The Great Horny Toad Mystery:

Scientists use tiny transmitters to keep track of lizards' fates

Not so long ago, horned lizards roamed backyards and roadsides across Texas. Children tied strings around their necks and led them around as pets or brought them to school for show-and-tell.

No more, at least for residents of much of North, East and Central Texas.

And that's why Scott Henke and two other scientists from Texas A & M University at Kingsville have outfitted a group of Texas horned lizards with tiny radio backpacks and tracked them across a wildlife refuge in South Texas for the past year.

Horned lizards - commonly known as horny toads - are vanishing from the Texas landscape. The theories behind the dramatic decline are varied, but none of them ever satisfied Mr. Henke.

"There hasn't been a really good smoking gun," he said last weekend. "Some people have said fire ants are killing them. Others think it's insecticide. But our research doesn't show that."

So, in what scientists say is the first experiment of its kind in Texas, 20 Texas horned lizards were fitted with tiny radio backpacks to help researchers determine why the species is vanishing throughout the state.

After nearly 12 months, the scientists still don't know.

What the research does show is a species besieged, both by natural predators and man.

The ongoing experiment - which began in March - is taking place on the Bomer Wildlife Management Area, a 135-acre park near Benavides surrounded by cotton and cattle farms.

Originally, the experiment involved 20 horned lizards. Now there are just 12, all in hibernation now about an inch below the ground. Mr. Henke said three lizards were run over by cars; two were eaten by road runners; one was eaten by a bird called a loggerhead shrike; another was killed by a wood rat; and another disappeared.

"There really isn't enough information here to explain why they've declined," Mr. Henke said. "None of these predators could reduce the population so much."

The Texas horned lizard is only one of several kinds of horned lizards, which biologists say can be found as far north as southwest Canada and as far south as Guatemala.

No one has ever conducted a horned-lizard census, so there is no estimate of how many lives in Texas, but a 1992 study by scientists at the University of Texas at Austin found that the lizards have declined dramatically across the state.

Mr. Henke said he and his colleagues chose radio backpacks for their experiment because they wanted to see how far the lizards would travel.

Using grants from private foundations, the researchers paid about \$3,780 for 20 tiny radios the size of human fingernails, each weighing about 3 grams. The devices were made by AVM Instruments Limited, a Livermore, Calif.-based electronics manufacturer.

Mr. Henke's wife, Stephani, made cloth backpacks - to hold the transmitters - for the lizards so the scientists could monitor them round the clock. Each lizard was assigned a different frequency, so researchers could distinguish among them. To protect the lizards from predators, the scientists said, they painted the backpacks dark green and black to blend in with the lizards' natural colors.

"Once we got a good design going, it wasn't hard to put the backpacks on the lizards," Mr. Henke said. "They're actually pretty docile."

The Benavides experiment is not the first time scientists have put radio backpacks on horned lizards. In 1990, researchers at the University of California performed a similar experiment on 50 horned lizards. Their findings mirrored those of the researchers in Benavides.

Scientists say more research is needed. "We need to know all we can about these creatures," said June Welch, a professor of biology at the University of Dallas and the author of *O Ye Legendary Texas Horned Frog*. "They're still out there, and they could come back if we'd let them."

Mr. Welch says he has no doubt about what's causing the critter crisis. In his book, he argues that a fire ant pesticide that also kill harvester ants - a staple of the horned lizard's diet - have reduced the lizards' food supply. Mr. Welch also faults curio shops that buy and sell the lizards for use as souvenirs or pets.

Texas and the federal government classify the horned lizard as a threatened species. State law makes it a Class C misdemeanor to possess or sell the lizards without a permit. Fines can range from \$25 to \$500, according to the Texas Department of Parks and Wildlife.

"A lot of people have stopped collecting the lizards because they're finding out it's against the law," said Melissa Montemayor, president of the Austin-based Horned Lizard Conservation Society. "The most important thing we can do is get the word out that it's hard to keep them in captivity."

Ms. Montemayor said her organization had received four horned lizards over the past three years from Texans who captured the lizards, then found out it was illegal to do so.

Scott Fair, an A & M graduate student who participated in the Benavides experiment, said he can understand the lizard's appeal.

"It's so ugly it's cute," said Mr. Fair, who is majoring in range and wildlife science. "That's why some people want to continue hanging onto it."

Mr. Henke said it would be foolish for the state to breed the lizards in captivity and set them free in the hope they might repopulate.

"If we can find out why they're declining, they can come back," Mr. Henke said. "But if you tried to solve it now, it would just be a hit-and-miss effort. It could be a waste of time and money."

Mr. Fair and Mr. Henke said the next phase of the experiment will take place at a state park near Artesia Wells southwest of San Antonio.

Researchers will again outfit 20 horned toads with radio backpacks and monitor them for a year. The object this time will be to determine whether horned toads can survive being uprooted from one side of the park and moved to another.

"You never know if this creature is something important to the ecosystem," Mr. Henke said. "If you wait until something dies off without knowing what its value is, you may regret it."

Citizen Police Academy To Be Held

Eastland Chief of Police Cecil Funderburgh announces that the Eastland Police Department will hold a Citizen Police Academy. The first class will be on Tuesday, March 14, 7-10 p.m. at the Police Dept. Building. These classes will last for 10 consecutive Tuesdays, covering 12 topics in the 10 weeks.

Funderburgh explains that the classes are a public service type program - a learning experience. They will be open to persons who live or work in Eastland County, age 18 and up.

There are other criteria for those wishing to attend, and interested people may stop by the Eastland Police Department and pick up an application blank. Chief Funderburgh says that the classes will be limited to 16 participants, so it would pay to sign up soon if you wish to be included. Funderburgh states

there will be no guns in the Academy training. But instruction will be given on crime prevention, how to cope with criminal incidents, family violence - and the latest information on security measures, personal safety and property protection.

The public will also be educated on how to participate in neighborhood crime watch programs, and will receive information about the criminal justice system.

There will be lectures, tours, and hands-on experience. Chief Funderburgh will be in charge of the instruction, but he will also have guest instructors from throughout the county.

Already scheduled for instruction is Beverley Mehaffey, Director of the Eastland County Crisis Center, Police Sgt. Terry Harbin, who will give training on defensive tactics, and Police Detective Don Walls, who will in-

struct on criminal investigation. Chief Funderburgh says he first became interested in a Citizen Police Academy when he attended one in Fort Worth in 1976.

During a Law Enforcement Meeting at the Texas Municipal League in Austin last October he began to make plans for this type of instruction in Eastland County.

He says the Academy here will be closely patterned after the Duncanville Police Department Citizen Police Academy. This Department provided some of the information for the course.

Chief Funderburgh says: "I think it is very important for the citizens to understand how their Police Departments work, and for Law Enforcement Officers to also understand citizen concerns."

If you live or work in Eastland County, are at least 18 years of age, and are interested in applying for admission to the Eastland Police Department Citizen Police Academy, you may fill out an application at the Eastland Police Department at 416 S. Seaman St. between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday-Friday. For further information, call (817) 629-1700.

Eastland Names Warford Interim City Attorney

Tommy Warford is the new interim city attorney for Eastland, replacing Mike Siebert, who is now the district attorney.

Warford practices with local attorney Virgil Seaberry.

During a four-hour meeting Monday night, commissioners also discussed problems that have surfaced with local contractor David Wilson. Wilson was the successful bidder on laying sewer pipe to the location of a new wastewater treatment plant that is almost operational.

Wilson, project engineer Billy Jacobs and Eastland National Bank representatives attended the executive session.

Commissioners voted to ask Warford to investigate the claims against Wilson's bonding company and determine the status of those claims.

They also asked Jacobs to examine the "punch list" of things unfinished and estimate the cost.

Wilson and Jacobs are then to meet with claimants. Once an affidavit is executed verifying all bills are paid and approved by Jacobs and City Manager Paul Cateo, payment of \$46,678.68 will be made jointly to Wilson and the Eastland National Bank.

Wilson was to have finished the project by Oct. 15. Efforts to reach him by telephone were unsuccessful.

Legal Matters

Papa Program Teaches Responsibility
 For nearly a decade, the Attorney General has been sending

trained volunteers to Texas schools to help young people understand the rights and responsibilities of parenthood. We call this program parenthood

and paternity, or PAPA. It is an important part of our child support program.

In our PAPA presentations, we explain the laws that require both parents to help support their children. We advise young people about the importance of establishing paternity for children born out of wedlock, and explain how paternity testing can be used to determine whether or not someone is a baby's biological father.

A REALITY CHECK
 We have found that many young people are not aware of the legal rights and responsibilities of parenthood. For example, they may not know that:

- *a person can be ordered to pay child support regardless of age;
- *the father's name on a birth certificate does not necessarily

establish legal paternity;

*some mothers have to pay child support to the father;

*a non-custodial parent ordered to make payments will have to reimburse the government for welfare benefits the custodial parent collected.

For most young people, it is an eye-opener when they add up some of the day-to-day expenses that accompany parenthood, such as diapers, baby food and baby clothes. We ask them to calculate their expected earnings and compare them to the cost of raising a child.

We also explain that every baby deserves to know the identity of his or her parents, and needs to establish emotional bonds with both parents. It is important for every baby to have access to family medical history on both

sides, and to receive benefits such as inheritance. By helping youngsters understand the legal and financial realities of parenthood, we hope to prevent the children of the future from experiencing unnecessary financial hardships.

A NEW CURRICULUM

Recently, we updated the PAPA curriculum in response to positive feedback from parents, teachers, and kids. Our goal is to provide all the materials needed so that schools can incorporate PAPA classes in their regular school year. The new curriculum includes a letter to the student's parents, a class outline, a discussion guide, a test, handouts, games, review questions, and a video.

Legislative Week

By John R. Cook, State Representative, District 60

AUSTIN — Representative John Cook, D-Breckenridge, announced that the legislature received two items of good news this week. The Texas Supreme Court upheld the School Finance plan adopted by the legislature last week and the Criminal Justice Policy Council announced that for the first time in two decades that correctional capacity is ahead of the demand curve.

While neither announcement will permit us to remain stagnant, the Texas legislature has a historic opportunity to meet the challenge of fulfilling the goals of providing a quality education for future generations and provide for public safety.

The Texas Supreme Court in the majority opinion pointed out that "Our judgment in this case should not be interpreted as a signal that the school finance crisis in Texas has ended." The issue of school finance is not behind us but we have at least this session to concentrate on quality rather than how to pay for public education. The legislature will consider in the coming week a revision of the Education Code which will hopefully provide the basis for a more efficient system of public education without the necessity of just throwing money at the educational system and permit a strong program of academic accountability and local control.

In the criminal justice arena the challenge is to concentrate on improving the long-term effectiveness of correctional substance abuse treatment programs, operational infrastructure and juvenile justice reforms without enhancing penalties

to a level that will create another correctional capacity crisis. Additional prison beds constructed by the State with the bond proceeds approved by the voters in 1993 together with a drop in the crime rate will result in a steep drop in payments to counties for state prisoners. Budgeted figures from the 1994-95 biennium of approximately \$482 million will drop to zero for the 1996-97 biennium. This means counties which have received payments from the State for housing state prisoners will not have these payments in the coming years unless the State provides some new method of contracting with counties for their

available capacity in lieu of additional prison construction which will probably become necessary after 1997.

The need to provide more facilities for incarceration of juveniles will be the primary cost driver in future years. Violent crimes committed by juveniles are a real threat and the implementation of a plan to solve this problem is one of the principal issues to be considered by the House Committee on Juvenile Justice and Family Issues on which Representative Cook serves as vice-chairman. Demographic changes in the State create a critical issue that will affect the long-term effectiveness of any criminal justice reform. The Texas population between the ages of 10 and 24

years, the age group most likely to be involved in crime, will increase by 505,000 by the year 2004 and by over million by the year 2030. More than half of this population growth will be in minority youth in urban areas, especially in neighborhoods in socio-economic deterioration. Before this growth becomes a reality, it is essential to have policies in place which deal with both education and juvenile justice issues.

Gray Matter

Dr. Harris Isabel
This might be a pretty good time to pay respect to the memory of the late Dr. Harris Isabel.

He was a member of the class of 1928, which was one of the classes producing more talented people than most others. This is also the class that established the five-year homecomings we all seem to enjoy so much. This class also produced the best baseball team and the one that went the farthest in the playoffs for the state championship than any of the other.

After Harris began to have a place of prominence in the medical profession I remember one of his classmates referring to his never taking any final exams while in his senior class in high school. He was trying to see to it that his sister got the coveted valediction prize for having the highest grades of any of the class.

I have thought about several times in the intervening years and I think Harris' friend was mistaken. If I remember correctly if a school met certain qualifications set up

by the state educational people that those students who had a grade of a certain high point did not have to take a final examination in that subject his last year or so in high school. I'm not sure what the dividing line on this was but I am thinking it was either 95 or 90. Perhaps it was the latter figure. Harris' grades were so high that we did not have to take any finals on that account not that he was attempting to help his sister make valedictorian.

His father was doctor who came to Eastland as a part of the increase in population due to the oil boom. I remember one night stopping at the local Ford dealership while Guy Patterson was running it and getting some gas. Dr. Isabel, Harris' father, was in there talking to Guy. It seemed that in his hurry to make an emergency call on a woman giving birth to an infant out in the country he had left his wallet at. He was explaining to Mr. Patterson why he did not have any money with and Guy told him to go and forget it, that he would probably have to deliver this baby free and the mother wouldn't be able to pay for the house call. Back in those days doctors made a lot of house calls.

Apparently the Harris family's roots were in Arkansas. After graduating from EHS Harris went to the University of Arkansas at Fayetteville and then from there to the Tulane Medical School at New Orleans. Tulane, by the way, back in those days most have been on the busiest medical schools in the land. You will see its graduates all over the Deep South and the Southwest who were students along about that time.

After leaving Tulane, Harris seems to have become connected with the Medical School of the University of Kentucky at Lexington. He appears to have been more of a medical research man than a general practitioner. And about this time the National Health Service opened up a fine hospital in Lexington to study the effects of toxic drugs on the individual. It is my understanding that Harris was one of the world's leaders in this study.

Harris had a young brother who made a school teacher and immediately after he got out of college he came back to Eastland and taught here a year or two. I remember my brother, Rex, always considered Jim Isabel, the doctor's brother, as one of his favorite teachers. Jim taught for many years in a small, private school in Virginia but he used to always come back to Eastland for his summer vacation.

After the senior Dr. Isabel died, Jim's mother operated a news stand in the west end of the Connellee Hotel. I used to go in there a lot. She was a good conversationalist and also she had a good supply of publications and if there was one that she did not have, but was available on the market, she would get it for me. I remember she told me one time about Harris having a heart attack that had slowed him up. Harris had lost the only child he and Mrs. Isabel had while the child was still a child. Then in a relative short time, Mrs. Isabel passed away. So all in all, Harris' personal life was not the most pleasant.

Mrs. Isabel told me about the time President and Mrs. Johnson invited Harris and his mother to spend the weekend with

them at the President's ranch on the river, just west of Johnson City. Actually it was the President's way of finding out about Harris. His name had come up for Surgeon General of the United States and President Johnson wanted to find out a little about this man.

However, it was my understanding that Harris withdrew his name for consideration himself because of his heart condition at the time.

Jim Isabel died several years ago. I think he is buried in Eastland as I remember his funeral service being held at the local Presbyterian Church. And I guess his mother and father are both buried there too, but I am not sure of that.

After his brother and mother passed away, Harris spent several months in Eastland. And I got to know him pretty well as he and I used to turn up for supper at Ester Faye's Old Rip Restaurant on East Main about the same time. I have not an idea what Harris' I.Q. was but it was bound to have been above the normal. He was an extremely bright man and would not have gone as far as he did in the medical profession if he hadn't been. During the period when I was seeing as much of him as I was, I once asked him if he remembered taking a course in college that he actually had to struggle with to master. He said he did not. He said he usually read the lesson over at least once before going into a class room and if that confused him any he would re-read it and that was about all of his book studying. After he got his mother's and an aunt's affairs straightened out he returned to Kentucky.

FISHING OUTDOORS

TOURNAMENTS MEAN DOLLARS FOR BUSINESS

Fishing is a popular recreational activity in Texas enjoyed by over 1.6 million licensed anglers. To effectively manage the fisheries of the state, the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department conducts annual surveys to provide the agency with information on the characteristics, fishing habits, motivations, attitudes and economic effects of fishing by resident anglers.

In 1992, in cooperation with Texas A&M Univer-

sity, TPWD conducted a survey of 1,965 black bass anglers in Texas. Anglers were contacted if they listed black bass as their preferred freshwater species on the previous statewide survey. A total of 1,278 anglers responded to the mail questionnaire (65%). Almost all (87%) Texas bass anglers were male, with an average age of 42 years, reporting an average of almost 28 years of total freshwater fishing experience, and 21 years of bass fishing. Participants fished an average of 29 total days

with 23 days fishing for black bass during the previous 12 months. About 11% of the anglers were members of bass clubs. Bass fishing was the most important outdoor activity for 26% of the anglers. The most frequently reported lakes for black bass fishing were Sam Rayburn, Lake Conroe, Lake Fork, Toledo Bend and Lake Livingston.

On average anglers spent \$91 on a typical bass fishing trip. The typical trip lasted 2 days involving one way travel of 80 miles. Major expenditures on bass fishing trips were for transportation, lodging, bait and tackle, and food, drinks, ice and fuel. Licensed anglers spent an estimated \$301,350,000.00 1992 on bass fishing trips. This value is for trip costs only and does not include equipment (boats, rods, reels, baits, etc.)

Locally we have only one organization left who puts on an open type format bass tournament. The Eastland County Bass Club and this event has struggled over the years

with highs and lows. If this event draws 100 anglers from out of town the estimated amount of money pumped into the economy is \$100. Other events such as Anglers Choice, Honey Hole and Cast have all held team events at Leon, with an average of 35 two person teams. This is an estimated \$3,000 into area business.

But there are those who are seeking to stifle these dollars for our area economy. I say instead lets organize another event or two for Leon. No one can say fishing has declined due to the pressure. Sure the fishing has changed, but the winning weights have soared. Don't let a few people hurt your business dollars, promote and support this fun and exciting sport at every opportunity.

Proctor's crappie are still improving with minnows being the bait of choice, Leon crappie fair still spotty on jigs, Hubbard Creek good with some big egg sacks being reported.

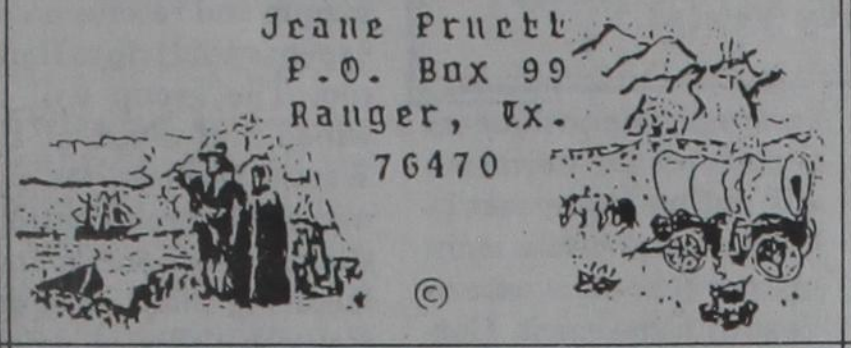

Stop Order Placed on Destruction of Railroad Retirement Pension Papers

Curt B. Witcher, President of the Federation of Genealogical Societies, reports that the Federation led a delegation of representatives from the genealogical community in a meeting with National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) staff at the recent FGS conference in Richmond, Virginia. The meeting established the following:

* A stop order on further destruction of Railroad Retirement Board Pension Papers.

* A review of the railroad pension records to determine an appropriate retention schedule.

* The NARA will consider expanding this review to include other federal records with significant amounts of personal, identifying data.

* The NARA will seek opportunities for soliciting input from the genealogical community during the formulation process for federal records retention schedules.

The delegation established that these pension records contain significant information of inter-

est to genealogists, social historians, demographers, family health historians, and ethnologists. To obtain information from existing Railroad Retirement Pension Records, contact the **Railroad Retirement Board, 844 Rush Street, Chicago, Illinois 60611.**

CENTRAL TEXAS PEANUT QUALITY CONFERENCE

The annual Central Texas Peanut Quality Conference is scheduled for Tuesday, Feb. 7, 1995, at the First Baptist Church Activity Center in Rising Star. Registration will begin at 8:30 a.m. This would be a good opportunity for producers to visit with the more than 17 allied industry sponsors at their exhibit booths. The program will begin at 9:00 a.m.

Andy Vestal, State Coordinator of the Texas Agri-Food Master Program, will be the first speaker on the program. The Agri-Food Master Program as you may have heard, is an urban volunteers program aimed at teaching urban consumers about agriculture. Eastland and Comanche County peanut producers have hosted three counties in the past two years educating their Agri-Food Masters about PEANUTS!!!

Pharmacy Topics

Sleep apnea, in which breathing during sleep stops for 10 seconds or more, raises blood pressure and heart rate so high that it's now considered an independent risk factor for hypertension, *The Annals of Internal Medicine* notes.

Doctors suggest that sleep apnea may be the root of common high blood pressure with no known cause. One "cure": losing weight seems to improve both conditions.

To ease knee pain in arthritics, British researchers wrapped adhesive tape around their knees; best results occurred when the kneecap was pulled to the center of the body, relieving extra pressure caused by a poorly aligned kneecap. Flexible bandage doesn't work as well as tape.

Longer-lasting asthma medication (salmeterol xinafoate) helped prevent symptoms better than other inhalers, *The Journal of the American Medical Association* reports. The drug is more effective during exercise, and the 12-hour dose lets patient sleep through the night.

Board Of Health Adopts Statewide Rabies Quarantine

Following action this month by the Texas Board of Health, the entire state of Texas is now a designated quarantine area to prevent the spread of rabies. The quarantine forbids the transport of potentially infected animals within or from the state.

"We must act quickly to contain the threat of rabies - now rampant in South and Central Texas. We must do this to minimize the number of animal rabies cases and reduce the threat this deadly disease poses to people," Dr. David Smith, Commissioner of Health, said.

He explained that the board took action following reports of the exportation of coyotes and foxes, including some infected animals, to other states. "We know that South Texas coyotes have been shipped out-of-state to stock hunting clubs. And just this week we learned that two of four foxes shipped from Texas to Montana have been confirmed with rabies. This is a dangerous situation - one which can spread rabies beyond the point of our ability to control it," Dr. Smith said.

Similar transportation of potentially infected animals exists within Texas, but the extent is unknown, he added.

"This situation is similar to the raccoon rabies outbreak in the eastern United States. When it began in the 1950's, it was considered a local problem. Another outbreak began in the 1970's in Virginia, after infected raccoons were shipped from Florida to hunting clubs there. Now the entire East Coast is battling a raccoon rabies epidemic," Dr. Smith said.

Animals subject to the quarantine are dogs and cats over 3 months old without a current rabies vaccination certificate, hybrid animals - such as domestic dog-wolf crosses - and wild animals at high risk of rabies - such as skunks, bats, foxes, coyotes and raccoons.

In South Texas, a canine rabies epizootic (an epidemic in animals) began in 1988 in Starr

County and rapidly moved northward, now including at least 18 counties. Canine rabies is a strain of rabies virus that has become established in coyotes and is readily transmitted from coyotes to domestic dogs, and, subsequently, between domestic dogs. Because it often infects domestic dogs, this rabies strain poses a greater risk for human exposure.

From 1988 through 1994, some 530 cases of canine rabies were confirmed, primarily in coyotes and domestic dogs. During this period, about 1,500 people in South Texas were exposed to rabies and received treatment. In recent years, two Texans died from canine rabies - a Starr County woman in 1991 and a Hidalgo County boy in November 1994.

The Texas Department of Health (TDH) is planning an air drop of coyote bait containing oral rabies vaccine in hopes of stopping the spread of the South Texas epizootic. The air drop follows extensive development of the oral vaccine and delivery system. Set for next month, it is unprecedented in this state.

In 1994, a fox rabies epizootic in Central Texas resulted in 270 cases of this virus, primarily in

foxes. Another 247 cases were reported from 1987 through 1993.

Gray fox rabies is readily transmitted to raccoons and livestock, especially cows and goats. It may also be transmitted to cats and dogs. More than 300 persons from the gray fox rabies epizootic area received treatment for exposure to this rabies strain in 1994.

TDH will place warning signs about the quarantine in post offices and other high-traffic areas throughout the state. Local health officials and animal control officers will also be asked to help enforce the quarantine. Violation of the quarantine is a Class C misdemeanor.

All Texans are urged to have their pets vaccinated against rabies.

Texas Gardener Tips

The first step in designing an easy-care garden is to determine what you don't like to or can't do and eliminate those obstacles. For example: If bending over is difficult, plan raised beds waist-high so you can sit while you work. If you use a cane, walker or wheelchair plan wide, level paths and convenient turnaround areas. If you get short of breath, locate the garden close to the house with tools and supplies nearby. Know site characteristics: boundaries; orientation to the compass; seasonal sun, shade and wind directions; soil quality; existing trees and plants. Choose plants and a design adaptable to those factors. Put your plan down on paper; it is vital to easy gardening. Experiment with several possibilities, redoing on paper is easier than in the garden. The most effective and efficient gardens are small, manageable units. Design small round or square gardens; they are easier to maintain than free-form beds. For mowing ease round the corners of square beds. Plan beds so you can reach the middle from either side without straining. Modify the shape of your lawn for easier mowing. Stop and turn or stop and angle mowing invite back injuries; tight circle mowing is tiring. Us ground cover plants, bark chips, gravel or even concrete to decrease mowing areas. Think twice about a plant: will it drop fruit or blooms that need constant clean up; how much care does it take; how much will it grow in 10 years? You may not want it after all.
