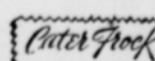

**NOTICE OF ELECTION**

Callahan County Water Control Improvement District No. 1:  
The Resident, Qualified Electors of Callahan County Water Control and Improvement District No. 1 Who Own Taxable Property in Said District and Who Have Duly Rendered the Tax For Taxation:  
TAKE NOTICE that an election will be held in the District the 16th day of April, 1949, the proposition and at the election order adopted by the Board of Directors on the 11th day of March, 1949, which substantially as follows:  
**RESOLUTION**  
By the Board of Directors of Callahan County Water Control Improvement District No. 1 to issue an election on the question of the issuance of \$200,000.00 of improvement bonds, payable from the levy of ad valorem taxes adequate to provide for the payment.  
WHEREAS, said district has adopted a plan for improvements

designed to furnish a water system; and  
WHEREAS, the plan for improvements thus adopted were prepared for the district by Engineers duly employed for such purpose, such Engineers' report being substantially as follows:  
**ESTIMATED COST OF WATER SYSTEM**  
2,000 Acre Feet Reservoir Embankment ..... \$63,350.00  
Core Trench ..... 4,500.00  
Spillway Excavation ..... 1,960.00  
Common ..... 28,000.00  
Rock .....  
Dumped Rip Rap (from Spillway) ..... 10,000.00  
Rip Rap Blanket ..... 5,600.00  
Training Wall ..... 4,450.00  
Service Spillway ..... 25,000.00  
Sodding ..... 1,000.00  
Embankment Drains ..... 450.00  
Preparation of Site ..... 1,000.00  
Clearing ..... 1,400.00  
Contingencies ..... 14,670.00  
Engineering ..... 10,490.00  
Land ..... 16,000.00  
Land Surveying ..... 1,000.00  
Total Estimated Cost \$188,870.00; and  
WHEREAS, the Board of Directors estimates that the additional sum of \$11,130.00 will be needed to pay the cost of operation of the District, incidental expenses, cost of investigation and making plans, Engineers' work and other incidental expenses, Engineers' fees, cost of issuing bonds, cost of operating district prior to completion of the system and one year's interest during construction; and  
WHEREAS, the foregoing estimated cost aggregates \$200,000.00; and  
WHEREAS, the Board of Directors deems it advisable to issue the bonds of said district for the purposes hereinabove mentioned;  
THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF CALLAHAN COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 1:  
1. That an election be held in said Callahan County Water Control and Improvement District No. 1 on the 16th day of April, 1949, at which election the following proposition shall be submitted:  
'Shall the Board of Directors of Callahan County Water Control and Improvement District No. 1 be authorized to issue the bonds of said district in the sum of \$200,000.00, maturing serially in such installments as may be fixed by the Board of Directors, the maximum maturity being not more than Thirty Five (35) years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed Five (5%) per cent per annum, payable annually or semi-annually, for the purpose of constructing dam, water reservoir and pipe lines for said District, and whether or not ad valorem

taxes shall be levied on all taxable property within said District sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds and to provide a sinking fund sufficient to redeem said bonds at their maturity.'  
2. That said election shall be held at the City Hall in the City of Baird, within said District and the following named persons are hereby appointed directors of said election:  
C. E. Andrews, Presiding Judge  
D. J. Anderson, Judge,  
Corrinne Barringer, Clerk,  
Mrs. S. I. Smith, Clerk.  
3. That said election shall be held under the laws governing general elections except as otherwise provided by the provisions of Chapter 25, Acts of the Thirty Ninth Legislature, 1925, Regular Session, as amended, and only legally qualified electors residing within said district who own taxable property in said district and who have duly rendered the same for taxation shall be qualified to vote.  
4. The ballots of said election shall have written or printed thereon the following:  
'For the issuance of bonds and the levy of ad valorem taxes in payment thereof.'  
'Against the issuance of bonds and the levy of ad valorem taxes in payment thereof.'  
Each voter shall mark out with black ink or black pencil one of the above expressions, thus leaving the other as indicating his vote on the proposition.  
5. Notice of said election shall be given under the hand of the President and Secretary of the Board of Directors, stating the maximum amount of bonds to be issued and the proposed maximum interest thereon, the maximum maturity date of said bonds and the time and place of holding the election. Said notice shall be published once a week for four consecutive weeks in a newspaper having general circulation in the County in which said District is located, the first of which publication shall be at least twenty eight days before the date of such election. Said notice further shall contain substantially the proposition to be voted upon and a summary of the Engineers' estimate of the cost of the proposed improvements as shown by said Engineers' report on file in the office of the District as approved by the Board of Directors. Said notice of election also shall be posted by the Secretary at three public places within said district and one such notice shall be posted at the door of the County Courthouse, at least twenty one days prior to the date fixed for said election.
