THE ELECTION LAW.

The following are all the material provisions of the Election law passed by the last Legislature and now in force:

That hereafter it SECTION 1. shall be lawful for any political convention held in this territory or any county thereof for the purpose of nominating candidates to be voted for at any election held in this territory or any county thereof, to adopt by resolution some mark or designating device to be printed on the face of and at the head of the ticket or ballot, containing the names of the candidates for office nominated by such convention, and when such mark or designating device shall have been adopted by any such convention, and an imprint of such ticket or ballot containing such mark or designating device so adopted, and the name or names of the candidate or candidates nominated by such convention, and certified to by the presiding officer of such convention and the secretary thereof, shall have been filed with the probate clerk of the county in which be unlawful for any other political convention, person or persons in such county to adopt or use any such mark or designating device for election purposes or to cause the same to be placed or printed on any ticket or ballot to be voted at any such election, without having printed in such ticket or ballot all of the names of the candidates nominated by the political convention for any person or persons whatsonames of the candidate or candi- ticket. dates nominated by the political nothing in this section shall be with any felse designation or havconstrued to prohibit any person ing any false heading printed from erasing or changing in writ- thereon, or any other ballot or ing any name on any such ticket ticket calculated or intended to or ballot voted by any such person; deceive or mislead any voter. and further provided, that this act SEC. 3. Interpreter.

SEC. 2. That hereafter all tickets or ballots used at any general alection held in this territory, shall be printed on plain white paper, three inches in width and eight inches in length, or within one quarter of an inch of that size. No such ticket or ballot shall have any mark or designating device on the back so that its character may be known when folded. The lawyer, the banker, the merchant, the slockman, the trader, the editor, the contractor the railroader, the laborer—all as-sembled in answer to the demo-cratic call, and each seemed to be the head and front of his profession or occupation. No one could gaze upon the assemblage or listen to their deliberations and not be convinced that the best of New Mexico's citizenship had assembled to deliberate upon affairs concerning her welfare.

The following is the platformthese resolutions read carefully:

We, the Democratic party of the Territory of New Mexico, in convention assembled, reaffirm our allegiance to the time-honored principles of the National Democratic party as enunciat-ed in the platform adopted at St. Louis in 1858,

We demand the free coinage of silver.

We demand the free coinage of silver. We arraign the National Republican par ty for squandering the surplus revenues in the treasury in order to luraish a pretext for in-creasing tariff taxation on the necessaries of life --for depriving Democratic constituencies of their representatives inCongress (and arbitrarily seating republican candidates who were not elected by the people -for adoptingan arbit r ry and unconstational system of rules in the House of Representatives and thereby suppressing the rights of the minority--and for attempting to of Representatives and thereby suppressing the rights of the minority—and for attempting to pass the Lodge election bill to suppress free elections and subvert the rights of the states, in utter disregard of the Constitution of the U-nited States—and practically for having award-ed seats in the Senate of the United States to two Senators from the state of Montana, who were not lawfully elected thereto.

As heretofore, we reiterate, that the General As heretolore, we reiterate, that the deletal Government has been and still is, heedleas of the rights of New Mexico and its ohligations un-der the treaty of Guadaloupe Hidalgo in fail-ing and fetusing to pass such a law as will se-cure the prompt and speedy settlement of land titles in New Mexico titles in New Mexico.

We declare that the natsye population of New
