Well Recompleted In County

An abandoned wildcat 5 miles east of Baird, in Callahan County, has been recompleted as a Gardner Sand gas discovery.

It is Southwest Production Corp. of Denton No. 1 N. M. George. The project was originally slated by Windsor Enterprise Inc. of Denton, and is located 660 feet from the north and east lines of Section 76, BOH Survey.

Calculated absolute, open flow was seven million cubic feet of dry gas daily from perforations at 3,028 - 32 feet.

Operator has cleaned out the hole to 4,145 feet. It was originally plugged in 1948 at 4,202.
