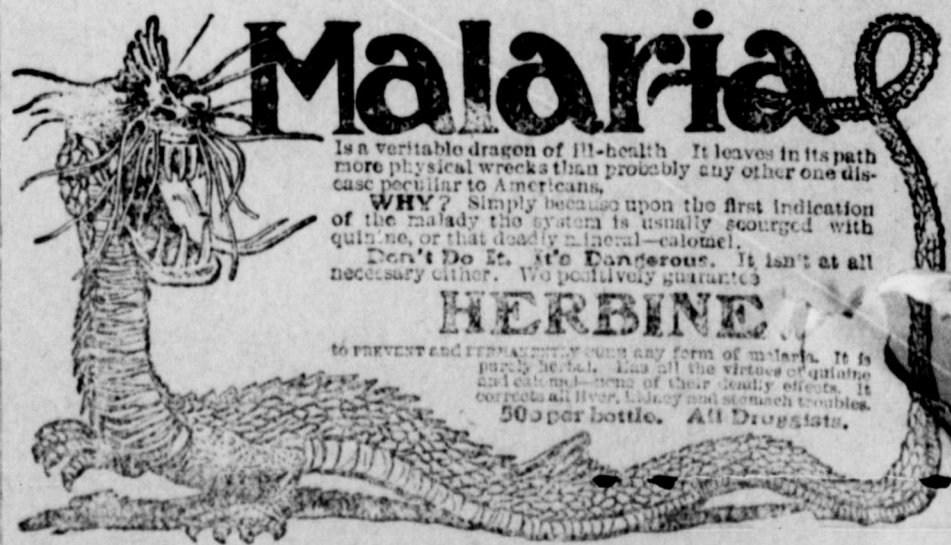

Order Establishing Election Precincts. STATE OF TEXAS.

County Commissioners of Coke County Texas August Term A. D. 1903.

On this 17th day of August A. D. 1903, the Commissioners' Court of said County, at a regular quarterly term thereof, convened for the purpose of transacting such business as is required by law to be disposed of at this term.

And now, on this day the Court proceeded to divide the said County into convenient Election Precincts; and it appearing to the Court that their said County had heretofore been divided into proper Justices' Precincts, remaining fixed at this date, and the Court having duly considered the boundaries of said Justices' Precincts as well as the law governing such divisions:

It is therefore hereby ordered by the County Commissioners Court, that the County of Coke, Texas, be and the same is hereby divided into nine Election Precincts, to be numbered consecutively, and that the number and the boundaries of each of said Election Precincts so established shall be and are as follows, to-wit:

JUSTICE'S PRECINCT No. 1.

Election Precinct No. 1, Beginning at the upper cor. of survey No. 956 in the name of S. A. Maverick on the North bank of the Colorado river. Thence N. 30 degrees E. to a cor. of the James Davidge survey also cor. of Stanton Fields survey. Thence S. 60 W. about 200 yds. another cor. of said Stanton Fields and also a cor. of the James Davidge. Thence N. 30 E. to the N. W. cor. of said Stanton Field, also in the South line of Sec. No. 456 H & T. C. Ry. Co. Block 1a. Thence West to the S. W. cor. of said No. 456. Thence North with the E. line of sec. No. 457 446 & 435 to the N. W. Cor. of No. 434. Thence East to the N. E. Cor. of No. 434 same Company. Thence North with the West lines of sections Nos. 422, 399, 388, 367, 352, and 339 to the North West corner of said sec. No. 369 and S. E. cor. of sec. No. 353.
