any person within the Territory of New Mexico who deals, plays, carres on, opens, or causes to be
opened, or conducts, either as owner or employee, whether for hire or not, any game of faro, monte, roulette, lasquenet. rouge et-noir, rondo, fantan, poker
seven-and-a-half, twenty-one chuck-a-luck, slot machine, or any banking or percentage game played with cards, dice, or any other device, for money, checks credit, or any other representa dive of value, is guilty of a mis
demeanor, and shall be punishe by a fine of not more than $\$ 1,000$ or by confinement in jail for no more than one year for each of

Plant memory is a problem fo the inquisitive botanist. In 1901 plant allied to the squash and pumpin was taken to New York from since then it has been kept-with out watering-in a strange climate 3,500 miles from home. During the plant grows its leaves and flowers and perfects its seed. Then it dries up and leaves only a water-filled gourd, which a thick, ward ahed seals acainst animals and shel tion. The transplanted evapora still remembers the rainy season of six weeks. It wakes, sends out root lets, stems and leaves and then drie up again until the following year.
