COLOGNE, Germany, Via London une 8-Chances that Bulgaria and Belgrade dispatch to the Cologne Gaz-

"The political heavens of the Baikans have cleared somewhat," the dispatch says "Rhoumania has rejected the first offer of the triple entente (Great Britain France and Russia) as unsatisfactory.

"Bulgaria has also received offers from the entente. It is not known that Bulgaria has formally rejected them, but she is in an agreement with Roumania, and since the latter has rejected the offers, Bulgaria will probably do likewise.

"This assumption is the more reasonable because Bulgaria's first demand is immediate occupation by her of the acedonian territory taken from her by Serbia. The entente has not vet offered that. Bulgaria is naturally not disinterested in the Turkish frontier, but Bulgarian statesmen are keenly conscious that the opportunity regarding Matedonia is one which will come now or never.


