## ORDINANCE NO. 3

cITY officers-duties and powers.
Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the town of Por-
New Mexico: tales, New Mexico: Section 1. That each and every officer of the town of Portales, whether elected or appointed, shalb, before entering upon the
duties of his office, take and subscribe an oath that he will well and truly perform all the duties of his office to the best of his skill and ability, and that he will support the constitution of the United shall le in the form prescribed by law.
Sec. 2 The officers of said town of Portales shall consist of five trustees one of whom shall be chairman, a town clerk, a town
treasurer, a town attorney, a town marshal, a town physician, a pound keeper, and a scavenger.

the term of one (1) year, and until their successors shall be appointed and qualified, unless sooner removed.

of their respective their respective offices all moneys, books, papers, property and other things in their cusas required by this section, shall be ba follows:

For town treasurer, five thousand dollars ( $\$ 5000000$ )
For town marshal, twenty-five hundred dollars $(\$ 2,500.0$
For town scavenger, two hundred and fifty dollars ( $\$ 250.00$ ) And pornd keeper, live hundred ars (\$00.00)
Anct the board of trustees may require a bond from any town of
ficial and fix the amount therefor when, in their judgement, the same is necessary. Said bonds shall be filed with the clerk of said
board, and by him be preserved and kept in some secure place subject, however. at ail times, to the inspection of the said board of trustees, and that of any tax payer of the town who shall de-
sire to examine the same, and shall be recorded in a book kept for sire to examin.

Sec. 5. The treasurer shall receive all moneys belonging to the corporation, and shal keep his books and accounts in such a man-
ner as may be prescribed by ordinance, and sich books and accounts shall always be subject to the inspection of any member of the board of trustees. He shall keep a separate account of each
fund or appropriation and the debits or credits belonging theret He shall give every person paring money into the treasury a ceipt therefor, speceifying the date of payment and upon what account paid, and ne snail file statements of such receipts with the
clerk at the date of each monthy report. He bhall, at the end of each and every month, and oftener, 11 required, render an account
to the board of trustees, or such officer as may be designated by or dinance, showing the state of the treasury. He shall also actompany such accounts with a statement of ail moneys received into the treasury, and upon what account, during the preceding month,
together with ail warrants redeemed and paid by him which together with ain warrants redeemed and paid
warrants with any and ail vouchers held by him, shalibe delich sered to the clerk and tiled with his said account, in the clerk's offiee upon every day of such statement. He shall return all warrants
paid by him stamped or marked "paid." He stail keep a register of all warrants redeemed and, which shall describe such warrants and shame of the person to whom paid and when paid. which paid, required to keep a all moneys in his hands belonging to the corpora-

Sec. 7. All warrants drawn on the treasurer must be signed by the chairman of the board of trustees and countersigned by the cierk; stating the particular fund or appropriation to which the

shall be drawn except as hereinatter provided. All moneys re ceived on any special assessment shall be held by the treasurer as aspecial fund to be applied to the payment of the improvement for

record of all warrants and licenses issued, with the names of the parties in whose favor they are drawn, jncluding dates, amounts and numbers, and purposes for which, given, and shall, on the first day of each month, or as soon thereafter as the same can be com-
pleted, and at such other time as the board of trustees may, require, prepare a full and complete report of all warrants and treasurer, and of all other transactions of his said office during the month last preceding the said report, and shall submit the same to the board of trustees at its first regular meeting in each and every
month. The town clerk shall be the keeper of the town seal hall a fix it to all instruments which are required to be attested by the town seal; he shall have custody of and safely keep all records and documents of the town, except as ale otherwise provided by

An ordinance providins fot the licensing of dogs, prohibiting Be it ordained by the board of thustees of the town of Por-
Ber tales, New Mexica.
Section 1 . That no dog, bitch or whelp, shall be permitted or
allowed to run or be at large within the town of Portales, unles the owner, keeper or person in charge of any such dog, bitch or whelp shall, before the fifteenth day of March in each and every year, pay ot the town clerk, for the use and benefit of the town; the sum of one dollar for each and every male dog, and three dollars for each and
every female dog owned or kept by such person, and shall also place and cause to remain upon the neck of every dog, bitch or whelp, a collar made of durable material, with the number designating such dog, bitch or whelp, legibly engraved thereon, or have attache said dog. Whenever the chairman of the board of town trustees shal e of the opinion that any danger of hydrophobia evists in the town enall issue h. precha if they have any, persons within. the may designate, during which time it shall not be lawful for any dog, bitch or whelp to run at large within the limits of the town unless the mouth be securely muzzled with a wire muzzle, and it
shall be the duty of the marshal, and all other police officers to kill shall be the duty of the marshal, and all other police officers to kill whelp which may be found running at large during the time designated as aforesaid, unless muzzled aş above provided, and the owner or keeper thereof, shall forfeit and pay to said town the sum of ve dollars for each dog., bitch or whelp found running at larg ' Sec. 3 Any person, or persons, who shall molest, interrupt, hinder or prevent the marshal, or any police officer, in the discharge of any duty herein prescribed, shall forfeit and pay to said town a sum not less than nive nor more than twenty-ive doliars for each
offense. See. 4. If the owner or keeper of any slut shall permit or
allow the same to run or be at large while in heat, he shall forfeit allow the same to run or be at large while in heat, he shall forfeit and pay to said town che sum of five dollars; and it shail be the large in this town while in heat. Sec. 5 . It is hereby made the duty of all persons on or before
the 15th day of March in each year, to apply to the town clerk the 15 th day of March in each year, to apply to the town cierk
and make payment to him as required in section 1 ; and it shall be and make payment to him as required in sect his fee together with license fee aforesaid, to issue a license to any owner, keeper or persm having in charge of any such dog, bitch or whelp, for one

and barks at horses being ridden or driven upon the streets. it shall be unlawful for a vicious dog to run at large, and such dog shall be labie to be killed, as provided in the preceding section, notwitnstanding such dog

All unlicensed dogs, bitehes and whelps, running at large with.n the limits oi tae town of Portales, and owned in said town. and all dogs. bitches and whelps detined to be vicious under wnile in heat, dogging, or chased or followed by dog or dorition and each, all and every one of them hereby is ant are deciared to be common nuisances, offensive aiike to publite order and welibeing, which may be suppressed and abated py any officer under
