Temperature, blood pressure, pulse, hemoglobin level and detailed medical history will be performed prior to acceptance as a qualified blood donor.



22-mile crushed limestone recreational trail will link Mineral Wells and Weatherford to Lake Mineral Wells State Park.

Texas Sen. David Sibley of Waco and Texas Rep. John Cook of Breckenridge also was on hand for the 1:30 p.m. Friday ceremony hosted by the Mineral Wells Chamber of Commerce. The ground breaking ceremony will be held at the Mineral Wells Depot near the intersection of U.S. Highways 281 and 180.

Salvage of the railroad tracks and ties have just begun to clear the way for Texas Parks and Wildlife Department personnel to begin trail surfacing, fencing and the installation of decking and railing on the railroad bridges. TPWD will manage, patrol and maintain the hike and

bike trail, which was made possible when the state acquired 259 acres of railroad right of way from Union Pacific Railroad last December.

Eighty percent of the \$2 million project cost is being funded through a federal grant administered by the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT). Most of the other 20 percent is being covered by a partial donation of land from Union Pacific and construction of parking lots by TxDOT.

TPWD has estimated that the new trail will have a \$500,000 annual direct economic impact on nearby Mineral Wells State Park, and the communities of Mineral Wells and Weatherford through the sale of fuel, food, accommodations, promotional items and the like to trail users.

Visitors will be able to access the trail from three trail heads: one near Cartwright Park in Weatherford, one in Mineral Wells and another at the state park. To offset the trails operational costs, trail users will be required to pay a small fee to access the trail or must possess a Texas Parks and Wildlife Conservation Passport.

There are currently more than 700 rail-to-trail conversions in the United States, six of them in Texas. TPWD operates

### WHAT'S THE LATEST ON TAX LEGISLATION?

With politicians starting to focus their attention on the upcoming fall elections, there seems little likelihood that any major tax legislation will be passed this year. While optimists still hope for legislation that incorporates the provisions Democrats and Republicans already agree on, most analysts feel that the larger issues of balancing the budget and cutting taxes will be postponed until after the elections.

Congress did, however, wrap four provisions into The Contract With American Advancement Act, and that legislation was recently signed by President Clinton.

One provision in the new law raises the federal debt limit to \$5.5 trillion from the prior limit of \$4.9 trillion. It is expected that the new debt ceiling will carry the Treasury through the next 18 months to the end of the next fiscal year.

The second provision, the most significant in the Act, gives Presidents line-item veto authority for the first time in history. Effective January 1997, the executive branch of the government will have the power to strike individual provisions from spending bills. The measure also allows a President to veto tax breaks targeted to fewer than 100 taxpayers or 10 businesses. Congress retained the power to define what tax provisions qualify for the line-item veto.

A third provision increases the amount of income certain social security recipients can earn before they begin losing benefits. No change is made in the earnings ceiling for those age 62 to 64. They will continue to lose \$1 of benefits for every \$2 they earn above the \$8,280 ceiling for 1996. Individuals age 65 to 69 were scheduled to lose \$1 of benefit for every \$3 they earned above the \$11,520 ceiling for 1996. The new law raises the ceiling for 1996 to \$12,500. The earnings ceiling will gradually be increased every year up to a maximum of \$30,000 by the year 2002. Those 70 and older have no earnings limit.

A final provision gives small businesses more power in challenging federal agencies in court over the cost of federal regulations.





## Protecting Your Cattle Investment Workshop Scheduled May 30

The Eastland County Extension Livestock and Forage Committee is coordinating a workshop designed to educate producers on pricing strategies of beef calves. "With the market volatility in both cattle and corn this would be an excellent time for cattlemen to start managing their risk", states Davy Vestal, County Extension Agent for Agriculture in Eastland County. "We have a unique opportunity in the market at the present time, one commodity, corn, directly affecting the pricing of another, beef," Vestal added. In this scenario it makes perfectly good sense to price the commodity with forward contracting and hedge the market. If a producer positions himself in the corn market today and corn continues to go up or if a drought in the corn belt causes a short corn crop, then a cattleman can exercise his contract in the corn market and protect his investment in a calf crop. Simply speaking, if corn goes up, then cattle are going

to continue to fall in prices, maybe into the high teens or low 20's by late fall. So in order to insure a cash flow in the beef business, maybe we need to get into the corn business.

Sounds a little confusing, but it's really a simple action. The Extension Livestock and Forage Committee has asked Corey Priest to conduct a workshop over how to position yourself in the corn market to protect a beef price. Mr. Priest is a former member of the Chicago Board of Trades and past employee of Cattle Fax in Denver, Colorado. Presently Mr. Priest is the owner and manager of a large stock cattle and conditioning program in central Texas. During his workshop, Priest will outline the factors that determine calf prices, work some breakeven on cattle and discuss the use of a commodity market monitor. Priest will show producers, in simple fashion, how they can insure their calf crop prices through forward contracting in the corn market.

The program will be held on Thursday, May 30, at 7:30 p.m. at the Eastland Livestock Auction Barn on Highway 80 East in Eastland.

There will be a \$5 registration fee which will include a hamburger supper.

The program is sponsored by The Eastland National Bank, First National Bank of Cisco, Peoples State Bank of Clyde-Rising Star Branch, People State Bank of Clyde-Ranger Branch, The Security State Bank in Gorman and The Eastland County Farm Bureau, Eddie Clay, Manager.

## Veterans News

The Dallas VA Medical Center now has a toll free 800 number for Veterans who live outside the Metroplex area: 1-800-849-3597.

All Veterans should periodically review their paperwork to insure everything is up-to-date and available when any claim is filed by them or in their behalf. A certified copy of their separation document (AGO 53-55 OR

DD214) will be necessary for any initial claim. Processing may be delayed up to three months if the VA has to verify a non-certified discharge. The County Clerk where your form is filled will provide a free certified copy if you tell them it is for VA claim purposes.

If you have a Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP) or if you kept your GI Insurance in force, you should check every two or three years to insure the names and addresses or beneficiaries are up-to-date. Your present spouse may not appreciate learning that the benefits are going to wife no. one! Also, the VA handles many cases where the beneficiary cannot be located because the address is too old for tracing.

If you have a will, make sure it represents your current desires. If you don't have one, get it prepared. The Legal Office at Dyess will help retirees prepare their wills. It only takes about an hour of your time and they will mail it to you in a few days. You may want to consider making a "Living Will" too regarding medical decisions if a patient is in a coma or persistent vegetative state.

When you reach the age where estate planning is appropriate, you may want to consult a professional to draw up Powers of Attorney, Trusts, Etc. Proper planning can pass most of your estate to your survivors rather than the tax coffers. Your County Veterans

Abolish the personal income tax; replace it with a 10% national retail sales tax (excluding house rent, non-prepared food, health care & medicine, stocks, bonds, gold, futures, option or warrants will be exempt. (Sales tax would capture the 17% that IRS says pays nothing.)

Mandate a 15% raise for all. Increase excise taxes 10%, including gasoline.

Implement a low, 2% national retail sales tax on real estate, (to reduce current capital gains tax).

Flatten business income tax to a flat 15%, only deductions for research and development, charitable contributions and \$1,000 per employee to encourage job creation. (Any business earning more than twice expenses (minus owner salaries, loans, pension payments) will be subject to a flat, 25% income tax.)

End all taxes on capital gains, gift and inheritance and savings and dividends.

Repeal the 16th Amendment to remove federal citizen income taxes.

Make any tax increase expire after four years; subject on national referendum.

Take Social Security off budget. Invest half of S.S. funds in either private or government sector; stocks in U.S. firms, A+ U.S. bonds and with

10-year maturity.

Incorporate a tax amnesty: unreported income could be volunteered at 15%, no penalty or interest; funds to go to S.S. trust fund.

Balance the budget. Spending would be subject to mandatory reduction if interests costs exceed 15% total, expenditure, exclusive of S.S.

Summary: Enactment of this proposal will broaden the tax base. It

does not shift the tax base from capital and investment to the working middle class. The elimination of income tax and stable, predictable rates will attract off-shore capital into the S. The net sum of these points will create the single greatest economic expansion in the history of the United States and perhaps the western world.





I have committed to establish a local network to assist in various ways to ensure the rights of those with disability, to create an atmosphere where everyone feels safe and included. 

**AN AMERICAN HERO**

**GEORGE WASHINGTON CARVER**

No one put out a kidnapping alert when George Washington Carver and his family were abducted. It was more like "stolen property," because Carver and his mother and a sibling were slaves on a Missouri farm near Diamond Grove.

His owner, Moses Carver, hired a man to find his stolen goods and after six days, the man came back with a small bundle under his arm. It was the baby, George Washington Carver, who was born in 1859 and returned to his owner more dead than alive.

Carver lived to show the world the value of a person. He became a distinguished plant researcher whose findings — especially about the peanut — revolutionized agriculture in the South.

Schools in the South restricted their enrollment to whites. Finally, at the age of 14, he found a school in Neosho, Missouri, that would accept him as a student. He walked to school and, tired from the miles, rested in front of the residence of Mariah Watkins, a midwife and washer-woman. She took him in because she somehow recognized his potential. "God has a work for you," she told him, "and he wants me ... to lend a hand."

He eventually enrolled at Simpson College in Indianola, Iowa. He took in laundry and worked as a janitor so he could go to Iowa State College. He was graduated in 1894, and became an assistant botanist there. He made his reputation on a collection of fungus that included 20,000 species.

He joined Booker T. Washington at the Tuskegee Institute in Alabama, where he set himself to finding replacement crops for cotton. He urged farmers to switch to peanuts, and then developed 300 uses for the crop. His main work was stimulating black students toward excellence, and he turned down an offer of \$100,000 to leave Tuskegee.

On his tombstone is the inscription: "He could have added fortune to fame, but caring for neither, he found happiness and honor in being helpful to the world."





Avoid criticizing and punishing for mistakes. Criticism teaches athletes to fear failure, causing them to worry that they will not perform well and to dread the possible disapproval of their parents, their coach, and teammates. Being negative or punitive hurts rather than improves performance.

Show your children that you love and accept them, regardless of the game's outcome or how they performed. This is the basis for a positive self-concept. **SOME WORDS OF CAUTION**

Though it is perfectly natural to identify with your children, and want them to be successful, be careful not to live our dreams through them. Seeing a child's performance in sports as a reflection of one's own self-worth and success, can cause parents to set unrealistic high goals for their children and place pressure on them to perform, a major cause of stress in sports for kids.
