**Final Rites Are Held Monday for Charlie McCoy**

Uncle Charlie McCoy is dead. Death Claimed the 89-year-old Eastland resident Sunday at 6 a. m. He died in his home, 1122 1/2 North Lamar.

Charlie L. McCoy had lived in Eastland for the past 30 years. He was born Jan. 5, 1872 in Indiana and moved to Eastland from Ranger. He had lived in Mingus for a number of years before moving to Ranger and was employed by the Texas and Pacific Coal Co. He was one of the few ex-Thurber coal miners who still live in this area.

Mr. McCoy was married to the former Ann Edwards March 3, 1897 at Thurber. He was a member of the First Christian Church and the Knights of Pythias.

Uncle Charlie was a familiar sight around Eastland. He was considered one of the area's best domino players and made his "trip around the square" almost daily until he fell at his home recently.

Funeral services were held Monday at 2 p.m. in the Hammer Funeral Home chapel. Rev. Ray Heckendorn, pastor of the First Christian Church, officiated. Burial was in Eastland Cemetery.

Survivors include his wife; a daughter, Mrs. C. H. Turner of Dallas, and a granddaughter.

IT'S THE LAW in Texas

MAN-MADE LAW?

With the opening sessions of Congress and the Texas Legislature, thoughts naturally turn to the products of their labors—our state and national laws.

Some people find confusing our different state and national laws dealing with the same things.

Surely, they say, you can have no real justice, unless there is some one "best way" to do each thing—to hold property, to manage traffic, to pay taxes, or to enforce contracts.

So it bothers them. Why should Englishmen drive on the left side of the street? Why should married couples hold title under community property laws in some states and not in others?

Is law merely a man-made contraption?

Is it true that like good manners much law is man-made, growing out of custom of local problems. In card games you can

play many different games with one deck. You merely change the rules. But the law goes deeper than convention into man's basic needs for order, for a grasp of the part he is to play, and for a way to settle disagreements.

Law provides an orderly way to do things so that people can make long-range plans and work together. Its rules help you to find out where you stand—your rights and duties. And last, law has binding ways to settling disputes if need be, first to keep the peace, and then win people over by dealing with them in ways that satisfy their sense of fairness.

You can find these traits of law in most groups from the most primitive to the civilized.

As man finds out more and more about himself and his world, as his experience and wisdom grow, the law may get better. For example, as the psychological laboratories find out more about man's reaction times, his fears and faults, our laws about diving for instance, may improve.

And here is another purpose the different kinds of laws may serve. You may look upon each as a sort of experiment. Some turn out badly, and some well.

But in the give and take of public discussion, these efforts may yet bring us more nearly to the "one best way"—if any such thing exists.

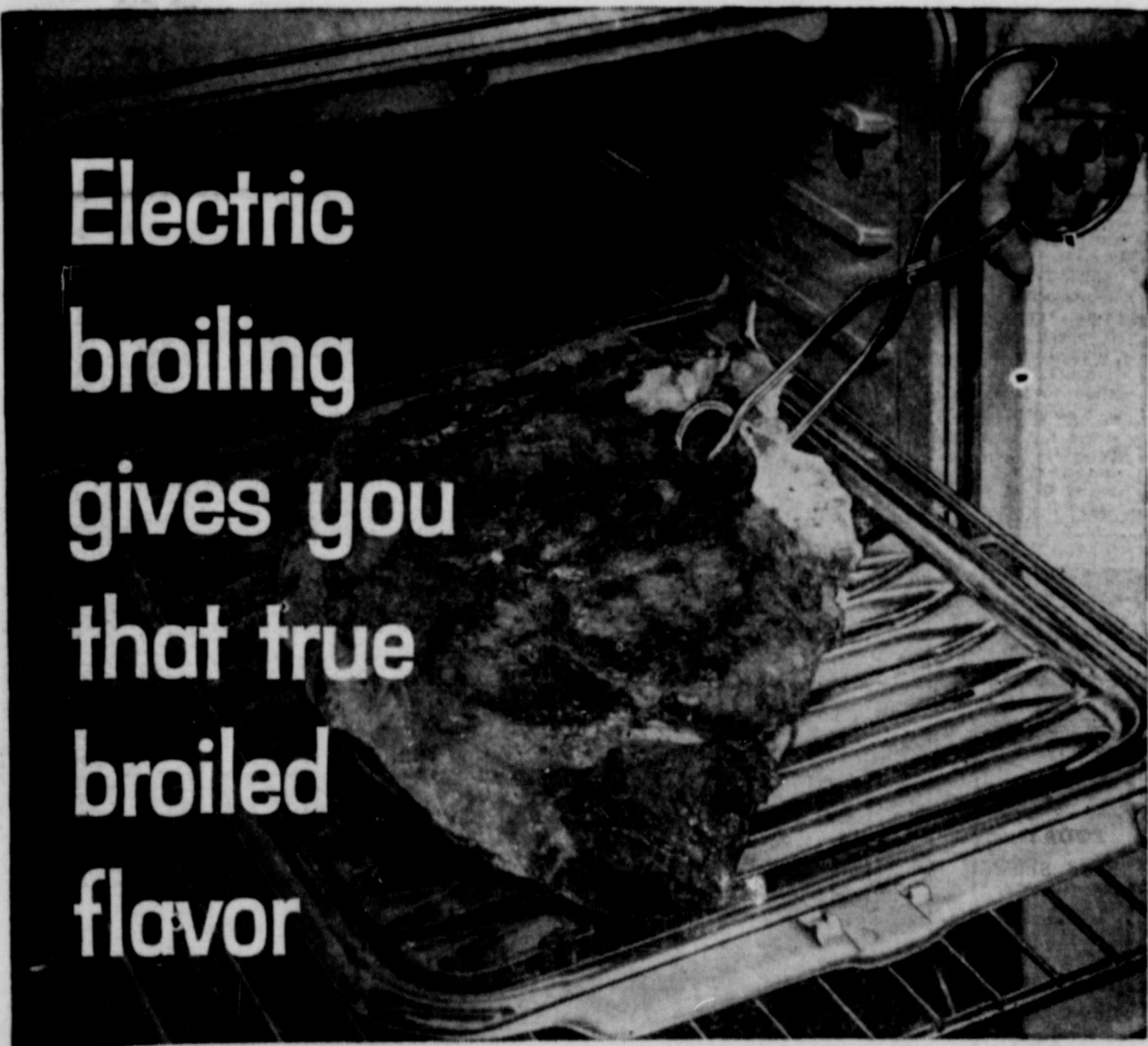

Great Men of English Letters

ROBERT BURNS

Robert Burns, the most famous of Scottish poets, was born January 25, 1759 to a poor Ayrshire tenant farmer. By 12, he was doing a man's work on the farm.



His early verses—which delighted the laity but angered the clergy—were satires on local ecclesiastical squabbles. When one edition of his poems brought 500 pounds he bought a farm where he lived with his wife, Jean Armour.

Burns was a frequent visitor to the White Horse Cellar Coach Inn in Edinburgh where he spent many an hour in front of the fire, enjoying some of the inn's famed White Horse Scotch Whisky while musing over some of his legendary stories.



Robert Burns died in July, 1796 of a heart ailment. Scots all over the world still celebrate his birthday. His famous works include Tom o' Shanter, The Jolly Beggar, The Cotter's Saturday Night and Poems, Chiefly in the Scottish Dialect.

VISITS HERE

AS IT LOOKS FROM HERE

WASHINGTON, D. C.—An interesting part of any day's work is the mail received from back home. Mail is delivered to my office four times a day—at 8:00 in the morning, 10:00 o'clock, noon and 3:00 in the afternoon. One mail may bring 30 or 40 first class letters. Sometimes one thinks they cover every conceivable subject, and over a period of time they almost do. Every letter, every telegram or communication of any kind is read by me and every reply is personal.

There are letters dealing with problems of veterans; problems of farmers; or the many questions involved with Social Security. There are always matters affecting the servicemen and their military generally.

More recently people back home have been writing about issues which they understand will be coming up in the new Congress. Mainly they have to do with Federal Aid to Education; public housing; increase in the rate and coverage of the Minimum Wage Law and other labor legislation; and on new proposals for a Government program of Medical Aid. Many letters, of course, discuss taxes, needed economy in Government, inflation, and the necessity of balancing the Budget.

For the past two weeks many letters from home warn of the move to abolish the Un-American Activities Committee and curtail the authority of the F. B. I. As Chairman of the Committee which appropriates money for the Un-American Activities Committee to carry on its functions, I have assured those writing that this Committee will receive sufficient funds. Demands are being made by the writers of hundreds of letters that a public hearing be held on the justification for funds. Mostly these letters come from the West Coast and from the big cities of New York and Chicago.

To these demands I have replied that the 25 members of the Committee which I head will appropriate no more money than is needed by any Committee of the Congress, but that it will be on the judgment of these 25 who come from all parts of the United States—that I do not propose to furnish a forum for left-wing groups who want more than anything the opportunity to spread their propaganda. The Chairman has this authority.

As to weakening the FBI, I had not been done. This past week I had a visit with by boss of twenty years ago, Mr. J. Edgar Hoover. We discussed these matters and agreed we need not worry over such efforts. We further agreed that the need is greater than ever before to ferret out and reveal the Communists and their sickening activities wherever they are. This kind works at destroying our Government twenty-four hours a day, every day. By our very nature we are inclined to become trust-

ing and complacent until some particular event excites us to action. One day it could be too late to act unless we maintain complete alertness to the constant threat. The Communists know this and depend on it for their eventual success. One of the greatest needs at the time is a simplification of laws permitting the immediate deportation of aliens who are here to destroy us.

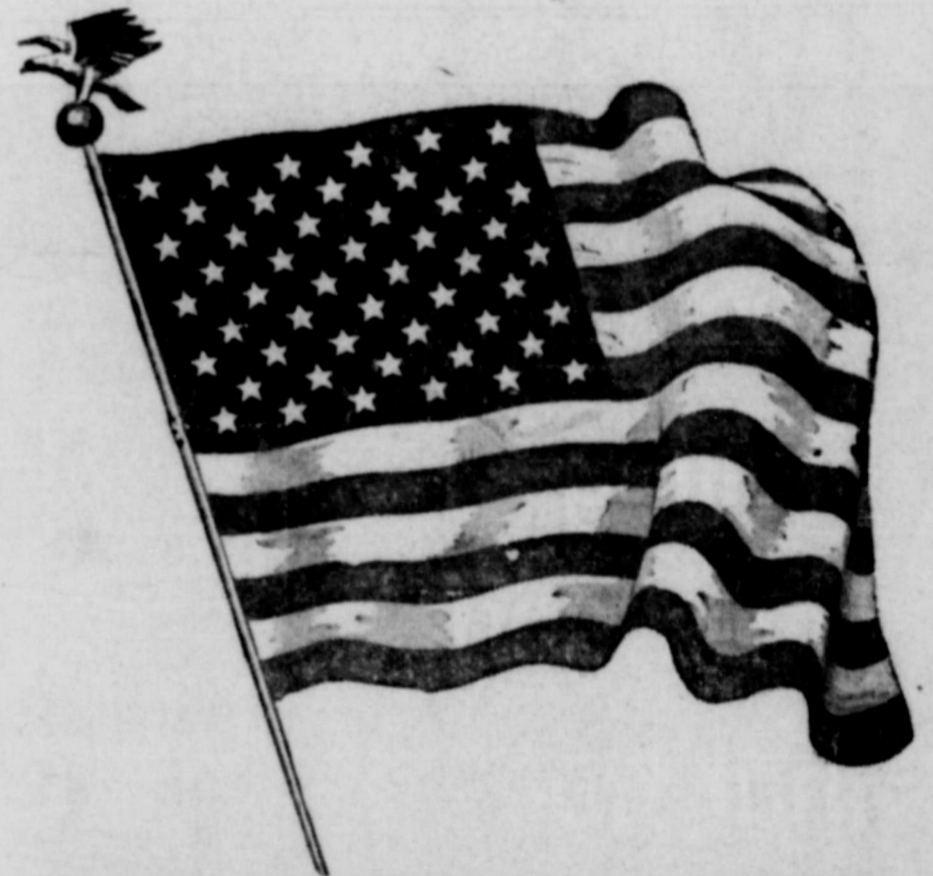

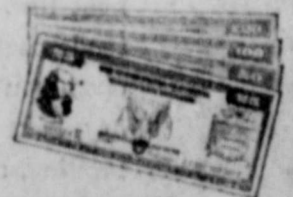
