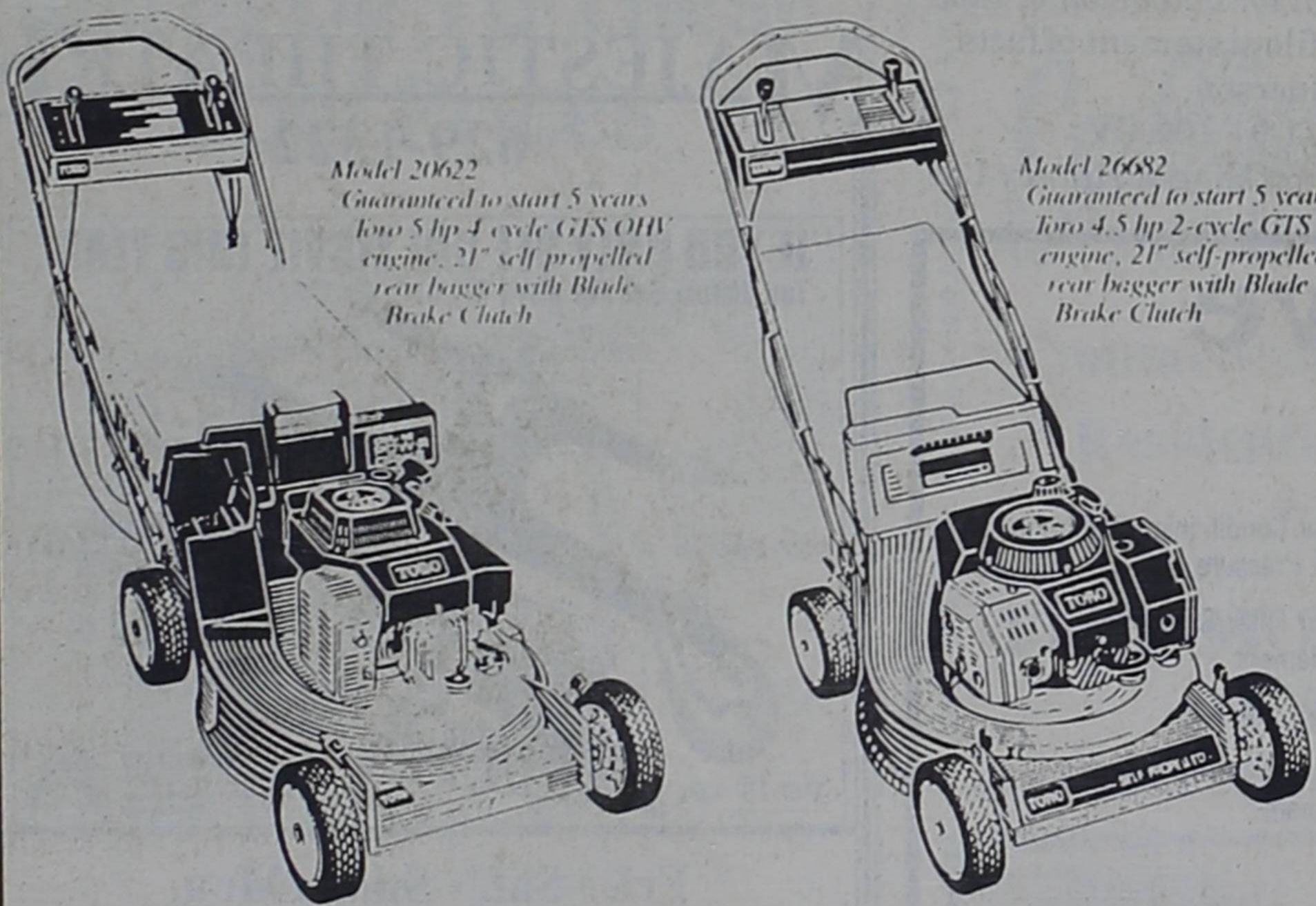
Jim's father Frank Sayre of Eastland presented him with the first dollar plaque and congratulated him.

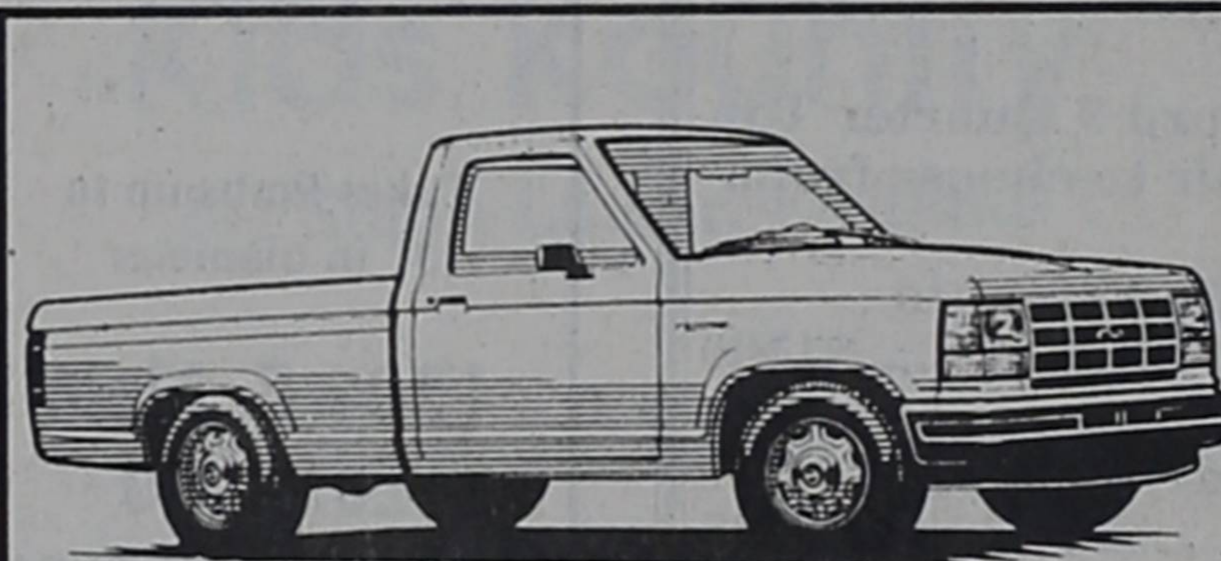

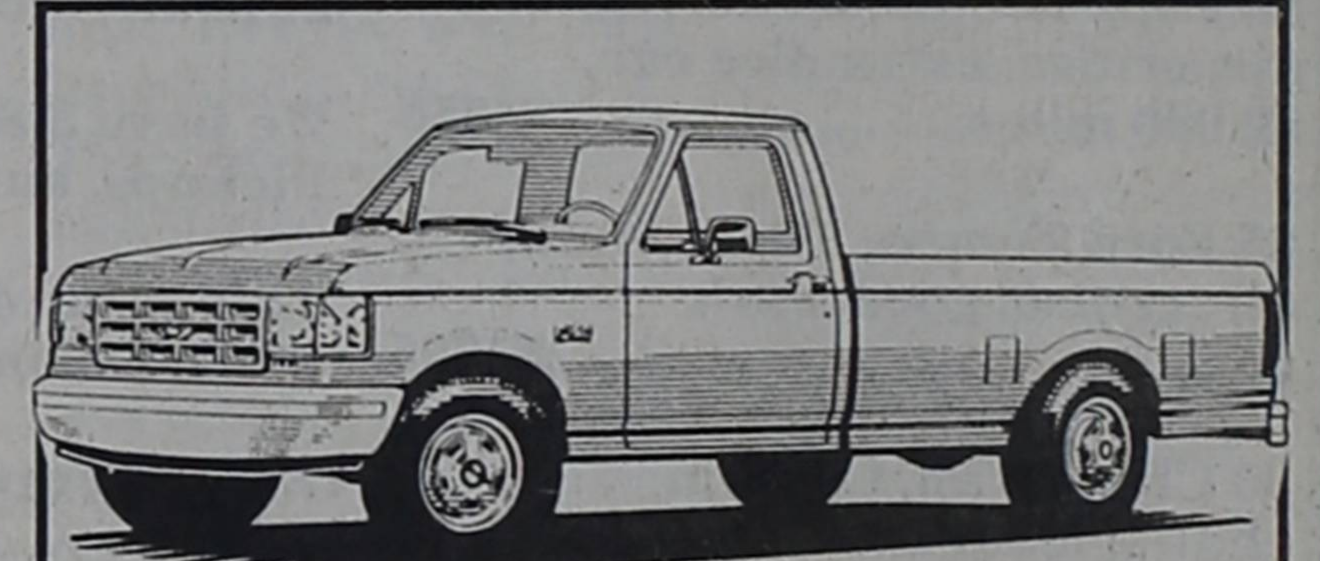
