

All agree that Texas needs more houses more than she needs anything. Not only the towns and villages but the farms are short on houses.

It seems that governments are taking on new functions at a rapid rate. and in view of this fact would be well for the people of Texas to go before the next Legislature with a proposal to exempt all residences built during the next five years, costing less than \$6,000, from taxes for a period of ten

This concession would induce many men to make valuable vacant lets by erecting rent houses thereen.

When a man takes a few dellars from the natural resources in the way of brick, mortar, lumber and lime and by adding to these intelligent labor and thereby turns out a thing of vastly more worth to the community than it was when he began, it does seem that it is a mean sort of condition that would tax him more heavily for this effort than the man who does not add values.

It is time that we add a premium to the efforts of builders instead of demanding a fine or forfeiture of his creation.
