





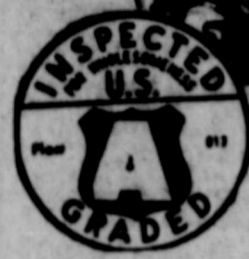

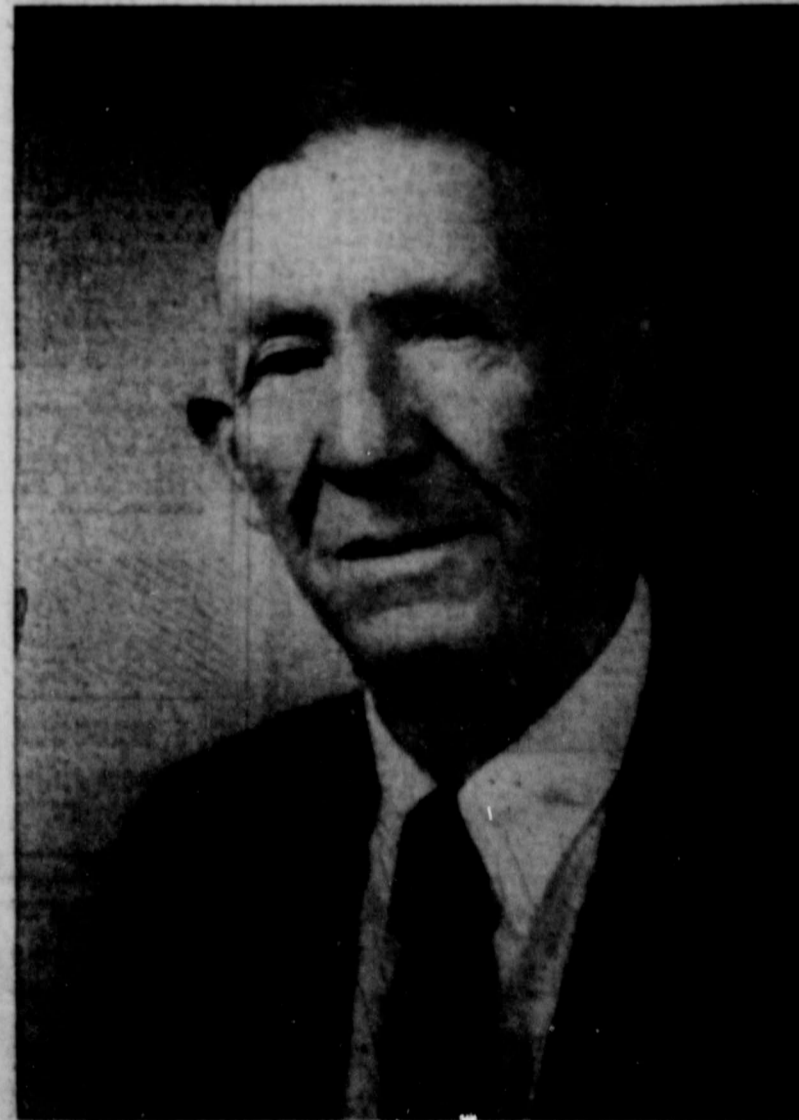

# July Fourth Overtime Is Explained

If those establishments engaged in interstate commerce give their employees a day off for the Fourth of July and require their workers to make up the day the next week, they are liable for overtime pay to employees who work in excess of 40 hours the next week.

But to make up the holiday the next week, or some other time, will involve overtime of at least one and one-half times the regular rate, if total working hours for the week exceed 40.

# Deathwatch Operation Set

Major Wilson E. Speir, Regional Commander of Region No. 4, Department of Public Safety, announced today that Operation Deathwatch for the three day July 4th Holiday Period will run from 12:01 a.m. July 4th through 11:59 p.m. July 6th. A total of 28 motorcycles have been predicted for this period.

Major Speir said that all uniformed enforcement personnel of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Service, License and Weight Service and Highway Patrol Service of the Department of Public Safety would be assigned traffic duties during this period. All holidays and days off have been cancelled. Patrolmen will operate radar extensively during this holiday period in an effort to reduce the death toll.

Speed and DWI violations will be the primary targets of Patrolmen during this period as these two violations contribute to traffic deaths more than any other violations.

Motorists are urged to cooperate in the reduction effort by observing all traffic laws, drive defensively, don't gamble your life and that of your loved ones on a few seconds you might gain by driving at excessive speeds.
