FIRE RATE MUDDLE IS CAUSE ON THURSDAY NIGHT, JUNE 23 HE HAS GOT A WAY AROUND

Governor Explains Benevolent Dispo- Big List of Attractions, Good Music Plan Is to Have Convention Adopt Constitution and Add Prohibition Amendments, then Submit It to the People.

Texas, by virtue of authority vested in me by the constitution, do hereby call a special session of the Thirtyfirst Legislature to convene in the city of Austin, Texas, beginning at 2 o'clock p. m. Tuesday, July 19,

> the law enacted by the Thirty-first First. To enact a law repealing Legislature at its first called session, known as chapter 18 and entitled "An act providing conditions upon which fire insurance companies shall transact business in this State, and which fire insurance companies shall providing for the regulation and control of rates of premium on fire insurance, and to prevent discrimination therein, and to create a fire insurance rating board, and to provide penalties for violations of this act, and declaring an emergency."

Second. To enact adequate laws preventing discrimination by fire insurance companies, to prevent combinations between such companies to destroy competition in fire insurance rates in Texas and to provide penal ties therefor, and to provide means for the enforcement of such laws.

Third. To consider and act upon such other matters as may hereafter be presented by me, pursuant to section 10, article 3 of the constitution of the State of Texas.

AUSTIN, Tex., June 15 .- Paradoxically speaking the expected and the unexpected happened today when the Governor issued a proclamation convening the Legislature in special session July 19. A special session had been forecast, but the call came as a cloud out of a clear sky and Austin is once more in the throes of a sensation. The news spread live wildfire and groups of men are discussing the political phase of it to-

The county, making it a very representa- ference between amending the Constitution and an amended Constitution, and that it required only a majority vote of a regular or special session to provide for an amended Constitution and not the two-thirds vote of a regular session to submit a constitutional amendment.

If it shall be evident from the primaries which are to occur just four days after the session convenes, that the personnel of the Legislature precludes submission of the prohibition constitutional amendment, then the Sale of work at the Presbyterian Governor is almost sure to play his trump card, and that is to send a message to the special session for them to consider the matter of calling a constitutional convention. Such a convention can be convoked by a special session on a majority vote, which the submissionists have had and will have in the next session. The Governor's idea it is known now, is to have the convention quickly and perfunctorily adopt the present Constitution of Texas with the prohibition amendments added and then submit it to the people for adoption. 
