



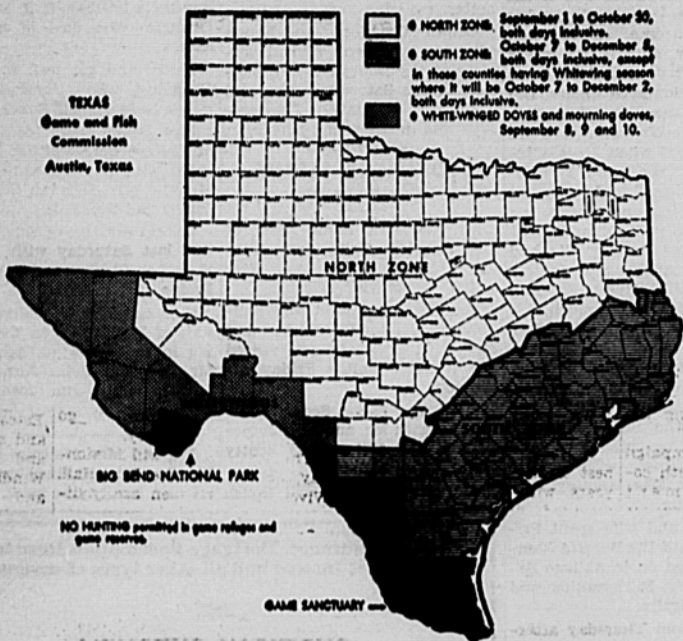


**MOURNING DOVE - WHITE-WINGED DOVE

WHITE-WINGED DOVES: Daily bag limit—10. Possession limit—10.

NOTE: When both mourning doves and white-winged doves are possessed—Possession limit—10, in the aggregate, and not more than 10 may be white-winged doves.

GAME SANCTUARY

**SPECIAL NOTE:** Unlawful to take white-winged doves or chachalacas south of U.S. Highway 85, formerly State Highway 4, in southern tip of Texas, marked on map as "Game Sanctuary," and the Big Bend National Park in Brewster County.

**SHOOTING:** Must be plugged permanently to three-shell capacity, may not be larger than 10 gauge. Hunting done with rifle prohibited.

**SHOOTING HOURS:** Mourning doves, 15 noon to sunset—except in areas having white-wing season, where the shooting hours will be from 2 p.m. to sunset on September 8, 9 and 10 (successive days) only. White-winged doves, in season, 2 p.m. to sunset.


**Union Usuals and Unusuals**
