SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 18 .-San Francisco, Dec. 18.—
South America, regarded by many capitalists as the richest field for exploitation in the world, is vastly more friendly toward the United States now than ever before, Dr. Armando Toriello, newly appointed honorary consul for Guatemala, said recently.


