Kent Washington,
Sept 26, 1902.

To the Rustler.
To my many friends in Coke county.

Some days ago I wrote a line to the Rustler from Seattle; I now write from Kent which is situated on White River, in the valley 16 miles south of Seattle, where we are picking Hops at this writing.

This is the Richest country I have ever seen, the River valley is from one to miles wide, The land near Kent sells from one to two miles wide, the land near Kent sells from \$100. to \$250. Per acre.

Many men own 5 10 15 and 20 acre farms here. It would likely appear to a Texas man that these prices would be out of the question, but let me give you the figures a "Raucher" so-called here owns 13 acres of this land one half mile from Kent, and this is his first year on the place which was badly run down. On the 13. acres he pastured 7 milk cows one Horse cut 16 tons of hay dug 35-000 Pounds of potatoes which sell for 1c per lb, Beets and carrots 75000 lbs feed to stock, cabbage 10,000 lbs which sells from 1 to 2c lbs, he sold from March to Sept. to creamery in Kent, on an average 1000 lbs, to the cows amount sold for \$1 20 per hundred lbs, had one acre in fruit and berries, raised 300. chickens which sell from 40 to 75c apiece, besides the eggs, eggs sell 25 to 75c Doz, raised 8 Hogs this is the figures he gave me as we walked over the farm and I did not doubt a word of it.

Hops are a success here the man we are picking for will gather 1 1-4 Tons to the acre, Hops are now worth 30c apound it cost about 7 to 10c to grow and pick Hops.

I now give you rent rates one man rents 34 acres of land milk cows wagons barn etc for \$400, a year, renter has 25 cows, another man has 50 acres land 25 cows wagons, harness and barn, gives renter all the calves rents for \$600, a year.

Prices: Flour \$1.50 sk Beef in market 8, 10, and 12c a lb Pork 12 to 15c potatoes 75c and \$1.00 corn meal 2 1-2c a lb bacon 14 to 15c DG sugar 5 4 1-2c a lb butter 25 35c a lb, dry goods cheaper than in Texas, cows 35, 40, 50 and \$60, Horses from \$40. to \$75.

Hay sells 10 to \$12. a Ton now Oat 50c bushel.

There are opportunities for shrewd men to go into business, Land agencies, Life and fire insuring ect.

This is not the best season of the year to come here for we expect lots of rain from now until March or April, and a stranger might have a task to make expenses during the winter, there are worlds of working men here now, but nobody need to be idle, but

many men up north come here to winter for it never gets very cold here say 15 above zero is as cold as I ever saw it during the 8 years I lived on Puget Sound, this is, with the exception of the rain in winter, the finest climate in U. S. this is a very Healthy country finest water on earth.

I have been asked repeated, is not the Rheumatism bad in that wet country? my answer is no I do not believe it is as bad here as in Texas.

Price of up lands from \$10 to \$50, according to location, there is lots of as good land as this Whiteriver lands subject to home stead "I want to be understood" there is lands on Both sides of the month of the Puget Sound either in British Columbia or in the U. S. vacant, no one or two men could go in and settle on it a lone, let me explain: Just in the Banks of the coast near the month of the sound there is one of the finest countries, but there is no chance for a boat landing there in Cape Flattery the swells from the ocean make it almost impossible to land a boat there, although the Indians do land their canoes there. But if say 100, or 200, families should want to settle a colony there they could go to Claham bay 40 miles from this land, these 200 men could build a road in to this country and settle and have this free lands the clearing I am told is light small growth but it would cost lots of labor to make this road My suggestion if it would take 200 men from one to two month to build a road that could be hauled over this 40 miles but if I thought I could get the 200 men I would be one of them, and build this road, you ask if this is a good thing why has it not been settled? my answer is for two reasons: First to get 100 or 200 men to stay to gather is hard to do.

secondly when men come here they find wages so good they go to work—The Government will assist the right kind of men, with the right kind of a leader. The socialists tried this, but the Government opposed to Anarchists.

I do not want to create any excitement, but there are great possibilities here. Schools: There is a fine school system: scholastic age from 6 to 21.

There is an indifference shown to church worship on account of the live commerce world, though I have met and preached to two attentive congregations there are many devoted people in all the churches and all churches are represented here.

I close, lest I make this to long, but let me say before I close 10 to 20 acres of land is plenty for a man here unless he wants to go into the stock business again there is chances for a man to buy calves and ship them down the Sound to some old logging works and find good grass free, and young stock could live with out feed. Again on this land I spoke of the colony settling, there is wild grass and that is something unusual here, for there is no much wild grass out here.—kind of grasses Clover, white and red, Timothy, real top grass, blue grass orchard grass.

After the under growth is cut and burned off sow the seed, and it is seeded for life.
