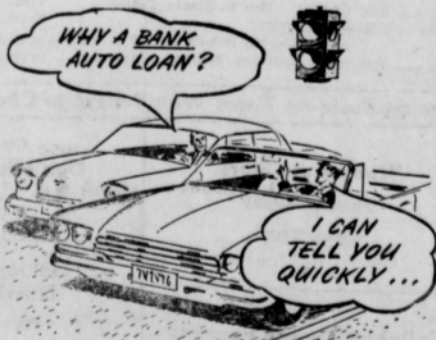

needed equipment in aiding the serious conditions of heart patient, and the recovery of other medical patients.

Coronary - Intensive Care Unit Completed at County Hospital

BAIRD — It was February, 1972, that the idea of a Coronary Care - Intensive Care Unit at Callahan County Hospital became a reality. Already much planning had been done by the Doctors, the Supervisor of Nurses, and the Administrator. Plans had been drawn, facts, figures, and statistics had been presented to the Hospital Board for their approval, and much time and effort in selecting the properly approved equipment had been spent.

Two small patient rooms, adjacent to the nurses' station, were selected as the ideal location for the Unit. The wall between the rooms was knocked out, making one large room, to house all the needed equipment for the patient suffering a heart attack or for the critically ill patient. All equipment, the heart monitor, heart rate meter, external pacemaker, defibrillator, suction and oxygen, were built into a cabinet directly behind the patient's bed and within immediate reach of the doctors and nurses. The electrical equipment was run through a grounding panel to completely erase any possibility of electrical shock to the patient.

A window was cut from the room into the nurses' station so that the patient could be observed. It was felt that closed circuit television would afford the nurse a constant watch of the patient, so a camera was installed in the unit and a screen was installed in the nurses' station. A heart monitor, like the one in the unit, was put across from the nurses' chart desk. Along side the monitor, the television was placed, where the patient would be in focus at all times. The nurse could observe both the patient and his heart pattern while she went about her charting.

A closet was built, a small bathroom was installed, and new tile flooring was laid. The room and cabinets were painted. The Coronary Care Unit was complete.

Completion of the unit was one step closer to reality but we still had a big job to accomplish. The Coronary Care Unit in a small community hospital with no house staff, must depend entirely upon qualified, properly trained nurses around the clock. Even when the doctor is only five minutes away, this is too long. Nurses must be prepared and authorized to act — and to do this they must be properly trained.

All nurses at Callahan County Hospital have had training in coronary care. The R. N.'s and L.V.N.'s took a six weeks course at West Texas Medical Center in Abilene. The course, "Coronary Care Nursing" consisted of all phases of coronary care. All the nurses at the hospital have attended workshops given by the Heart Association. These workshops in Wichita Falls, San Angelo and Abilene, were helpful in training the nurse, but a continuing in-service education program is given by the Supervisor of Nurses in order to keep the nurses aware of new developments in the care of the heart patient.

Betty Cathcart, R. N., Supervisor of Nurses, and Doris Harris, Administrator were in Houston this past week where they attended a very informative meeting given by the Texas Nurses Association and the American Heart Association, Texas Affiliate. The program was entitled "The People That Heart Diseases Have." Mrs. Cathcart brought back many new ideas and information to use in her in-service training.

The CCU-ICU is one of the many improvements at the hospital. Since its opening in Feb-

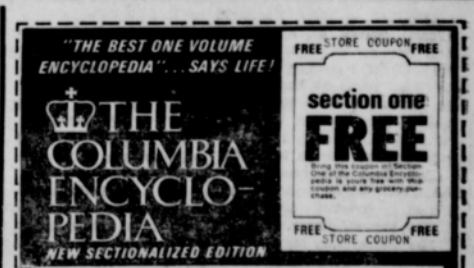
