### People Urged To Plant More Fall Victory Gardens

We'll have to do a swell job on the food production front this fall if we keep pace with the pace set by our men on the fighting front. Most back yards in south, central and East Texas will produce vegetables during the fall and winter. With average care most of the durable vegetables such as onions, carrots, cabbage, spinach, beets, mustard, lettuce, radish and white potatoes will yield well.

Success begins with the correct preparation of the soil. After clearing off weeds and other vegetation it should be plowed four

to five inches deep and clods pulverized. Burn yard fertilizer broadcast freely over the surface will prevent the soil packing and increase its water holding capacity. Don't be afraid that you'll use too much, the more the better. In areas of sandy soils and adequate moisture, commercial fertilizers analyzing 4-12-4 or 5-10-5 applied before planting the seed at the rate of three to four pounds for each 100 feet of row will hasten growth.

Eggplant, tomato and pepper plants which are still alive may be stimulated into new full growth and production by applying two or three tablespoonful of fertilizer to each plant. Chop it into the soil six to twelve inches distant from the plants for best results.

Since fall germination generally is less dependable, buy a little more seed than for the spring garden. Hard coated seed like beets and spinach should be soaked in water overnight before planting. It is a good plan to firm the soil over the seed after planting by tamping with a hoe or even walking over the rows. Potatoes can be made to come up more rapidly

by covering them with damp sacks or straw until they sprout. Then cut the seed and plant. Consideration should be given to vegetables resistant to cold in from the plants for best results. Carrots, cabbage, turnips,

beets and swiss chard are among those able to withstand light frosts; and collards, onions, shallots and spinach are able to withstand heavy frost.

DETROIT, (UP) — Sidney Metzbaum, who thinks he may be the world champion letter writer—on some subjects, anyway—found little appreciation of his talents at Detroit's Park Avenue Hotel.

Not that the hotel didn't believe that he was a champion. But it also thought he was a nuisance. The hotel said that Metzbaum established his record on hotel stationery, thus making for a stationery shortage among the guests and resultant discontent.

And, added the aggrieved hotel no less than 600 of the letters were written on hotel stationery which no other guest got a chance to use, were to the Park Avenue management, complaining of the service.

However, the evils of the Park Avenue Hotel were just a side effort to Metzbaum, who devoted his chief attention to protesting against capital punishment.

ment. He says he wrote 49,000 letters, concerning this. He also has written thousands of missives condemning women working in beer gardens.

He writes to anybody—the president, congressmen, editors, and people who do things, he doesn't approve of. For the first 2 years of his stay at the hotel he wrote in longhand. But the little 57-year-old Metzbaum, who made a lot of money in real estate in Cleveland and retired to a life of letter writing needed more speed for more letters he wanted to write. So he learned to type.

Of course, he got lots of answers. He was pretty close to being a world champion in this, too. The hotel said this was even more of a nuisance, since their clerks were always knee deep in mail to Metzbaum.

The hotel told all of this to a jury and said it thought Metzbaum should be evicted. The jury agreed after two minutes deliberation—which may be another world record.

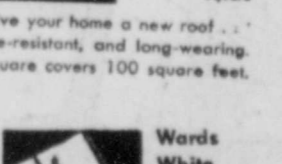

A few strokes with a damp cloth is all it takes to get more light from your lamps and lighting fixtures. It's that easy to remove the film of dust that absorbs a lot of the light you should be getting. When the job is done, you'll be agreeably surprised how much more light you get, how much brighter your home seems.

Soap and water may be necessary to clean kitchen and porch ceiling fixtures which cannot be dusted frequently. Always be sure to disconnect lamps or cut off the current before cleaning lamps or fixtures.

Shade tricks for more light: use white-lined shades; brush silk shades; relace parchment shades, using shell paper and scotch tape or flat white paint. And be sure shades are deep enough.

Arrange your lamps and furniture so each lamp can, if necessary, serve two or more people with good light. But be sure each person sits close enough to the lamp to get the fullest amount of light.
