METEOR MAKES SURPRISE VISIT HERE MON. NIGHT

Brady and McCulloch county citizens witnessed an unusual and wonderful spectacle Monday night about 10:30 o'clock, when a brilliant meteor flashed across the firmament, and for a few seconds lit up the earth almost bright as day. The phenomenon was witnessed by many Brady folks, numbers of whom were returning home from the show, while others had not yet retired.

So brilliant was the glare of the meteor that electric lights were totally eclipsed, and while the night was partially moon-lit, yet the briliance of the visitor was undiminished.

The meteor followed a course from the northeast to the southwest, and within a minute or so after being seen here there was a dull roar or rumbling, indicating that it had struck the earth or had exploded. No trace of it has been reported to date, how-


