If subscribers order the discontinuance of their periodicals the publisher may continue to send them until all dues are paid up.

Refusing to take periodicals from the office or removing and leaving them uncallof intentional fraud.

Under this law the man who allows his subscription to run along for some time unpaid for and then orders "refused" and have a card sent notifying the publishers, is liable to arrest or fine the same as for theft.


