## Trial Full Of 'Firsts' For Eastland County

The trial last week of former Sheriff Ronnie White is still being discussed a lot in this area.

The charge of "Official Oppression" was dropped abruptly last Thursday, together with two other charges.

This trial had a number of unusual features. Chalk up some new 'firsts' for Eastland County!

This is probably the first time in Texas history, according to White's Defense Attorney Gary Lowellen, that a Sheriff has ever been tried for removing a fence from a county road.

Another probable 'first' - the Attorney General's Office sent a prosecutor, John Klassen, who is reportedly a "top gun" for the Department. The Attorney with him, John Neal, described himself as "an observer." He had plenty to observe!

Also, there were two Investigators from the Attorney General's Office, who - with Texas Rangers assisting - conducted the original investigation.

This trial might also have set a record for the number of times the Jury was sent from the Courtroom. It seemed to many spectators that visiting Judge Bill Burdock sent the jury out just when the testimony became most relevant.

The temperature in the annex to 91st District Court might have set a record too, from the wilted appearance of people who had to wait there.

The State's charge of Official Oppression was apparently weak from the start, and began falling apart as witnesses took the stand.

No one expects to ever see another trial like it - and most hope they don't!

Kenneth Parker has resigned from his position as Eastland County Auditor. He sent a letter of resignation to 91st District Court Judge Steven Herod last week, effective Friday, June 28.

Parker, an Eastland CPA, was appointed County Auditor 1 1/2 years ago by Judge Jim Wright, then of the 91st District Court.

At the Commissioners Court meeting Monday Parker brought the new County Auditor with him - Donald Hazelip of Eastland. Hazelip has been appointed by Judge Steven Herod, and his term as Auditor will begin July 1.

Ken Parker says that he is resigning because he has been offered the position of Business Manager of the School District at Gainesville, Texas.

He says he and his wife, Barbara, will continue to make their home in Eastland. Parker states that he will also remain

## Jail Matters, Other Items At Commissioner Court

At the County Commissioners Court Monday discussions were held concerning the jail, law enforcement, and other matters.

Pct. 4 Comm. Reggie Pittman and Sheriff Bob Richardson mentioned the possibility of self-contained modular housing placed next to the jail building. This would help take care of the overpopulation at the jail.

Richardson reported that the State Jail Standards officials had indicated this was an option - but not to make a decision on it yet.

The Sheriff said he thought something like modular housing would come in handy for overcrowded times. The housing would be in self-contained units, with a guard stationed in the housing.

Pct. 1 Comm. Ken Lyerla said it would pay to check on a County near the Texas Department of Corrections (Huntsville) that reportedly will keep prisoners for \$35 per day.

That would be a handy place to keep prisoners who are scheduled for TDC.

"The State quit paying us to keep the 'paper ready' TDC inmates," Richardson reported. "They say they now have space - but they still take their time picking them up."

Pittman said he had been visiting with the District Attorney, and they are going to work on a more detailed reporting system on the jail population.

Now it will be clarified as to why certain prisoners are "awaiting trial."

"This reporting will be more fair to all," Pittman said. "Sometimes prisoners don't want to go to trial - or they are waiting for their lawyers."

On other law enforcement matters, the Commissioners approved the Sheriff advertising to fill a vacancy in his Department.

They tabled an inquiry from Richardson as to the possibility of using Reserve Sheriff's Deputies in the County.

Auditor Ken Parker said they should look at this suggestion carefully - the volunteer Reserves could cause some insurance and vehicle problems.

Also tabled was a request from County Judge Scott Bailey to declare an emergency and appropriate the sum of \$450 to pay for helping return some stolen cattle that are scattered in pastures southwest of Cisco. Some were re-sold - some have wandered around.

Auditor Parker said the matter needed some legal research - that expenditures have to be for the benefit of the County.

The Commissioners approved a request by Sandra Cagle, Tax Assessor/Collector to use the firm of Pritchard and Abbott for tax statements and voter registration forms again this year.

They selected Victor L.

## Texas Heat Threatening Vehicular Victims

The hot weather blistering West Texas will cause thousands of vehicle breakdowns this summer, predicts the local automobile dealers.

Summer breakdowns often occur when worn or poorly maintained parts of a vehicle cannot withstand the added stress of constant heat and heavy driving.

Dealers advise owners to get a preventive check-up for their vehicle before it breaks down. A dealership, for example, will check up to 70 points, including:

**Air Conditioning:** The higher pressure caused by intense heat can cause any of several major problems. Even minor leaks can cause not only a loss of costly coolant—the price of the old R-12 coolant (or Freon) is up more than 1,800 percent since 1994—but also blockages in the system or a compressor lock-up.

**Battery:** Hot starts require more power and

heat degrades batteries faster. On-board computers, phones and other electronics increase the demand for power.

**Cooling system:** Higher pressure during the summer can weaken the system, even damage the engine. Flushing and re-filling the radiator, needed at least every other year, is an inexpensive way to reduce the risk of such major problems as a blown gasket.

While these systems need extra attention for the summer, regular maintenance is equally important. Dealership service managers recommend that the engine oil and filter be changed every 3,000 miles, especially before starting a trip with lots of luggage or a trailer. Fluids and filters should be checked, too, along with the brakes, alternator, fuses and lights.

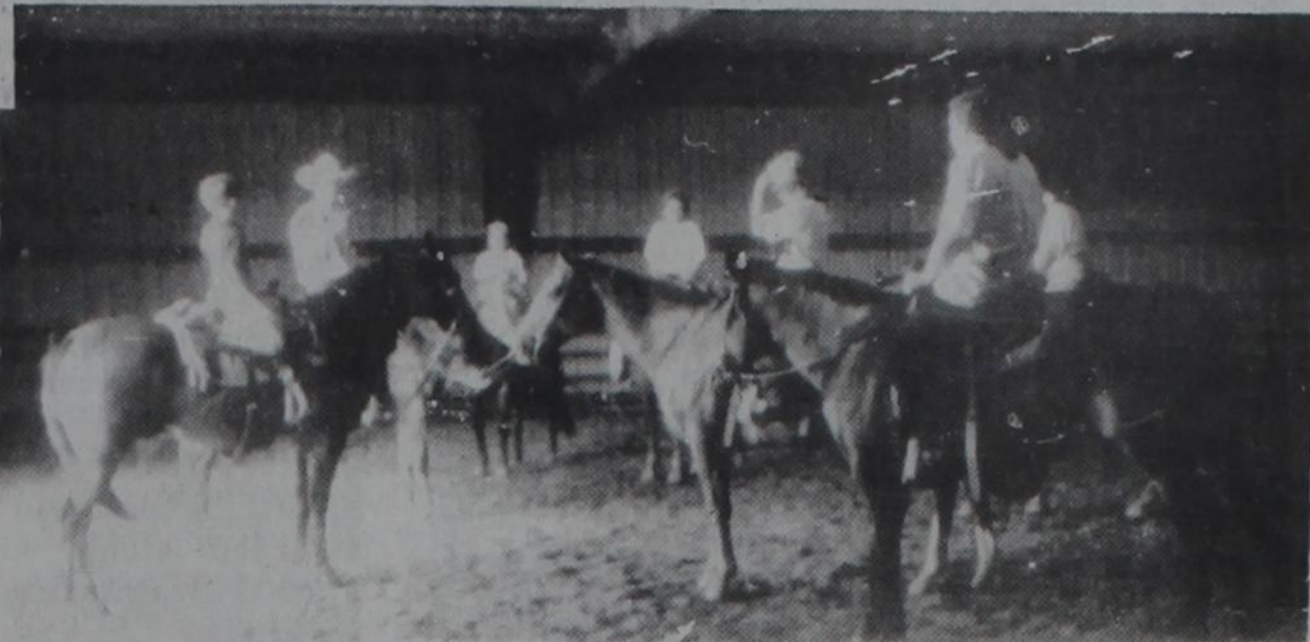
Service managers also recommend replacing worn belts and hoses, which are more likely to

fail in hot weather. The front-end alignment should be checked before a long trip. A tune-up may be especially helpful for an older vehicle and often will improve gas mileage.

When taking a vehicle in for service, owners should be sure to mention any problems or unusual sounds that they have experienced lately, all potential signs of trouble.

A vehicle check-up will be inexpensive but even preventative maintenance of today's computer-equipped vehicles requires high-tech equipment and expertise. Owners should look for a repair facility with certified technicians, advanced diagnostic equipment and experience in the make of vehicle. A franchised dealership, for example, will meet these criteria and have the latest service bulletins from the manufacturer.

In short, a little preventative maintenance now can prevent your vehicle from interrupting summer fun.

Phantom has been handed down from father to son since the 16th century, as has the Phantom's mission of fighting piracy and evil.

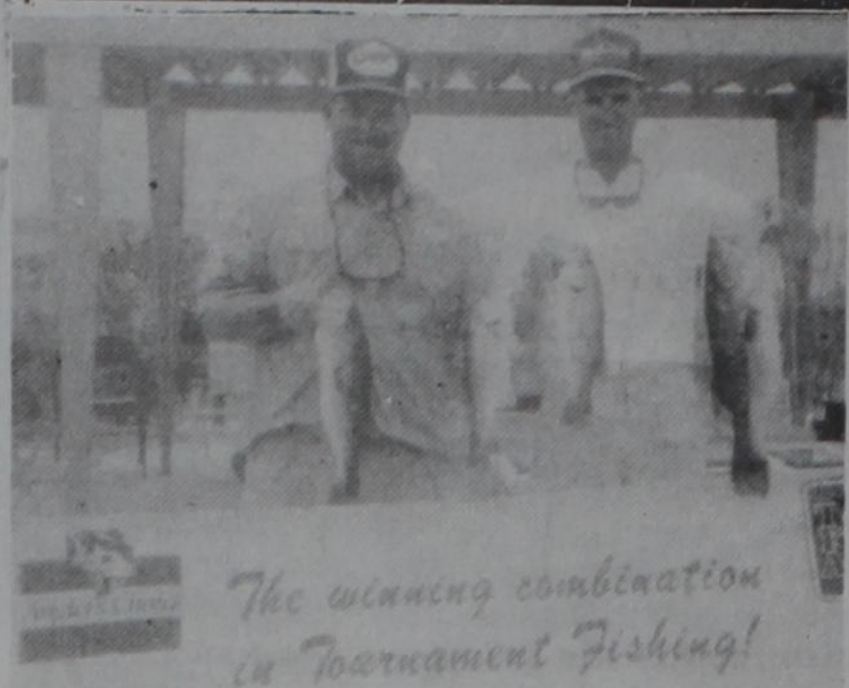
The Phantom character in this film works, due to Billy Zane - who moves around gracefully in his costume.

This is the second in a series of weekly boating safety tips produced by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department as part of its boating safety initiative.

Personal Flotation Device (PFD) is a ten dollar phrase for what most people know simply as a life jacket. Texas law requires a wearable PFD for each person on board regardless of boat length. Those under 13 years of age must wear a PFD while underway.

All PFD's carried on board must be serviceable, readily accessible and of appropriate size for the intended wearer. Never keep any PFD under lock and key. Make certain your passengers always know the location of these important life saving devices.

**Type I PFD (Offshore Lifejacket)**—This device has the greatest required buoyancy and is designed to turn most unconscious persons in the water from a face down position to a vertical and slightly backward position to a vertical and slightly backward position (righting ability). Type I is a good choice if you plan to venture offshore or onto waters where chances of immediate rescue are slight.

**Type II PFD (Near-Shore Lifejacket)**—This is the most common PFD on boats today. This vest is designed to maintain the wearer in a vertical and slightly backward position (righting ability) and is available in a variety of sizes.

**Type III PFD (Flotation Aide)**—This PFD has about the same buoyancy as a Type II PFD but little or no righting ability. These devices are designed specifically for activities such as water skiing, fishing and sailing.

**Type V PFD (Special**

**Use Devices)**—This is the newest PFD device with a minimum of 7 1/2 pounds of buoyancy which can be further inflated to 22 pounds of buoyancy by the water. Should you select this PFD, it is required to be worn at all times while aboard the boat.

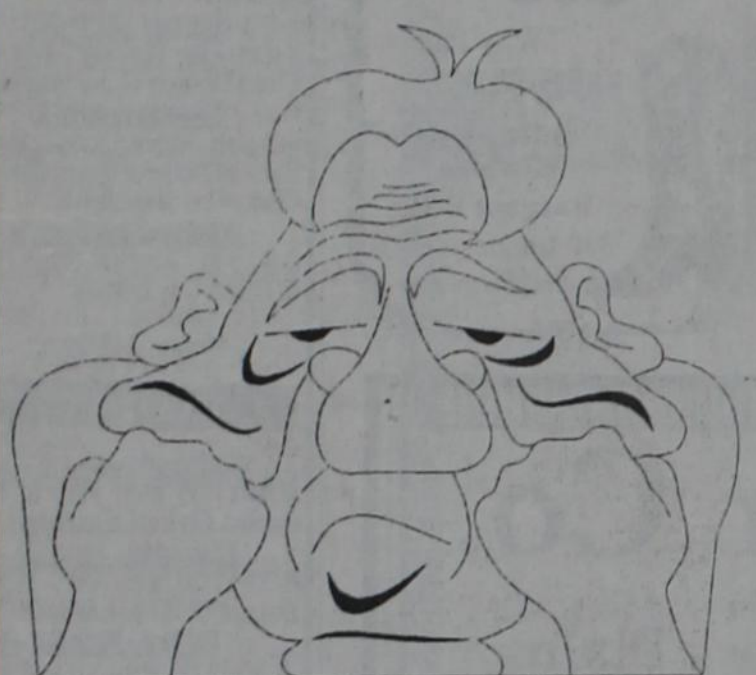

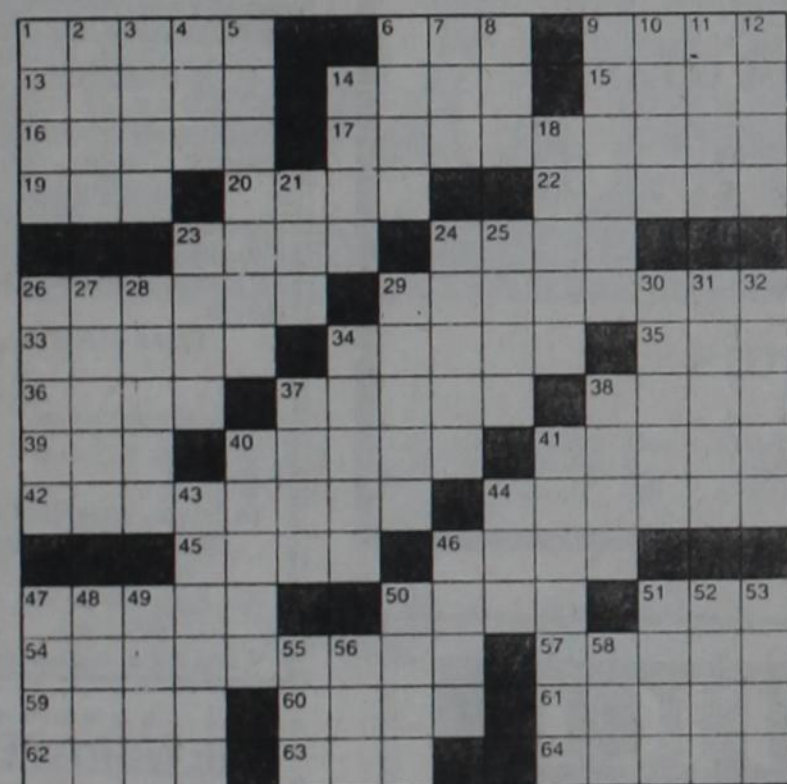

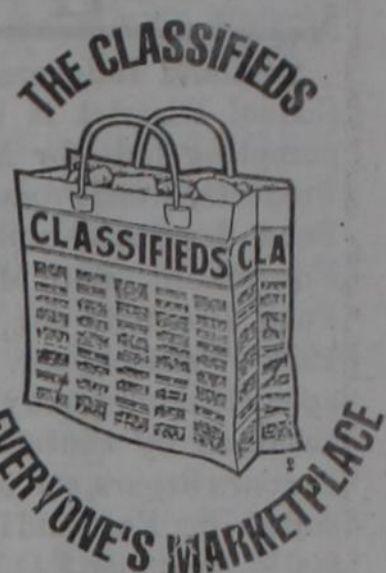
west features to pull at this time. A fast ball team has been secured to play their team game of baseball on that occasion - the ball game alone ought to be worth the trip to the celebration.

**NEW LIFE FOR SILK FLOWERS** - Don't throw away those old silk flowers when they begin to look as if they'd had better days. Just wash in warm, soapy water and let dry. If only greenery and leaves have held their shape well, spray both sides of the leaves with clear glossy spray paint and let dry. A can goes a long way and costs around \$1. If leaves are worn-looking or curled up, you can remove them and iron with medium to high heat. You can use steam or spray with the heat. (Make sure you use a dry cloth to cover the leaves so you won't melt the plastic on the back.) Spray-paint and let dry and put back on stems. If you have flowers, regardless of the color, you can change to whatever color for a new look. The non-glossy paint for flowers works best. Wait until perfectly dry to spray with clear glossy paint.  
Redoing the silk flowers does require some time and work, but it's well worth it in the end. Phyllis C., Tucker, Ariz.

I heard from some of the other parents that she thinks there are too many distractions in school and she can teach her child better at home. I have to admit that I also think my son doesn't get all the attention I think he should and the teacher does have to spend too much time keeping order in the classroom. What do you think of teaching children at home? Margarite K.

Dear Margarite: A parent who wants to teach her child at home must notify the school superintendent, file a lesson plan and cover the standard subject hours. On the average, this lasts only one year. Parents find that it's very difficult to devote the necessary time on the child's lessons. Also, a parent usually knows one way to teach a lesson but sometimes that way won't work. A teacher knows several ways to get the message across to the child.

Even if the parent is a qualified teacher, there is still one very big problem with teaching the child at home and that is that the child doesn't get the chance to interact with other children. They learn from their peers by solving problems together and even playing together. Children learn to take their places in the world by coping with their classmates.

## Snyder Facility To House One Of Seven District Offices Of Texas Boll Weevil Eradication Program

The last of seven district offices in the 19-county Rolling Plains Central Boll Weevil Eradication Zone has been established in Snyder. The former Howard Gray dealership building, 705 25th Street, will serve as a district office, housing storage and office space for approximately 50 full-time and temporary employees and serving as the staging area for boll weevil eradication operations on approximately 100,000 acres of cotton, said Frank Myers, executive director of the Texas Boll Weevil Eradication Foundation, Inc. "The outstanding cooperation of the community and the local development corporations makes it possible to save growers money by spending funds on eradication of the boll weevil instead of administrative costs," Myers said. "For the program to run efficiently, district offices are located in closest proximity to the majority of cotton acreage in an area, he said. Also, whenever possible, the program hires personnel and purchases supplies locally. "Historically, boll weevil eradication offers a 12-to-1 return on an investment," Myers said. "For every dollar spent on eradication, \$12 are returned to the local economy." Ricky Watzl is the supervisor in this district that encompasses all or portions of Scurry, Borden, Mitchell and Fisher counties. The zone headquarters, responsible for the management of operations in the zone, is located in Stamford.

### Banana Breakfast Yogurt (for four)

- 2 1/4 cups sliced bananas (about 3 medium-size ripe bananas cut into 1/4" slices—save 4 slices to use later)
- One 16-ounce container unflavored low-fat yogurt
- 2 tablespoons honey
- 1/4 cup dark raisins and granola cereal

Put banana slices, yogurt, honey, granola and raisins in a medium-size bowl. Stir to mix well. Divide mixture among 4 bowls. Sprinkle each with extra granola and raisins and top with a banana slice. Serve immediately.

### Banana-Chocolate Chip Ice Milk (for six)

- 1 cup mashed bananas (about two medium-size)
- 1/2 cup miniature chocolate chips
- 1 quart vanilla ice milk, softened

In medium-size bowl, using rubber spatula, fold bananas and chocolate chips into ice milk until just blended. Spread mixture in 8" square metal baking pan. Freeze 3 to 4 hours until firm. Fifteen minutes before serving, remove ice milk from freezer to soften slightly before cutting into squares.

### Banana-Pudding Pie (for eight)

- 30 vanilla wafer cookies
- Two 3 1/2-ounce packages instant vanilla pudding and pie filling
- 3 cups skim milk
- 2 medium-size ripe bananas, cut in 1/4" slices
- Lemon juice concentrate
- One cup non-dairy frozen whipped topping

Make pudding as directed on package with 3 cups skim milk. Sprinkle banana slices with lemon juice. This will prevent them from turning brown. Alternate layers of wafers and pudding in a 9" pie plate. Spread whipped topping over last layer. Refrigerate several hours until firm.

- Upon reaching the end of the course, the blindfolded player and guide exchange roles and head back toward the starting point. The first team back wins!

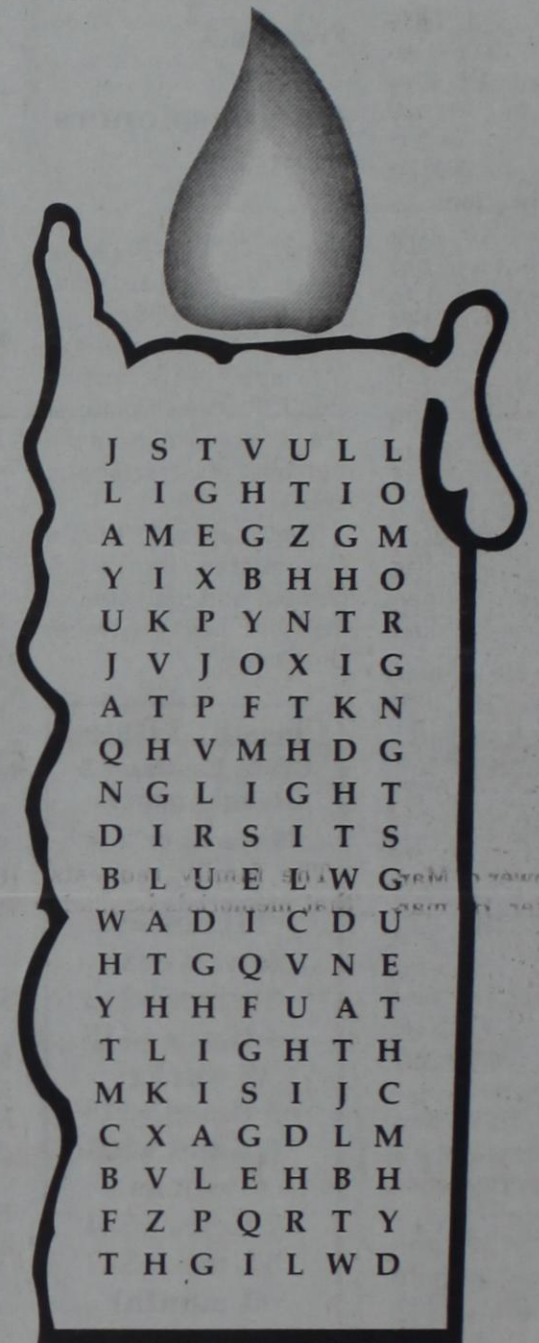

## Dairy Queen's Amanda Oliver Wins Regional Frozen Dessert Competition



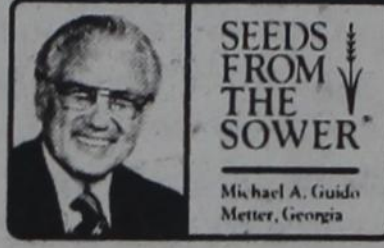

### RECIPE VEGETABLE MEDLEY

- 1 head cauliflower
- 1/2 cup broccoli
- 1 onion
- 1/2 grated Velveeta cheese

Add 1 cup cream of mushroom soup salt and pepper to taste

Cover and cook in microwave for 10 minutes stirring at the 5 minute point. Top with grated cheese and cook uncovered until cheese melts.

### STUFFED ZUCCHINI

- 6 medium zucchini
- 1/2 pound Italian cheese
- 1 small diced onion
- 1 clove garlic, crushed
- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese

1/4 pound mozzarella cheese, shredded

1/3 cup packaged Italian bread crumbs

Cook zucchini in boiling salt water, for 10 minutes. Drain. Scoop out the inside. Leave 1/4 inch shell. Mash insides; drain well. Put shells in a baking dish. Break up sausage. Cook in same skillet for 5 minutes. Add onion, garlic; saute until tender, 3 minutes. Stir in mashed zucchini and bread crumbs. Spoon into shell, sprinkle with cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for

30 minutes. Serve piping-hot. Also can be used for tomatoes or eggplant.

## New Law Affects Social Security Benefits For Stepchildren

Beginning July 1, 1996, a stepchild can receive Social Security benefits on a stepparent's earnings record only if the child depends on the stepparent for at least one-half of his or her financial support. This dependency requirement is the result of a law enacted on March 29.

The new law also requires that the stepchild's benefits end if the stepparent becomes divorced after June 30, 1996. The child's benefits terminate in the month following the month the divorce becomes final.

The divorce must be reported to Social Security as soon as it becomes final. Each year, the Social Security Administration will notify stepparents who have a child (or children) receiving benefits on their record to remind them that benefits will be terminated in case of divorce.

If you need to report your divorce, call or visit any Social Security office, or call the toll-free number 1-800-772-1213 between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on business days. The lines are busiest early in the week and early in the month, so it's best to call at other times.
