Destroys Shed of Mrs. J. A. Snider Saturday Afternoon.

Fire at 3:30 o'clock Saturday afternoon destroyed the buggy shed on the property of Mrs. J. A Snider in the southwestern part of town.

The shed was already a mass of flames when the alarm was turned in, and nothing could be done except to prevent the flames from communicating to neighboring dwellings. The fire boys made their usual good time in getting to the scene, laying a line of hose from the Richards corner as far as the hose would run, but were unable to get within reach of the fire.

The origin of the blaze is unknown. Besides the shed, a buggy belonging to Willie Hurd was destroyed, and Bill Snider lost a saddle and harness, the total damage being estimated at \$225, with no insurance.

ORGANIZE SCHOOL CLUBS.

Home Gardening to Be Featured By Pupils.

Probably the most noteworthy result of the work last week by Messrs. R. B. Elmore and Paul Wipprecht was the organization of Home Gardening and kindred clubs in the Brady and Rochelle schools. The report of these gentlemen is as follows:

High School-Number enrolled in club work, 67. Some of these signed up for more than one form of activity, as follows: Home Gardening, 67; Hogs, 5; Cowpeas, 1.

Central School-Number enrolled, 138. Home Gardening, 120; Corn, 55; Peanuts, 55; Cowpeas, 32; Beef, 17; Hogs, 32; Poultry, 27.

Rochelle School-Number enrolled, 67. Home Gardens, 33; Corn, 4; Peanuts, 8; Cowpeas, 3; Beef, 4; Hogs, 7; Poultry, 6.

The national average of contestants who "stick" was given as 60%, so that if this ratio is maintained in Brady, it is estimated that it will mean the creation of new wealth amounting to \$1800, to say nothing of the practical instruction received and of the permanent effects.

Next year a delegate will be elected from among the boys and girls to attend the state farmers institute, with free transportation, and expenses paid. Supt. Hughes of the Brady public school has also volunteered a cash prize of \$10.00 to the boy or girl in the high school raising the best garden.

All of the contestants have been urged to enter all prize clubs and to send a boys and girls' exhibit to the 1916 Dallas fair. Also the bankers and merchants of the towns are urged to co-operate and encourage the contestants in their efforts, and to get in touch with them by way of personal encouragement. By these means it is certain that good results may be had.

In addition to the foregoing, over 4,000 pieces of literature have been distributed, the same touching upon such subjects as the teeth, tonsils, adenoids, flies and filth, careful handling of milk, typhoid germs, fake consumption cures, hogs, corn, abc of truck growing, baby beef club work, peanuts, etc.

Mr. Elmore, who is industrial commissioner of the Texas Immigration bureau, promised publicity concerning Brady and this entire community, together with the work undertaken in the magazine "Truth About Texas," the official journal of that organization, also in the Industrial Record of Dallas, Manufacturers Record of Baltimore, The Tradesman of Atlanta, and Town Development of New York City, thus advertising Brady and McCulloch county to at least several million people over the Union.

There has been much comment upon the work of these gentlemen, and Mr. Wipprecht has promised to return in the spring, when a general county campaign will be undertaken. Mr. Wipprecht, who represents the State Agricultural department, was very favorably impressed with the Brady country, and it is thought that great work will be accomplished in the general campaign.

Both gentlemen left Saturday, Mr. Elmore going to Dallas from where he will make a trip to points in East Texas. Mr. Wipprecht is at San Angelo representing the State Agricultural department during the fair.
