FAIRBANKS, Alaska, June 30. Wiley Post and Harold Gatty, round-the-world fliers, left here to day at 3:20 a, m., Fairbanks time, en route to New York.

The fliers were bound for Edstop in the cross-continent dash. The Oklahoma oil worker and the Australian navigator landed on the North American continent last night near Nome after pushing through fog along a treacherous route from Siberia; sailed on to Fairbanks, took only a few hours sleep there and were away at 7:20, central standard time, today.

IS AN EXTRA SESSION COMING?

All signs point to the calling of an extra session of the legislature by Governor Ross S. Sterling. Senator Walter C. Woodward of Coleman is for a drastic proration law. In a statement given the press he pointed to the big financial loss the people suffer by low priced oil. His figures are start-

Under normal conditions the state received approximate ly \$8,000,000 from the gross receipts tax on crude oil, but now, with oil at 20, 30 or 35 cents a barrel, the state's income is reduced to approximately \$2,500,000 per annum. The income of the University of Texas from oil has slumped from about \$200,000 a month to approximately \$50,000 a month, a loss of approximately \$150,000 a month or more than \$1,-500,000 a year. He stresses that last year the oil companies paid to owners of oil land, largely farmers, more than \$45, 000,000 for oil royalties; more than \$7,500,000 for rentals on land and probably as much as \$20,000,000 for bonuses, while the wage pay roll approximated \$150,000,000. All these expenditures have been reduced in proration "which are not only alarming but staggering." He reminds people that oil is the largest resource in Texas, Texas is the leading oil producing state and more than 100,000 families are dependent on this one business. It is a problem that concerns all the people of Texas. It is not confined to those in any way connected with the petroleum industry.

FARM PRODUCTS FOR INDUSTRY.

"The world will benefit from an agricultural surplus," Henry Ford insists in a recent interview. He works out the idea in this way:

"The pressure of surplus always forces one to find new uses for stock. When we had a corn surplus, we discovered a lot of new uses for corn fiber-we turned it into stockings, building board and corn paper.

Pretty much all we know about wheat today is that it is something for the table-something to eat. Perhaps it is possible to do something with wheat besides eating it. Nobody seems to know definitely.

Whether anything more can be done with wheat or not there can be no question about Mr. Ford's major argument that "what agriculture needs is an industrial outlet." idea is not original with him, but he seems to be the first in dustrial leader to take it seriously and start acting on it.

Perhaps the wheat farmers can find some crop adapte to industrial use, which can be raised on wheat lands and wi provide a market more flexible, continuous and profitable than the wheat market. There must be many such potentia uses for land and labor. The industrial chemists and many facturers, more than any other group, should be able to hel the farmers out of their difficulties.

AMERICA'S WORLD INTERESTS.

One of the compelling reasons for general acceptance of President Hoover's proposal for a moratorium on war debts has been its endorsement by Ambassador Dawes and Owen D. Young, the two experts who were chiefly instrumental in tions. Aside from a wide-spread desire to ease payments in order to improve business, there is a feeling that if these two men say Germany is in a critical situation and cannot pay at present what they laid down for her to pay, they are presumably right.

There is also a greater disposition than ever in this country to accept the view laid down by Mr. Young as the basis of action in such matters

"America, as the greatest creditor nation, is more inter ested than any other in economic integration. It is inevitable that from an economic point of view she take an interest i and be concerned in the material problems and affairs of every country on the globe. Isolation to America, either economic or political, is impossible.'

LEADERSHIP.

President Glenn Frank of the University of Wisconsin spoke out very plainly in his baccalaureate address, regarding the present political and economic situation.

"If we are in earnest about finding the cause of this depression," he said, "we must look elsewhere than in the reports of the certified accountants.

"The famine from which we are suffering is a famine of leadership throughout the western world.

'We have muddled through before. We shall not muddle through this time. The processes and relationships of business and government have become too technical, too sensivite, too interdependent for management by muddlers. 

IS AN EXTRA SESSION COMING?

All signs point to the calling of an extra session of the legislature by Governor Ross S. Sterling. Senator Walter C. Woodward of Coleman is for a drastic proration law. In a statement given the press he pointed to the big financial loss the people suffer by low priced oil. His figures are start-

Under normal conditions the state received approximately \$8,000,000 from the gross receipts tax on crude oil, but now, with oil at 20, 30 or 35 cents a barrel, the state's income is reduced to approximately \$2,500,000 per annum. The income of the University of Texas from oil has slumped from about \$200,000 a month to approximately \$50,000 a month, a loss of approximately \$150,000 a month or more than \$1, 500,000 a year. He stresses that last year the oil companie paid to owners of oil land, largely farmers, more than \$45, 000,000 for oil royalties; more than \$7,500,000 for rentals on land and probably as much as \$20,000,000 for bonuses, while the wage pay roll approximated \$150,000,000. All these expenditures have been reduced in proration "which are not only alarming but staggering." He reminds people that oil is the largest resource in Texas, Texas is the leading oil producing state and more than 100,000 families are dependent on this one business. It is a problem that concerns all the people of Texas. It is not confined to those in any way connected with the petroleum industry.

FARM PRODUCTS FOR INDUSTRY.

"The world will benefit from an agricultural surplus," Henry Ford insists in a recent interview. He works out the idea in this way:

The pressure of surplus always forces one to find new uses for stock. When we had a corn surplus, we discovered lot of new uses for corn fiber-we turned it into stockings. building board and corn paper.

Pretty much all we know about wheat today is that it is something for the table-something to eat. Perhaps it is possible to do something with wheat besides eating it. Nobody seems to know definitely.

Whether anything more can be done with wheat or not, there can be no question about Mr. Ford's major argument that "what agriculture needs is an industrial outlet." Th idea is not original with him, but he seems to be the first in dustrial leader to take it seriously and start acting on it.

Perhaps the wheat farmers can find some crop adapte to industrial use, which can be raised on wheat lands and w provide a market more flexible, continuous and profitable than the wheat market. There must be many such potential uses for land and labor. The industrial chemists and manufacturers, more than any other group, should be able to he the farmers out of their difficulties.

AMERICA'S WORLD INTERESTS.

One of the compelling reasons for general acceptance of President Hoover's proposal for a moratorium on war debts has been its endorsement by Ambassador Dawes and Owen De Young, the two experts who were chiefly instrumental in framing the plans under which Germany is paying reparations. Aside from a wide-spread desire to ease payments in order to improve business, there is a feeling that if these two men say Germany is in a critical situation and cannot pay at present what they laid down for her to pay, they are presumably right.

There is also a greater disposition than ever in this country to accept the view laid down by Mr. Young as the basis of action in such matters:

"America, as the greatest creditor nation, is more interested than any other in economic integration. It is inevitable that from an economic point of view she take an interest in and be concerned in the material problems and affairs of every country on the globe. Isolation to America, either economic or political, is impossible.

LEADERSHIP.

President Glenn Frank of the University of Wisconsin spoke out very plainly in his baccalaureate address, regarding the present political and economic situation.

'If we are in earnest about finding the cause of this de-

"If we are in earnest about finding the cause of this depression," he said, "we must look elsewhere than in the reports of the certified accountants.

"The famine from which we are suffering is a famine of leadership throughout the western world.

"We have muddled through before. We shall not muddle through this time. The processes and relationships of business and government have become too technical, too sensivite, too interdependent for management by muddlers. The simpler society of our fathers could survive medicore or temparizing leadership. We need leaders blessed with an unprecedented clarity of insight and uncompromising courage of action."

"We need more than leadership, too, he insists. Leaders imply followers. We must be ready to follow the true leadershy for the papear.
