### **BRADY COMPRESS BURNS EARLY THIS** MORNING, ENTAILING \$100,000 LOSS

COTTON BUYERS AND FIRMS LOSE 750 BALES COTTON-COMPRESS HAS \$15,000-\$20,000 SUPPLIES DES-TROYED-ERECTED IN 1907, COST \$65,000.

Brady early this morning suffered a disastrous loss in the complete destruction of the Brady Compress, together with between \$15,000 and \$20,000 worth of supplies and also about 750 bales of cotton belonging to local buyers or firms represented by them. The total loss will run well over \$100,000. The origin of the fire is a mystery, Nightwatchman George W. White having made his rounds only fifteen minutes before the flames suddenly burst out, and leaped across the platform with such rapidity that the plant was doomed almost before the alarm could be sounded.
