Michael has been a member of the Friona 4-H Club ten years. His

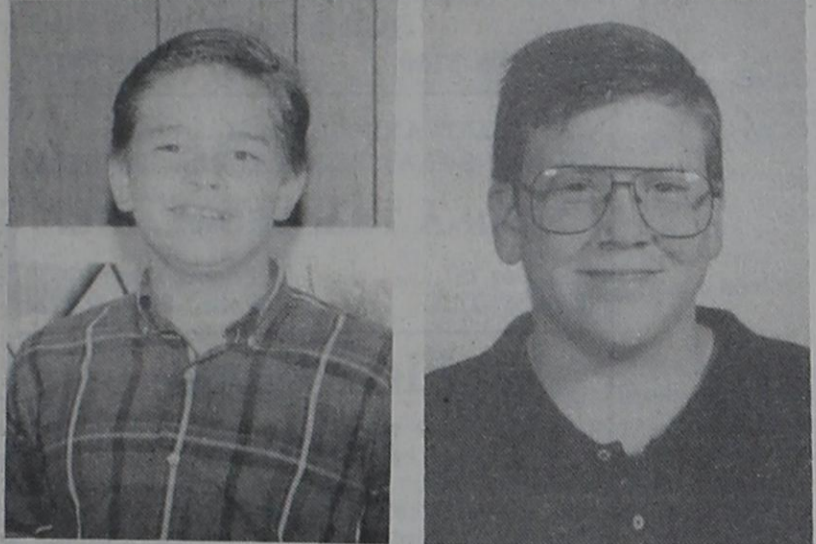
main interests have been in the horse, veterinary science and leadership projects.

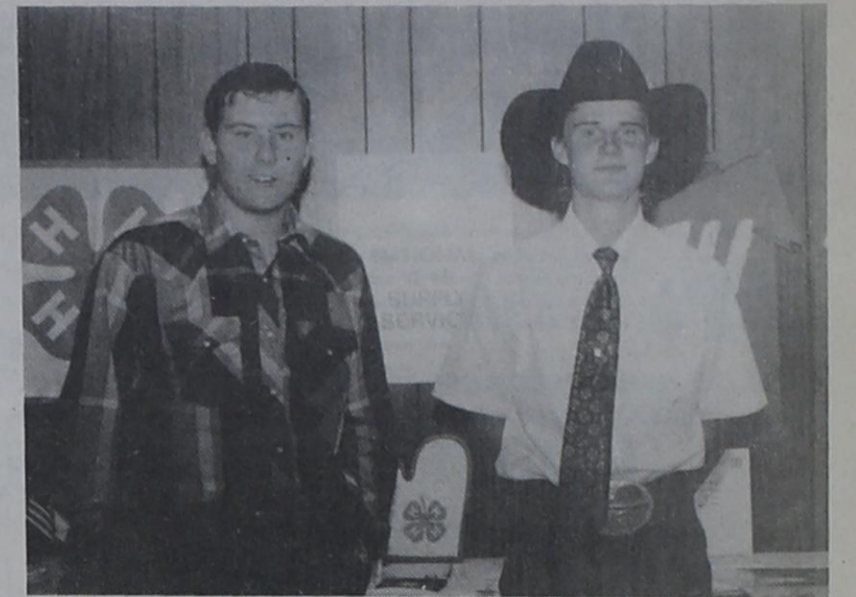

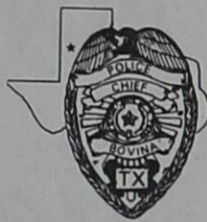

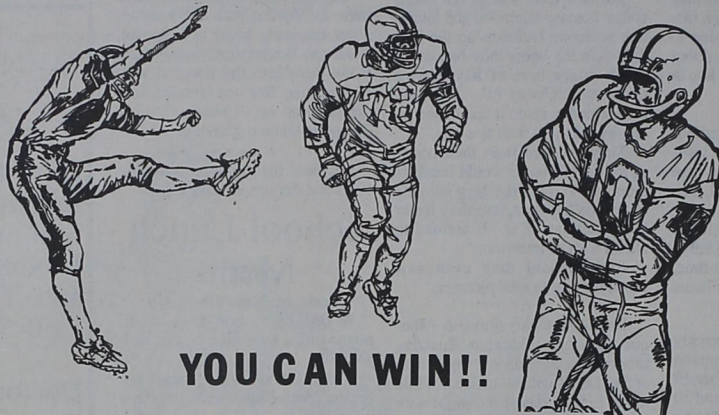
