Successful Week for Blizzards Athletics

Whoever said that spring was one of the slower seasons of the year obviously had not experienced the kind of success that the Blizzards have had recently.

More often than not spring sports do not receive the fanfare nor the attention that football and basketball receive. Whether it be for the lack of popularity or excitement is not known, but it cannot be for the lack of success.

Both the men's and the women's golf teams took first place in district in Abilene on Monday. Mary Mostad placed second overall for the women and Russell Parramore placed third for the men.

Success has not only visited the golf team, it stopped by the tennis team as well. Jennifer Boles and Jamie Sims won first place doubles for the district in Abilene last week with wins over Jim Ned and Rotan.

Even the track teams have gotten involved in the act. Coach Jeff Butts of the varsity boys states, "We've done well considering how many we lost to baseball. Chane [Reagan] is sitting on second place [in the 800M run] in the district right now and has a good shot at regionals."

"Rabbit" Smith has her sights set on state competition in Austin, as her 46.54 run earlier this year in the 300M hurdles is still

the best in the area. The district track meet will be held Friday, April 16 in Haskell.

The baseball team got their first district win of the season last Tuesday night against Hawley. The 8-6 come from behind win was a big one for Coach Biff White and the team.

Coach White states, "We really didn't play that well but we scraped out a win. This is really a confidence booster for the team."

The biggest surprise this season has been the softball team. Not only are they undefeated, but by averaging more than 28 runs a game, they have punished opposing pitchers. With three games left in the season, the Lady Blizzards have already assured themselves a playoff spot.

Coach Beth Wortham notes that although the team is undefeated, this season has caused some headaches. "With only four teams in the district, there is a lot of down time. We went a week and a half without a game. It's hard to keep the girls focused with so much time between games."

Coach Wortham would like to finish the season undefeated. She adds "It would give us a solid foundation for the future."

If this is the foundation for all of the spring sports, then the future is very bright. Break out those shades, Winters!

City Council discusses 911, animal control

The Winters City Council met in regular session on Monday, April 12.

Both the 9-1-1 dispatching agreement and Steven Ballard's Airport lease were tabled until further information could be acquired.

Discussion about the animal control ordinance centered around chickens within the city limits. A motion was made and seconded to leave the ordinance as is. The motion carried unanimously.

The question of using the City farm for impounded vehicles was tabled for research into other options.

Lakekeeper David Carroll was given a raise of \$25 per month with his contract to expire on September 30, 1993, which coincides with the end of the City's fiscal year.

All bills to be paid were approved with the exception of the 9-1-1 dispatching bill which will be paid when the contract with the City of Ballinger is signed.

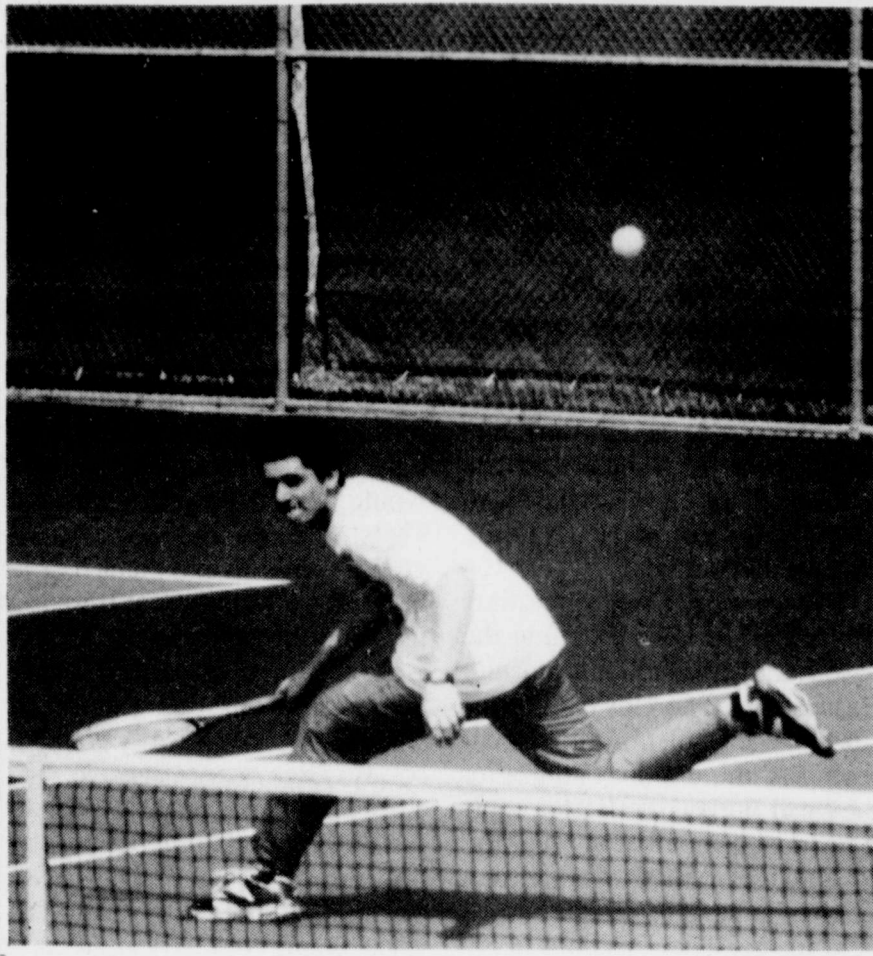

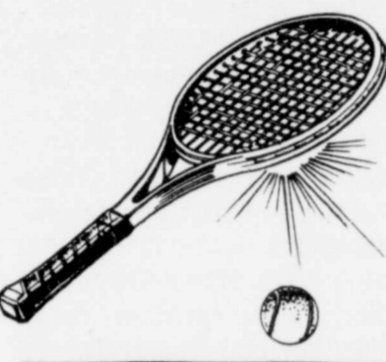

Winters Elementary School Kindergarten Round-Up

Pre-registration for 1993-1994 Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten students has been scheduled for Thursday, April 22, 1993, at 7:00 p.m. in the Elementary Library. Parents of children who will be four (4) years old for Pre-K or five (5) years old for Kindergarten, on or before September 1, 1993, should bring Birth Certificates (hospital or church records), immunization records, and Social Security cards. Those students not enrolled in Kindergarten and who will be six on or before September 1, 1993, should also register for the first grade.

PRE-KINDERGARTEN - A four year old child shall be eligible for Pre- Kindergarten if he/she is unable to comprehend the English language or is from a family whose income is at or below subsistence level. Pre-Kindergarten classes shall be offered for (1/2) one-half day.

It is VERY IMPORTANT that all students should be pre-registered. The school needs to determine the number of Pre-Kindergarten, Kindergarten, and First Grade teachers that will be needed for the 1993-1994 school year.

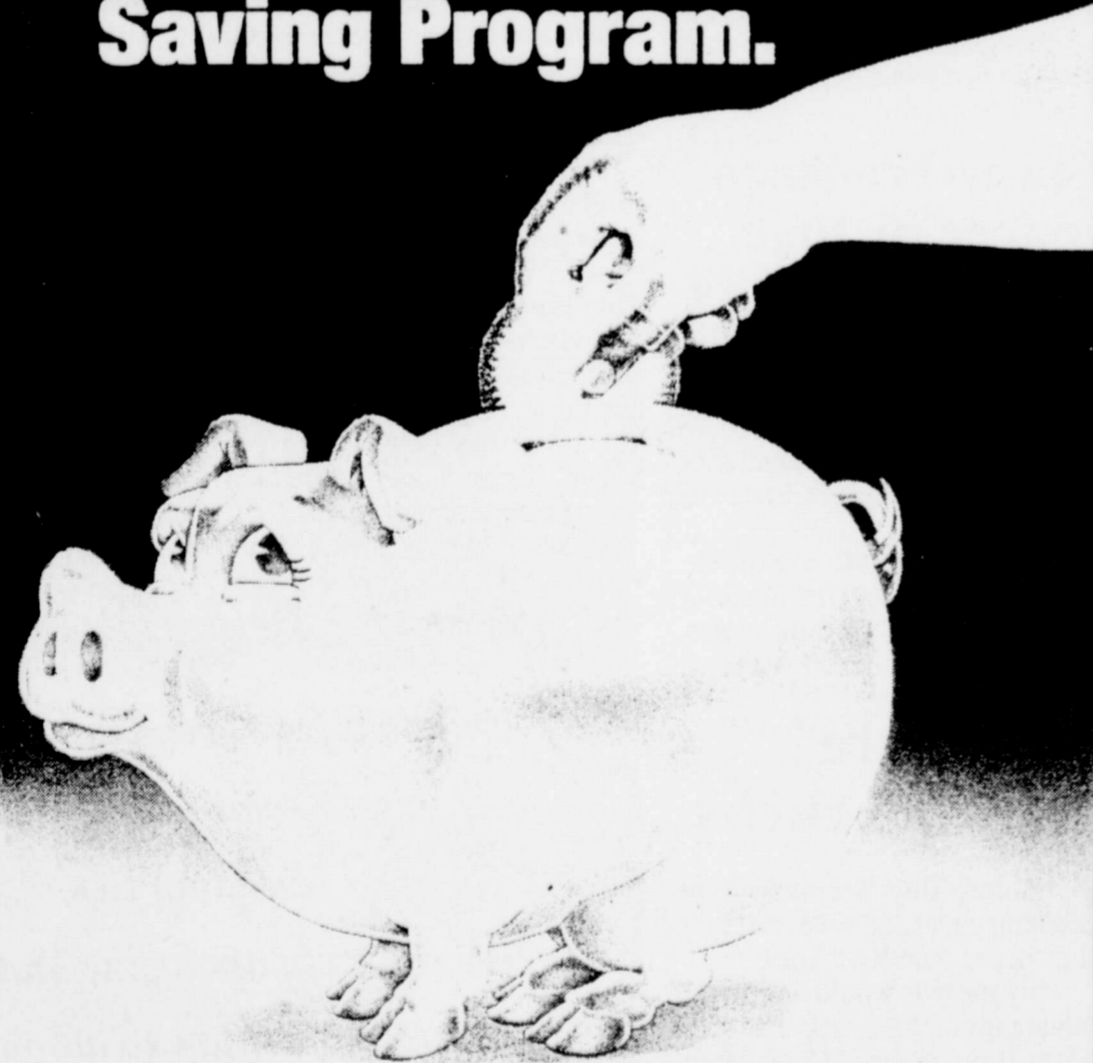

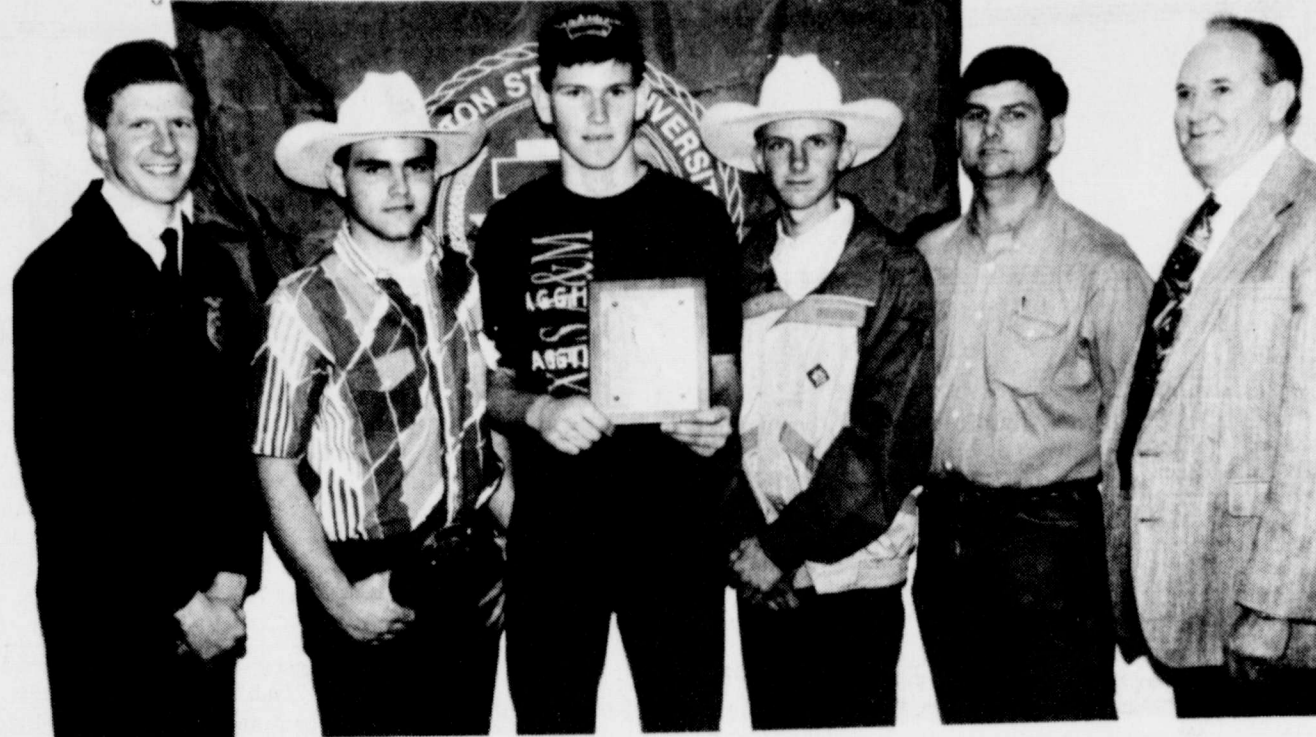
