FIX DATE OF WEST TEXAS C OF C MEET FOR MAY 13-15, '24

Mr. F. W. Greber, vice president and director of the West Texas Chamber of Commerce, returned Sunday morning from Sweetwater where a meeting of the board of directors of that organization was held Saturday. Mr. Greber reports that a very interesting meeting was held in which many matters of interest and importance to West Texas were discussed and passed upon.

One of the things decided that is of interest, particularly to many Brownwood people, was the matter of setting the dates for the 1924 convention of the West Texas Chamber of Commerce, which was voted at the recent meeting at San Angelo to be held in Brownwood next year. The board of directors at Sweetwater, acting on the suggestion of representatives from Brownwood, agreed on the dates, which will be Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, May 13, 14 and 15, 1924,

On the opening of the meeting and when the Brownwood delegates offered the suggestion as to the dates of the convention here, they also intimated to the directors, it is learned, that Brownwood might have a new \$100,000 municipal auditorium in which to house the convention when it came here.-Brownwood News.
