Area Weight and License Fines Heavy Recently

The License and Weight Service of the Texas Department of Public Safety in Region Four filed a total of 1252 cases during the

period of September - December announced Captain C. W. Bell, Commanding Officer. Of these 222 were motor carrier violations. As a result of this action taken by this service of the Department of Public Safety, Justice Courts throughout Southwest Texas were able to collect fines amounting to \$33,613.70. In addition to this, Captain Bell pointed out that \$53,201.24 worth of additional registration was secured as a result of the effort put forth by his personnel. The License and Weight Service in this region consists of 11 specially trained men who work 49 counties, including Eastland County.

But that many relatives can add up to a great many people. To be correct, you will meet somewhere in the neighborhood of 200 thousand quadrillions of people.

If that many people were on earth today they would have to be stacked up on each other's heads. Allowing them two feet to stand on this would make a stack on one solid mass of folks over 100,000 miles high.

Suppose you wanted to say hello to your grandfather who was located 100,000 miles up the heap. The only way to get to him would be to climb. So assume that you can climb one-half as fast as the U. S. Army can walk which is about 15 miles a day.

Climbing at the rate of 1/2 miles a day, you would reach your grandfather 39 years later. Then you would have to return after the visit on a trip that would take you about 50 years.

And that is two generations. Same more additions. Mind you, the above figures do not include brothers, sisters, uncles, aunts, nieces, nephews, and cousins. And, as Ripley says, it is allowing for only 1950 years, although scientists tell us that man has been on earth for countless generations.

St. John records the limits of heaven in Revelations, XXI, 16: "He measured the city with the reed, twelve thousand furlongs. The length, and the breadth, and the height of it are equal."

Break this down into everyday language and the limits of heaven are about 1,500 miles in each direction. And allowing 18 cubic feet as ample space for a human being, you find that heaven only can hold 40 thousand quadrillions

of people. And this does not allow for the streets of gold or the trees of marvelous leaves and fruits, or the "pure river of water of life, clear as crystal, proceeding out of the throne of God and of the Lamb". Ripley concludes by stating that it is apparent that heaven is crowded. You must die and since heaven is full, where shall you go? You said it.
