Miss., Sunday afternoon at 5 o'clock, according to a telephone message received by the Eastland County Sheriff's office this morning at 11 o'clock, from Meridian officials.

The wrecked plane and bodies were not discovered un-The wrecked plane and bodies were not discovered until this morning when a farmer started past an emergency air strip about 18 miles from Meridian and sighted the plane. Officers at Meridian stated that they believe the Murdocks ran into the storm about 5 o'clock Sunday afternoon and attempted to make a landing. Apparently something went wrong with the plane causing it to go into a nose dive, killing the Murdocks instantly when it bit the ground.
