J. M. CARROLL RECEIVES GOV'T TRUCK FOR PRE. 3

McCulloch county has been allotted another government army truck, the request of Commissioner J. M. Carroll for a 2-ton truck having received favorable consideration. County Judge Evans Adkins received notice to this effect, and last week went to Austin to receive the truck. The truck was driven through to Brady, arriving here in good shape Monday.
This makes four army trucks that have been allotted to McCulloch county, giving each commissioner one. The first three received were three-ton trucks, and were awarded Commissioners Bryson, McBride and Burns. They have been in service ever since received several months ago and have been demonstrated to be of greatest value in road-building and improvement work.

**LEGAL DEPARTMENT
SAYS COTTON PRICE
FIXING IS ILLEGAL**

Austin, Sept. 4.—The attorney general's department today declined an invitation to participate in a meeting at Dallas of cotton seed oil mill interests and cotton growers, who propose to determine a fair price for cotton seed. W. A. Keeling, acting attorney general, wired that he declined to send a representative to the meeting because any agreement between growers and crushers, or crushers and crushers, towards fixing a price for cotton seed, would constitute a violation of Texas anti-trust laws.

Death of Mrs. Dave Bratton.

The death of Mrs. Dave Bratton, which occurred Sunday morning at 6:00 o'clock, removed one of the oldest and best-beloved citizens of the McCulloch county. Death occurred at her home three miles northeast of Rochelle, where she had lived the past fifteen years, and followed an illness of only about a week. A couple years ago, Mrs. Bratton sustained an accident, which left her crippled and in delicate health. About a week ago, she developed a severe cold, and her frail body together with her advanced years, was unable to withstand the shock. At the time of death she was 70 years of age.

Mrs. Bratton, with her husband, was numbered among the early settlers in this section, having for a long number of years made their home in the Fredonia community. About fifteen years ago, they removed to the Rochelle community, where, a couple years later, the husband passed away. Mrs. Bratton was a good, Christian woman, and a faithful member of the Missionary Baptist church.

Funeral services were held Monday evening at the Rochelle Baptist church, Rev. Richardson conducting, and the body was laid to rest in Rochelle cemetery beside that of her departed husband. A great concourse of sorrowing relatives and friends assembled to pay last tribute to the memory of the departed.

Five sons and four daughters were left to mourn the departure of their mother, and to them is extended the heartfelt sympathy of all.
