She would just as soon appear without her make-up as with a button missing, or a veil torn, or a pocketbook bulged out of shape, or a bit of lace that wasn't as frothy and speckless as lace should always be. Frequently she blends her own perfume by mixing several odors, experimenting till she has something that completely satisfies her. The recipe is her own secret, and pleases her much better than the fabulously expensive things that merely money can buy-and anyone may use- or over-use. <br> Coiffures and Hats. <br> We can't stop to talk about coiffures, other than to say that the very smartest thing today is the acme of simplicity-the hair drawn back smoothly and coiled low. But if one's | Your corset will look better and wear better if you put it on correctly. When you buy your corset it will be put on right, for you've had expert fingers at the laces. But what about tomorrow morning? Nine out of ten women never know how well they could look because they persist in wearing their corsets too highDid you know that? <br> Now here's the trick: Before you put your corset on, pull the laces out so that there's a five or six-inch opening down the center. Then place the corset round you loosely, low enough down and absolutely straight -run your finger along the middle bone of the back to see tha it follows your spine. Now begin fastening at the next to the bottom clasp and fasten to the top, then do the bottom clasp and the hooks. Adjust the garters, beginning at the back. Last of all, pull the laces at .the waistline to set the corset to the figure, then begin tightening at the bottom of the front clasp, lacing toward the waistline with a firm pull. <br> Perhaps this sounds complicated, but it isn't. And-if you've never done it in just this way-you'll be amazed at the comfortable, anchored sort of feeling your corset will have. It can't creep up and bind your waist or make an ugly line in the front.
