ed by the Frisco officials, the Mason committee was not in a position to sign, for while they have met all other conditions, the notes given the committee by the signers of the bonus have all been made payable on January 1st, 1913, which was the time originally named by the Frisco for reaching Mason. The committee now has the task of securing an extension of all these notes until June 30, 1913. While it is reasonably certain that the extension will be made, yet the committee stated that the contract is optional with the Frisco officials. They set no time to begin work, and they gave no positive assurance that they would build the road. However, they stated that the chances were 100 to 1 that they would build when the Mason people came up with the contract. It is estimated that it will take just about a year to complete the extension, which gives a year's grace for the beginning or completing of the
