#### **Believe Coal Row Foreruns** More Trouble

PITTSBURGH, March 17 (UP) A contract dispute between John Lewis and mine operators strengthened steel industry predictions today of more trouble in the nation's coal fields by sum-

Lewis and the operators were embroiled in a dispute over the legality of a two-week "memorial" walkout of 463,000 coal miners. which already has seriously whittled fuel supplies in homes, hospitals and schools in eastern Pennsylvania.

The operators told Lewis the four day old walk out was a 'clear" violation of their contract with the United Mine Workers. Lewis reported that the intimidation was "gratuitously ofensive and

Commenting on the walk out, Iron Age, authorative steel and industry weekly, took the view that "Lewis is laying the groundwork for more surprises in July."

The UMW chief and the coal operators are scheduled to open negotiations for a new contract in May. The current agreement expires in June.

Although there was ample coal above the ground to protect dependent industries for the twoweek mourning period, Iron Age said a one or two week extension of the walk out would destroy "all self-confidence" over the huge 70, 000,000 ton stock pile.

# **RECORDS MAY BE BROKEN** AT MEET THIS WEEK-END

United Press Sports Writer FORT WORTH, Tex. March 17-UP)-At least 11 records may be in danger this week-end when a record throng of 1,600 athletes compete in the 26th annual Southwestern Recreation Track and field meet, but the team championship duel between Texas and Texas A. & M. may steal the spotlight.

Four of the seven university marks threatened on the basis of last Saturday's showings at Laredo hinged on the flying feet of Aggie speedsters, two by a Tulane sprinter, two by a Southern Meth- Middist hurdler and the other by a Texas sprint relay quartet.
