### State Officials Say **Drought And Fire Emergency Continues**

(From the Division of **Emergency Management** Texas Department of Public Safety 5805 N. Lamar Blvd. Austin, Texas 78752)

Texas Division of Emergency Management is working closely with State and local fire officials who predict that the ongoing drought will lead to a long, intense summer fire season. In preparing for the worst, they consider extreme dry conditions and a record-breaking winter fire season as early indicators of the danger

Below normal rainfall, which began to plague the state last fall, has left most of Texas well behind seasonal averages. The dry conditions, says the Texas Forest Service, create wildland fire dangers that they usually do not see until summer.

"During the 1996 winter fire season, Texas had record fire activity, fire intensity, and loss," said Mark Stanford, assistant department head for the Texas Forest Service. "Drought conditions that greatly contributed to the fire season still exist across the state."

Stanford said that while spring "green up" has reduced wildfire activity the lull is temporary. Vegetation - light and heavy fuels for fire - is both abundant and unseasonably dry. He said that as the drought continues vegetation will become drier and easier to burn.

Most areas of the state, according to the National Weather Service, have received less than half their needed rainfall for this time of the year. Areas, such as Corpus Christi, San Antonio, Lubbock and Houston have received only one fourth of their normal rainfall.

Drought conditions began last fall in many parts of the state. Some areas of West Texas are in the midst of a two-year drought.

More than 80 counties still have burn bans in effect. Stanford predicts that as the extreme dry conditions continue, many more areas will need to enact similar bans.

Phermone traps set in the Jim Baker Orchard south of Cisco indicate a significant moth flight occurred during the weekend of May 18-19.

These traps are designed to capture the mole moth through a female scent (Phermone) developed by TAMU researchers. This moth flight may only be used

as an indicator that casebearer moth are in flight.

It is still highly recommended to scout nutlets for egg lay. At the present time it appears a little early to begin spraying as eggs were not observed despite the heavy moth flight.

#### Cong. Charles Stenholm Comments On Taxes

Member of Congress

Tax reform is on the minds of most Americans and small business owners. While House Ways and Means Committee Chairman Bill Archer has indicated that tax reform legislation will not come up for a vote this year, this issue will continue to receive increased attention. I wanted to take this opportunity to respond to NFIB's recent poll regarding changes in the current tax system.

I am encouraged by the increased attention that fundamental tax reform has received. There is no question that the tax code can and should be simplified. I am pleased that debate has focused on what changes can be made to improve private savings and investment.

My position will be guided by three basic principles throughout the debate on overhauling the tax code. First, with our country facing a \$5 trillion national debt, tax reform must not result in higher deficits. The harm from digging the deficit hole deeper would far outweigh the benefits of any specific tax change. Second, the tax code should encourage savings and investment instead of consumption. Finally, the tax code should distribute the tax burden fairly

I will continue to evaluate the different proposals as additional information regarding their impact is calculated and as constituents provide me with input. 





#### Letter To The Editor

Dear Editor: The thunder of silence!

This letter was written to save lives. All sarcasm directed toward big government and hypothetical legislative processes is intentional.

Since 1948 an important medical study has been conducted in Framingham, MA which has identified a correlation between high cholesterol and heart disease. The most important discovery about the group of subjects examined was that no person who consistently had a total cholesterol reading below 150 has ever suffered a heart attack.

For all adult Americans, the range of total cholesterol is represented by a density function called a bell curve. This means that more people have cholesterol readings clustered near the peak of the bell than near the edges. Knowing that total cholesterol below 150 is a safe level, it is possible to use yearly coronary death rate and average cholesterol statistics along with a mortality function represented by a ramp to predict the death rate for any national average cholesterol. A reduction in cholesterol to 190 from the current 205 will save 200,000 lives yearly. A more dramatic savings of 500,000 lives per year will require a reduction of average The yearly death

tional scandal because heart disease is now preventable. What will happen if the same number of people were killed by firearms last year? Congress would attempt to pass legislation to confiscate every registered firearm owned by private citizens. What will happen if 923,000 people died on our highways in 1995? Congress would not dare to confiscate our automobiles but certainly would attempt to lower the speed limit on the Interstate to 35 mph. Finally, what will Congress do when the latest statistics are released regarding heart disease deaths? All we will hear is the thunder

of silence.

human life by our government indicates a serious leadership vacuum in this country. The leadership attribute we must expect from all our elected representatives is to improve our quality of life at the lowest possible cost while maintaining our national sovereignty. Heart disease is a quality of life issue because it is a life or death decision we can make with life extended by prevention of the disease.

The first action by Congress to mitigate this disaster is to establish truthful guidelines regarding safe total cholesterol levels. The current guideline recommending diet improvement or treatment only when cholesterol readings are above 240 is not laughable, but a very sad commentary about the arrogant disregard of prevention of disease as a cure.

There's nothing like a hearty stew or soup to warm the spirits as well as the body. Today I have two that might qualify as soupy stews.

The first is a Cioppino, a wonderful fish stew similar to the French bouillabaisse or Spain's Andalusian zarzuela. The second is a spicy beef stew made with round tip or chuck (I prefer the more flavorful chuck), seasoned with oregano and

With either of these dishes you need only a bowl of steaming boiled potatoes and crusty peasant bread. You might also want to refresh the palate after the stew with a

With the cioppino, I'd serve a medium-bodied white wine such as a Gavi from the Piedmont area of Italy or a Frascati from the Lazio area. With the meat stew you can't go wrong with a medium-bodied red such as a Barbera or a light-bodied red Bardoline



## Carbon Council Elects Mayor Pro Tem, Appoints Member

The Carbon City Council Monday, May 20 elected M. B. Gilbert Mayor Pro Tem, and Shana Davis as a Council member, Place

April, Ken Knowles was elected Mayor in an unopposed

Knowles presided over Monday's meeting. Besides the Mayor, those present were Sylvia Gosnell, City Secretary, and Council members M. B. Gilbert, Ancil King, Dale Truman Walker, Bryant and Shana Davis. Also present was C.

N. Adams, Water Operator, and a number of visitors from the community.

First on the agenda was the reading of last month's minutes, and this prompted a discussion.

Dale Walker voiced opposition to the \$300 per month salary of Larry Greer, who accounts for the City water.

This is a different position from that of

City Secretary. There were several comments as to why the jobs couldn't be combined. Sylvia Gosnell explained about her hours and du-

The Council decided to accept the minutes, on a vote of 3-1.

Turning to the current reports, C. N. Adams said that Carbon now has 208 water meters, with one more going in.

"This is more than we've ever had," he He also reported on

some of the difficulties experienced by the Water Department, mainly due to leaks in the lines. He has been kept busy repairing leaks, and these cost the city plenty in lost water.

Another agenda item concerned the proposed budget for the City and Water Department. Mayor Knowles stated that the budget would not be finalized until the meeting in June, but now was the time to discuss it.

The Council went over various items. The proposed budget for the next fiscal year - beginning July 1 - was:

City of Carbon \$14,692

Again there was discussion on how to cut costs, mainly on water.

(Later one Councilman said that the city was losing about 35 percent of its water from leaks before it even reaches the local meters.)

On a related matter, C. N. Adams said it was cheaper to buy new water meters every five years than to have the old ones tested.

On a budgetary topic, the Council approved signing an agreement with Parker and Gulley, CPA's, to conduct the annual audit.

Toward the end of the meeting Mayor Knowles opened the floor for citizens to express concerns. Most of these focused on deterioration of the town, bad streets and roads, crime, and lack of law enforcement.

Several citizens reported homes broken into and also trespassing, with "nothing done about it."

There were comments on a large party held by high school students, reportedly young people from another town. The Sheriff's Department and DPS came out on this disturbance.

Harold Files told the Council that he would work as a Night Watchman and patrol the streets.

"A deputy sheriff told me: 'We're stressed out, we don't have enough deputies to cover the county," he said.

Homes and stores have been broken into. It's about time to put a

stop to it," Files declared.

One woman added that if anyone broke in on her again they would be shot.

Mayor Knowles said the services of a Night Watchman were badly needed, but there wasn't enough money in the General Fund to pay a salary. He said the City might have to resort to a Volunteer Watch Group.

Knowles said he had been doing a lot of thinking. "When we meet only once per month we never get anything done - and the residents want something done now.

"I wasn't raised here, but this is my home. I am tired of people looking down on the city of Carbon!

"No, I don't know why the Sheriff's Department won't patrol our city more. There are a lot of things people want answers to.

"So I propose we have meetings twice per month.

After some discussion, the council approved a motion by Ancil King to set up the twice a month meetings. One councilman, Dale Walker, opposed the motion, saying there were better ways to reach the same objec-

The Mayor stated that the June council meeting would be held at the regular time, and details of the bi-monthly meetings would be worked out before they were phased in.
