Declaring that an emergency exists, and that it is imperative that a thorough clean up be had in Brady, City Health Officer Dr. J. B. Granville has issued a statement urging upon every citizen the importance and necessity of observing the request to place every home and property in the most sanitary condition. The following is the statement given out by Dr. Granville, which has the endorsement of the Brady Civic League and the Health department.




