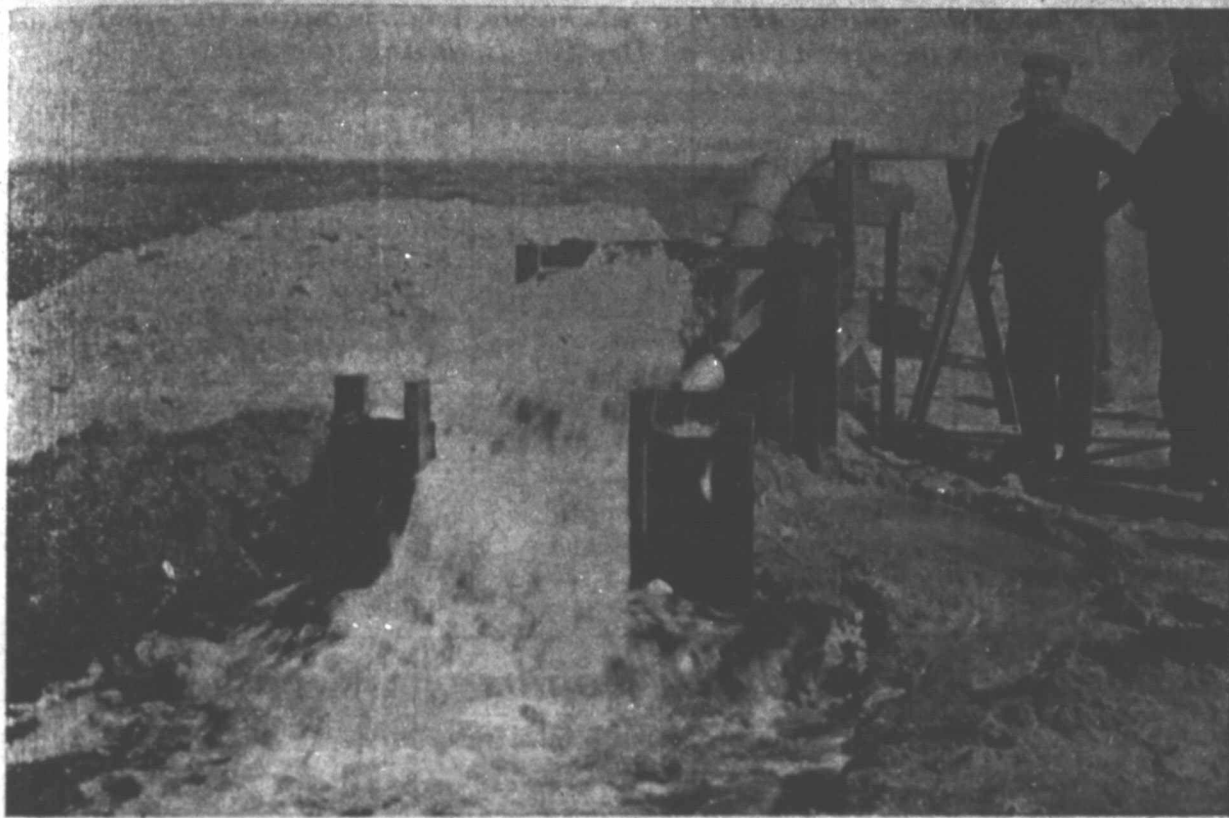

The Well that Made Portales Famous.

The above is a picture of the water being pumped from the Lindsey well, two miles west of Portales, with a six-inch centrifugal pump, being one of the wells tested for the proposed irrigation project. The gate through which the water flows is twenty-four inches wide and the water is flowing through this gate about six inches deep. This is said to be more than enough water to irrigate one hundred and sixty acres of land. The water is being lifted thirty feet and, at that depth, it will cost, under the irrigation contract for power to pump enough water to cover an acre one foot deep, 42 cents. Three acre feet of water being amply sufficient to irrigate any and all crops in this country, the cost for lifting the water for an acre will be \$1.26, which is as cheap as water is obtained under ditches and reservoirs. This well, after being pumped several days showed no diminution in the supply of water. This well proves the supply of water ample and is truly termed "The well that made Portales famous."

Irrigation Subscribers to Incorporate

An irrigation mass meeting was held at the court house last Saturday. B. J. Reagan acted as chairman and T. J. Molinari secretary. Several important matters were discussed. A committee was appointed to draft articles of incorporation, rules and by-laws for the subscribers to the project, as follows: W. E. Lindsey, T. J. Molinari, G. L. Reese, H. J. Farnham and S. J. Nixon. It was voted to levy an assessment of ten cents per acre on the land subscribed to defray the expense of the testing. This amount, if the project goes through, will be credited on the advance payment of \$3.50 per acre. This seemed to meet the approval of all subscribers and was practically all promptly

paid. The meeting adjourned to assemble again next Saturday at 2 p. m. to hear reports of the committee on incorporation and attend to any further business.

Progress on the Test Wells.

The Lindsey well being thoroughly tested and the supply of water found ample for irrigating purposes the pump and engine was moved out to the Elliott well at Bethel this week. As soon as the machinery is put in place they will commence pumping on this well and give it a through test. The drill is now at work on the N. Wise place southeast of Portales and this will be the next tested after the Elliott well. After this a well will be tested on the George Baker place and then a well on

the W. P. Pitts place. This will probably conclude the testing.

A Splendid Store Building.

The new Hardy Hardware company building is now completed and furnished and it is, without question, one of the most neatly arranged and thoroughly up to the minute stores in this portion of the territory. The building is 40x80, constructed of concrete blocks; steel ceiling and best grade of flooring oiled and polished. The walls are all plastered and the whole interior is well finished. The shelving is confined to the north side of the room and extends from the floor to the ceiling with rolling ladders for convenience in reaching the upper shelves. From the front half way back the shelves are fitted with tight drawers and drop doors. The front is plate glass with one large show window in the center, with double doors on either side. The south side of the room is filled with the buggy display, of which they carry a very large line. Down the center is displayed their line of stoves and ranges. The stock will range in amount from \$25,000.00 to \$30,000.00. Dudley Hardy, the managing partner in the business, is one of our strongest business men and also one of the heaviest investors in Roosevelt county lands we have. He is a firm believer in the future greatness of this portion of the territory and backs his judgment with his money. He is a town builder and a town booster. The new store and its equipment is an ornament to Portales and a credit to Mr. Hardy.

Adams & Crow have made arrangements to continue in the tin shop business and have leased the front end of the Hardy warehouse opposite the Presbyterian church where they will be found ready to attend to all work in their line.

ANOTHER FIRE VISITS PORTALES

Burns Five Frame Business Houses on West Side of Square.

Property Loss Estimated at From \$12,000 to \$15,000.

On Saturday morning, October 30th, another fire broke out in Portales. It originated in the second-hand store of Williams & Lawrence, at about 3 o'clock a. m. The first alarm was given by R. M. Sanders, who was sleeping in the back room of his harness and saddle shop, three doors west. When first discovered the fire had just started and had gained no considerable headway, but by the time Mr. Sanders could run to his trunk and jerk out the six-shooter, with which he gave the alarm, the flames were practically beyond control. There is but little doubt entertained but what the fire was of incendiary origin, as coal oil was plainly in evidence, but as to the identity of the party or parties responsible for it, no clues are obtainable. There was, in all, five buildings destroyed, as follows:

The second-hand store building owned by W. L. Heck, two buildings owned by R. M. Sanders, one occupied by Adams & Crow's tin shop, the other by Mr. Sanders' harness and saddle shop, E. A. Schweining's building, and Sam J. Nixon's residence and law office. The loss is probably \$12,000.00 or \$15,000.00 only partly covered by insurance. Mr. Schweining and Mr. Sanders are the heaviest losers, Mr. Sanders' loss being more than \$3,000.00 over and above his insurance. It is understood that the adjusters are here this week settling the losses.

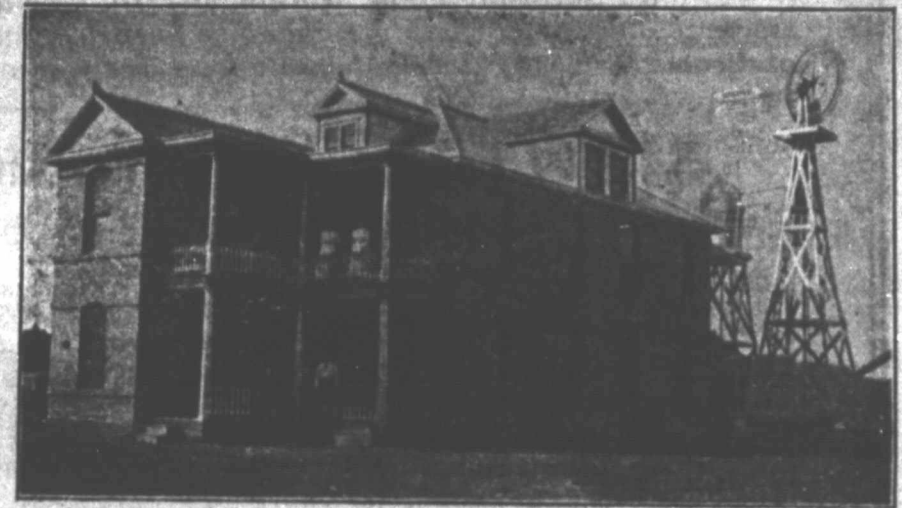
The fire company, under the fire chief, Jeff Hightower, fought heroically and, though the heat was intense, they stood manfully to their duty but, working with an insufficient amount of hose and the flames having gained so much headway before they could arrive, their efforts were fruitless in so far as they applied to the frame buildings above mentioned, but the brick store house owned and occupied by C. V. Harris & Co., adjoining the second-hand store, where the fire originated, was saved through the timely aid of the fire boys.

It is understood that arrangements are on foot to rebuild immediately brick structures in the place of those destroyed.

Gov. George Curry has given notice that he will resign from the office of governor some time in the early spring. This gives rise to speculation from all sources as to who his successor will be. A report from Washington, published in Albuquerque, states that A. L. Lawshe, third assistant postmaster general, who recently tendered his resignation on account of the condition of his health is likely to be the new governor. The Santa Fe New Mexican makes the suggestion that Territorial Secretary Nathan Jaffa will make an excellent governor, and so he would. But a report that sounds best to the Times is one that apparently emanated from Carlsbad stating that Judge William H. Pope is likely to be chosen by President Taft to occupy the gubernatorial chair of New Mexico. The Albuquerque Journal states in reference to the rumor about the appointment of Judge Pope: "We have heard the same report here, and while it is merely rumor there seems to be some ground for it, and the people of the territory would have reason to congratulate the president upon such a selection. The record Judge Pope has made for himself in his present position is the best guarantee the public could have that as chief executive of the territory he would make an able and efficient official. He is a man of fine intellectual equipment and of unimpeachable integrity."

Mesilla valley farmers, as an experiment, shipped a car of onions to Chicago and, after deducting cost of packing, transportation and marketing, received 1 1/2 cents per pound. As the yield was 40,000 to 60,000 pounds per acre, the shippers received at the rate of \$500 to \$750 per acre, which makes onion culture much more profitable than sugar beets. Unlike fruit, onions are a pretty steady crop and will yield year after year. Therefore, if the demand and the market exist, New Mexico farmers would find it to pay them well to raise onions. — New Mexican.

Mr. Troutt will put a brick and concrete building on this lot in the near future for a wholesale commission house.

Charles Duncan, town marshal, publicly destroyed about eight dozen bottles of beer in the court house yard Wednesday. The beer was taken under a seizure and search warrant, being found in the ice house. Witnesses were examined before Judge Seay Wednesday morning to ascertain the owner of the beer, but no owner could be found so it was ordered publicly destroyed. This is the first time liquor of any kind has been destroyed and poured out in Portales, but nobody seemed to mourn about it.

A couple eastern buyers were here and bought two car loads, and Humphrey & Sledge have bought the balance. The yield has been light this year but owing to the high price most of the growers have received a fair income from their land.

Enoch Boucher is fixing up one of the finest wagon yards in town on the half block he bought on Main street in the School Addition. He has a good office and feed room, with camp room up stairs, a ladies camp room, and stalls for about one hundred head of horses. He has an improved kind of a feed box in his stalls that are a fine thing. These boxes are made of galvanized iron, and fixed so they can be lifted out, emptied and cleaned of any dust or trash. Mr. Boucher has styled his yard, "The Farmers Wagon Yard". He will make a specialty of buying and selling horses and mules and expects to do quite a business in this line.
