**Bill Taylor Was Capture at Mapimi Mexico.**

El Paso, Texas, July 30.—News reached here today of the capture of one the three Mexican Central trainrobbers who held up the Wells-Fargo Express company just outside of Bermejillo on July 23 and got away with \$50,000. The man was captured at Mapimi Mexico, and has been identified as Bill Taylor, who held up the Santa Fe train at Coleman Junction, Texas, and killed one man. Taylor has surrendered \$15,000 of the express company's money and it is reported he made a confession, naming Jim Paris and Lee Smith as the men who were with him in the robbery. Taylor gave his name as West to the arresting officers.

Proposed Amendment to the Constitution, to be submitted to the vote of the people on Tuesday, November 4, 1902.

(S. J. R. No. 3)

**JOINT RESOLUTION.**

Amending Article 6, Section 2, of the Constitution of the State of Texas requiring all persons subject to a poll tax to have paid a poll tax and to hold a receipt for same before they offer to vote at any election in this State, and fixing the time of payment of said tax.

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas.

Section 1. That Article 6, Section 2 of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended so as to hereafter read as follows: Sec. 2. Every male person subject to none of the foregoing disqualifications, who shall have attained the age of twenty-one years and who shall be a citizen of the United States, and who shall have resided in this State one year next preceding an election and the last six months within the district or county in which he offers to vote shall be deemed a qualified elector and every male person of foreign birth subject to none of the foregoing disqualifications who not less than six months before any election at which he offers to vote shall have declared his intention to become a citizen of the United States in accordance with the Federal Naturalization Laws, and shall have resided in this State one year next preceding such election and the last six months in the county in which he offers to vote, shall also be deemed a qualified elector; and all electors shall vote in the election precinct of their residence provided, that electors living in any unorganized county or may vote at any election precinct in the county to which such county is attached for judicial purposes; and provided further, that any voter who is subject to pay a poll tax under the laws of the State of Texas shall have paid said tax before he offers to vote at any election in this State and hold a receipt showing his poll tax paid before the first day of February next preceding such election. Or if said voter shall have lost or misplaced said tax receipt, he shall be entitled to vote upon making affidavit before any officer authorized to administer oaths that such tax receipt has been lost. Such affidavit shall be made in writing and left with the judge of the election, and this provision of the constitution shall be self-enacting without the necessity of further legislation. Sec. 3. The Governor of this State is hereby directed to issue the necessary proclamation submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of Texas at the next general election.

**Bosko Yields To Gila Monster.**

"Eat 'Em Alive" Tackles one Reptile Too Many and is Dying.

Brief mention was made in The News yesterday of the fact that information had been received here that Bosko, the snake eater at the result of a bite of a bite of a Gila monster.

It seems that Bosko has at last overreached himself, and it is more than likely that the dispatches will soon chronicle his death in a hospital in Reno, Nev., where he now lies unconscious from the bite of a Gila monster.

From a brief dispatch from Reno it is learned that Bosko is there at a midway carnival and that a few days since he undertook to handle a Gila monster as he handled rattlesnakes and other venomous reptiles. It is generally supposed the Gila monster, the most sluggish of all known reptiles, will not bite, but the contrary has been proven in dozens of cases. Besides the Gila monster is furnished with a double row of teeth, interlocking when it closes its jaw, and when it does bite the only way found to release the victim is to cut the monster's head off and then pry the jaws apart. As long as the monster is alive the locked jaws resist every effort to open them.

The dispatch says Bosko was handling the hideous reptile, so repulsive in appearance that even other reptiles shun it, and was putting its head in his mouth biting it, when it became angered and bit him. What part of the body the Gila monster located for its bite is not stated, but the result is that Bosko is slowly dying from poison.

Of all the freaks that have traveled this country, Bosko was certainly the most puzzling. He selected as revolting an act as can be imagined, that of eating snakes alive, as his specialty and while his acts disgusted those who watched

nessed it, still he drew immense crowds wherever he appeared. There was no deception about his biting the heads of the snakes from the body and eating mouthfuls of the reptile flesh. He has given private exhibitions before physicians in Los Angeles and elsewhere, where any trickery would have been discovered and exposed.

Bosko claims to have learned to eat and to like the flesh of live snakes from the Moqui Indians, who, during one of their dances, carry live snakes in their mouths. The Gila monster is a new departure in his program and will probably end his strange career.—El Paso News.

The Smithsonian Institute at Washington a few years ago declared that a most thorough and exhaustive examination of this reptile failed to find a single trace of poison.

The fact remains that, up to ten years ago, there was only one case on record where a man recovered from Gila monster's bite—a big stockman named Walter Vail, who at once bound up his arm, (he was bitten on the thumb) took no Whiskey, but sent for a doctor who went to his aid on a switch engine from Tucson and saved his man. Whiskey is said to aggravate the poison. Mr Vail was a skeleton for six months.—Standard.
