Everything Ready for School

Ag. Teachers Honor Henry

J. T. Henry, longtime vocational agriculture teacher in Bronte High School, was honored Tuesday evening by the Vocational Agriculture Teachers Association meeting in Houston. Henry and Marvin L. Myers of Crowell were presented with honorary life membership in the association upon their retirement.

Henry retired at the end of the last school term after having taught vocational agriculture for 38 years. The entire time was spent at Bronte High School. Mrs. Henry, who was a teacher in the elementary school here, also retired this year.

Henry graduated from Sterling City High School in 1932, went on to receive his B.S. degree from Texas Tech in 1936 and his M.S. degree from Sul Ross in 1953.

Henry has taught hundreds of Bronte boys during his 38 years here. He has turned out dozens of outstanding livestock and leadership teams that have made their mark through district, area and state competition. His efforts were rewarded in 1946 when he was presented the Honorary Lone Star Farmer degree, the state's highest award conferred by the Texas Association of the FFA.

In addition to his work at school with hundreds of boys, Henry has been active in community and church activities. He is a member of the Bronte Lions Club and the Masonic Lodge. He and Mrs. Henry are active members of the First United Methodist Church where he has taught Sunday School and held most of the of-

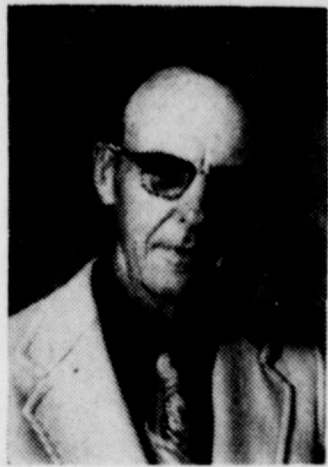
AD-LIB-BEN

Good Rains Fall In Parts of Area

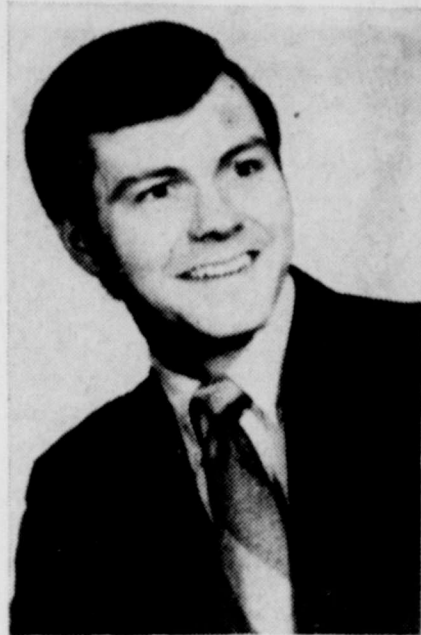
It was raining in Bronte in press time Thursday. A good shower started falling about 4 p.m. and a sprinkle was still falling at 5 p.m. Thursday.

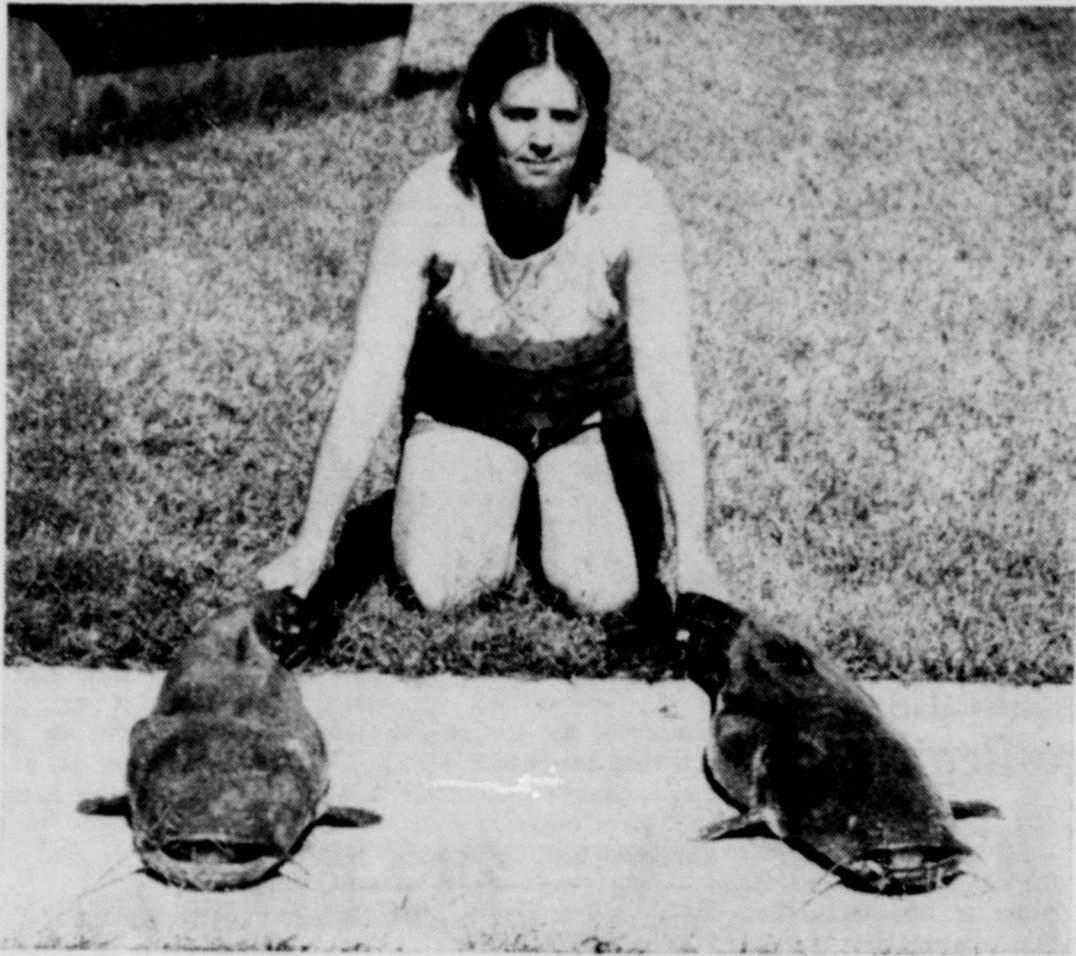
Rambis said they will repair all kinds of appliance, including air conditioners, refrigeration units, ranges ovens, etc., as well as small electric appliances.

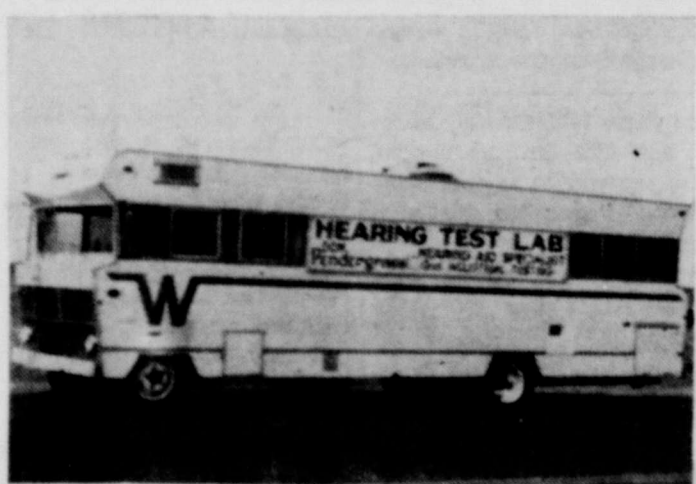

FISHING REPORT from Lake Spence

Trotliners at Lake Spence have been taking some large yellow catfish and some heavy stripers lately. The line users are going to deep water regions of the Coke County lake and the majority are baiting with large minnows.

Stripers have also been caught by lure casters. The largest last week was a 12 pounder taken by a bass fisherman who was casting a top water bait at the time the big striper hit.
