If you want to buy sugar nowa-days, you'll have to content yourself with just 50c worth, or, as sugar sells for 10c a pound, just five pounds at a time. The lid is on unrestricted sales, and five pounds at a time are deemed sufficient for actual and immediate needs. If you live farther from Brady than one mile, you can buy one additional pound for each mile you live from here, or from the point at which you do your trading.


